Who Am I?

Objective

Discover who you really are before deciding how to live.

ENTER

Imagine you've just started playing a brand-new game.

Before you take your first step...

Before you explore the map...

Before you fight your first battle...

Before you complete your first quest...

You open your character screen.

Every experienced gamer does.

Why?

Because if you don't understand your character...

You'll never understand how to play the game.

Now close the game for a moment.

Open your own character screen.

Who are you?

Most people answer that question with labels.

"I'm a student."

"I'm an engineer."

"I'm a mother."

"I'm an athlete."

"I'm an artist."

"I'm an introvert."

"I'm successful."

"I'm a failure."

"I'm rich."

"I'm poor."

But those things describe parts of your life.

They don't describe **you**.

So let's ask the question again.

Who are you?

Not...

What do you do?

What do you own?

What has happened to you?

What have you accomplished?

What have you failed at?

What do other people think about you?

But...

What are you?

At first, the answer seems obvious.

"I'm a human being."

Okay.

But what exactly is a human being?

Are you simply your body?

If you are...

Then who is the person experiencing the body?

Who is thinking the thoughts no one else can hear?

Who is remembering yesterday?

Imagining tomorrow?

Choosing between right and wrong?

Recognizing beauty?

Feeling guilt?

Longing for justice?

Loving another person so deeply that you would sacrifice something for them?

And perhaps strangest of all...

Who is aware that you exist?

Look around you.

A rock exists.

A tree exists.

A computer can process enormous amounts of information.

Artificial intelligence can generate words, images, music, and ideas.

But you possess something astonishing.

You don't simply exist.

You know that you exist.

You can think about your own thoughts.

You can ask why you're here.

You can wonder whether your life has meaning.

You can ask whether there is a Creator.

You can even sit here...

Reading a book about yourself...

While simultaneously thinking about the fact that you're reading a book about yourself.

That's consciousness.

And it may be one of the greatest mysteries in the universe.

Now look at your body.

You didn't build it.

You didn't tell your first cell how to divide.

You don't consciously instruct your heart to beat.

You don't remind your lungs to breathe while you're sleeping.

You don't personally direct billions of cells to repair themselves.

And yet...

Your body keeps working.

Right now.

While you're reading this.

Your eyes are converting light into electrical signals.

Your brain is interpreting symbols on this page.

Your heart is circulating blood.

Your lungs are exchanging oxygen.

Your cells are producing energy.

An entire biological world is operating inside you...

Without you consciously controlling most of it.

Your body is extraordinary.

But is your body all that you are?

Think about a game character.

The character has a visible form.

A skin.

An appearance.

A body that moves through the world.

But the visible character isn't the whole story.

There is something deeper happening behind what appears on the screen.

Your physical body works something like that.

It's the part of you that interacts with the physical world.

It sees.

Touches.

Tastes.

Hears.

Moves.

But there's more to you than what anyone can see.

And this is where the Creator's Walkthrough gives you your first enormous clue.

Before Scripture tells you what you're supposed to accomplish...

Before it gives you rules...

Before it tells you what went wrong...

It tells you **who you are**.

**“So God created mankind in his own image,
in the image of God he created them;
male and female he created them.”**

—Genesis 1:27

Read that again.

You were created in the image of God.

That means your identity doesn't begin with your career.

Your accomplishments.

Your appearance.

Your popularity.

Your failures.

Or even what other people say about you.

Your story begins with your Creator.

You were made to reflect something about **Him**.

The Bible then takes us closer.

It describes the creation of the first human:

“Then the LORD God formed a man from the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life...”

—Genesis 2:7

First...

The body.

Formed from the earth.

Then...

The breath of life.

Life came from the Creator.

You aren't self-created.

Life was given.

And thousands of years later, David would look at the mystery of his own existence and write:

“I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made.”

—Psalm 139:14

Not accidentally made.

Not meaninglessly made.

Wonderfully made.

But there's more.

You have thoughts.

Emotions.

Memories.

Desires.

Preferences.

A will.

A personality.

You love certain things.

Fear certain things.

Remember things no one else remembers exactly as you do.

There is an inner life that belongs uniquely to you.

Scripture also speaks about dimensions of our existence that cannot be seen in a mirror.

Paul prayed:

“May your whole spirit, soul and body be kept blameless...”

— 1 Thessalonians 5:23

Spirit.

Soul.

Body.

Suddenly your character screen becomes much more interesting.

BODY

Your physical interface with the visible world.

The part of you that sees.

Touches.

Tastes.

Hears.

Moves.

SOUL

Your inner person.

Your mind.

Emotions.

Will.

Memories.

Personality.

The unique person experiencing this life.

SPIRIT

The deepest dimension of your existence...

Created for communion with the Creator who gave you life.

Body.

Soul.

Spirit.

Together...

You.

And even Scripture acknowledges that soul and spirit reach depths that aren't always easy for us to distinguish.

It describes God's Word as penetrating even to:

“dividing soul and spirit...”

—Hebrews 4:12

In other words...

There is more to you than what your eyes can see.

And suddenly the question "**Who am I?**" becomes much bigger.

Because if you're only a body...

Then perhaps life really is just about keeping the body comfortable for as long as possible.

Eat.

Drink.

Travel.

Experience pleasure.

Collect things.

Gain status.

Avoid pain.

Stay alive as long as possible.

Then die.

Game over.

But what if you're more than your body?

What if you were deliberately created?

What if the part of you that can think...

Love...

Choose...

Create...

Wonder...

Long for justice...

Search for meaning...

And ask whether there is something beyond this life...

Is pointing toward something much greater?

The Bible says God has:

“set eternity in the human heart.”

—Ecclesiastes 3:11

Maybe that's why temporary things never seem quite capable of satisfying us forever.

Maybe that's why we keep asking questions.

Maybe that's why you're asking them now.

You don't know enough yet to understand everything about yourself.

That's okay.

You're only on Quest 1.

For now...

Just notice the mystery.

You woke up inside an astonishing body you didn't design...

With a mind capable of contemplating the universe...

A heart capable of extraordinary love...

And a spirit created for communion with the One who gave you life.

You arrived here without choosing the time.

The place.

Your family.

Your body.

Or the world you entered.

And yet...

Here you are.

Conscious.

Alive.

Looking around.

Asking questions.

Your first discovery is bigger than you expected.

You are not your job.

You are not your possessions.

You are not your achievements.

You are not your failures.

You are not your popularity.

You are not the labels other people have given you.

And you are more than the body you see in the mirror.

The Creator's Walkthrough says:

You were created by God.

You were made in His image.

Your life was given to you.

You are fearfully and wonderfully made.

You are body, soul, and spirit.

And somewhere deep within you...

The Creator has placed a longing for eternity.

Why is it filled with beauty, order, and astonishing complexity?

And does the world itself contain clues about the One who made you?

Time to explore the map.

QUEST 2

What World Did I Wake Up In?

 **Objective**

Discover that the world you woke up in is astonishingly ordered—and filled with clues about its Creator.

ENTER

Imagine waking up in a place you've never seen before.

You don't know where you are.

You don't know who built this place.

You don't know why you're here.

You simply open your eyes...

And begin to look around.

The first thing you notice is that nothing seems random.

The sun rises.

The moon follows its path.

The seasons come and go.

Seeds become trees.

Rivers flow downhill.

Gravity never forgets its job.

Fire burns.

Water freezes.

Your heart beats.

Your lungs breathe.

The planets move through space with astonishing precision.

Everywhere you look...

Patterns.

Order.

Structure.

Rules.

You begin to realize something.

This world isn't chaos.

It behaves as though it follows invisible laws.

Think about your favorite game.

Imagine loading into a world where gravity changed every few minutes.

One moment you could jump.

The next...

You floated into space.

Imagine pressing the same button on your controller and getting a completely different result every time.

Imagine water sometimes healing your character...

And sometimes randomly exploding.

You couldn't learn the game.

You couldn't make meaningful choices.

You couldn't even survive.

A playable world requires consistency.

Rules don't ruin the game.

Rules make the game possible.

And the world you woke up in is filled with them.

Humans call them the **laws of nature**.

Gravity.

Motion.

Energy.

Chemistry.

Mathematics.

Biology.

You didn't create these laws.

Neither did the scientists who discovered them.

Scientists discover how reality behaves.

But the laws were already here.

Long before anyone wrote an equation describing gravity...

Gravity worked.

Long before anyone understood DNA...

DNA carried information.

Long before anyone studied the stars...

The stars were already moving through the heavens.

Humanity arrived inside a world already running.

The code was here before the players.

And the Creator's Walkthrough tells you to pay attention.

**“The heavens declare the glory of God;
the skies proclaim the work of his hands.”**

—Psalm 19:1

Notice what it says.

Creation is **declaring** something.

The sky can't speak with words.

The stars don't have voices.

Mountains don't preach sermons.

And yet...

According to Scripture, creation is communicating.

Its existence points beyond itself.

Its beauty tells you something.

Its order tells you something.

Its complexity tells you something.

The world contains clues about the One who made it.

One evening...

Stop.

Really stop.

Put down the phone.

Turn off the music.

Step away from the noise.

Look up.

Watch the sun disappear behind the horizon.

The sky changes from blue...

To gold...

To crimson...

To deep purple...

Until darkness quietly settles over the earth.

Then...

One by one...

The stars appear.

You didn't create them.

You can't move them.

Most of them existed long before you were born.

And somehow...

Looking at them can make you feel incredibly small...

And incredibly curious...

At exactly the same time.

Thousands of years ago, David looked at that same sky and asked:

**“When I consider your heavens,
the work of your fingers,
the moon and the stars,
which you have set in place,
what is mankind that you are mindful of them?”**
—Psalm 8:3–4

That's your Quest.

Look.

Consider.

Ask.

Why is there something instead of nothing?

Why does anything exist?

Why is the universe understandable?

Why can your mind discover mathematical patterns that describe the physical world?

Why can you look at the stars...

And understand anything about them at all?

And why does beauty affect you?

A sunset doesn't help you survive simply because it's beautiful.

Neither does music.

Or art.

Or the feeling of standing beside the ocean.

Yet something inside you responds to beauty.

Why?

Now imagine you're hiking through a forest.

Miles from civilization...

You discover a game controller lying on a rock.

You pick it up.

Buttons.

Circuits.

Joysticks.

Wiring.

Everything arranged for a purpose.

Would you conclude:

"Wow. Wind, rain, dirt, and enough time must have assembled this."

Probably not.

You'd immediately assume something.

Someone made it.

Why?

Because you recognize design.

Games have developers.

Books have authors.

Music has composers.

Buildings have architects.

Code has programmers.

Art has artists.

When we encounter something arranged toward a purpose...

We naturally ask about its maker.

So why wouldn't we at least ask that question about reality?

Look closer.

Not at a galaxy.

At yourself.

Inside nearly every cell in your body is DNA.

An enormous molecular system containing biological information used in building and maintaining your body.

Your cells read it.

Copy it.

Repair it.

Use its instructions.

You didn't write it.

You didn't install it.

It was already there when you arrived.

Then zoom outward.

Cells form tissues.

Tissues form organs.

Organs form systems.

Systems form you.

Then zoom farther.

People live inside ecosystems.

Earth exists within a solar system.

The solar system exists within a galaxy.

And the deeper humanity explores...

The more there is to discover.

The Bible says this is not accidental evidence.

Paul writes:

“For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities—his eternal power and divine nature—have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made.”
—Romans 1:20

That's an extraordinary claim.

The Creator is invisible.

But Scripture says something about Him can be recognized through **what He made**.

You can't see gravity.

You see what gravity does.

You can't see wind.

You see the trees move.

And you cannot see the Creator with your physical eyes...

But perhaps His fingerprints are everywhere.

CREATOR CLUE UNLOCKED

THE WORLD HAS ORDER.

THE WORLD OPERATES BY CONSISTENT LAWS.

THE WORLD CONTAINS INFORMATION.

THE WORLD PRODUCES LIFE.

THE WORLD CONTAINS BEAUTY.

AND YOU ARE CONSCIOUS ENOUGH TO NOTICE ALL OF IT.

But don't rush.

This Quest isn't asking you to pretend you have no questions.

Questions are good.

Ask them.

Explore.

Investigate.

Test.

Learn.

The Creator isn't threatened by curiosity. He welcomes it.

If this world really is His...

Then discovering truth about creation means discovering something about what He has made and ultimately about Him.

And Scripture goes even further.

It says the universe isn't simply something God created long ago and abandoned.

Speaking of Jesus, Scripture says:

“For in him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible...”

—Colossians 1:16

And then:

“In him all things hold together.”

—Colossians 1:17

Hold together.

Right now.

The Creator isn't presented as a distant programmer who launched the game and walked away.

Reality continues because He sustains it.

Every star.

Every atom.

Every breath.

Every heartbeat.

The world you woke up in belongs to Someone.

And now something from Quest 1 becomes even more interesting.

You discovered that **you** are not random within the story.

Now you're discovering that the **world around you** isn't presented as random either.

You were born into a reality filled with structure...

Information...

Beauty...

Life...

Mathematical order...

And laws you didn't invent.

You arrived after the world was already here.

You didn't write the rules.

You didn't create the map.

You didn't design your character.

You simply...

woke up inside it.

QUEST COMPLETE

Take one more look around.

The world is breathtaking.

Every sunrise.

Every mountain.

Every living cell.

Every law of nature.

Every star.

Every heartbeat.

Every breath.

Human beings have spent thousands of years studying this world...

And we still haven't reached the bottom of its mysteries.

The Creator's Walkthrough says creation itself is giving you clues.

Objective

Discover who the Creator is—and why He created you to know Him.

ENTER

You've explored the map.

You've looked at the world around you.

You've discovered order.

Beauty.

Information.

Life.

Laws you didn't create.

A universe that was already running long before you arrived.

And the Creator's Walkthrough gave you a clue:

**“The heavens declare the glory of God;
the skies proclaim the work of his hands.”**

—Psalm 19:1

Creation points beyond itself.

So now comes the obvious question.

Who is the Creator?

Not...

What do people say about Him?

Not...

What did your parents believe?

Not...

What does your culture assume?

Not even...

What have you always believed?

If there really is a Creator...

Who is He?

And can He be known?

Imagine playing the greatest game ever created.

The world is breathtaking.

Every mountain.

Every ocean.

Every living creature.

Every hidden mystery.

You've explored this world for years.

You've learned its patterns.

You've admired its beauty.

You've studied its rules.

But you've never met its Creator.

You've wondered whether He exists.

You've wondered whether He cares.

You've wondered whether He's distant...

Or even paying attention.

Then one day...

You discover something extraordinary.

The Creator has revealed Himself.

He hasn't left the players to guess who He is.

He has spoken.

The Bible begins with ten words that change everything:

“In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.”

—Genesis 1:1

Before the universe...

God.

Before Earth...

God.

Before stars...

God.

Before matter...

God.

Before you...

God.

The Creator isn't another character inside the world.

He is the reason the world exists at all.

Thousands of years later, a man named Moses stood before a burning bush and asked God His name.

God answered:

“I AM WHO I AM.”

—Exodus 3:14

Think about that.

You can say:

I am here.

I am tired.

I am twenty years old.

I am afraid.

I am happy.

Everything about your existence depends on something else.

You needed parents.

Food.

Water.

Air.

A planet.

A universe.

Time.

But God simply says:

I AM.

He doesn't receive existence from somewhere else.

He is.

Scripture describes Him this way:

**“The LORD is the everlasting God,
the Creator of the ends of the earth.”**

—Isaiah 40:28

He doesn't grow old.

He doesn't run out of energy.

He doesn't discover something He didn't know yesterday.

He doesn't wake up surprised by what happened overnight.

He isn't limited by the world He created.

The Creator sees what you cannot see.

He knows what you do not know.

The beginning.

The middle.

The end.

But knowing that God is powerful still doesn't answer the question your heart really wants answered.

What's He like?

Is He good?

Is He cruel?

Is He distant?

Does He care?

Did He create this enormous world...

Set everything in motion...

And walk away?

Or is He still here?

Every creation reveals something about its creator.

Music tells you something about the composer.

A painting tells you something about the artist.

A story tells you something about its author.

And creation gives you glimpses of its Creator.

Beauty.

Order.

Creativity.

Power.

Life.

But creation alone doesn't tell you everything.

So the Creator did something more.

He revealed Himself.

Through His Word...

He tells us who He is.

Scripture describes Him as holy.

Righteous.

Just.

Good.

Faithful.

Merciful.

And one of the most astonishing things Scripture says about Him is this:

“God is love.”

— 1 John 4:8

Not merely...

God loves sometimes.

Not merely...

God can be loving.

God is love.

Love is part of His very nature.

And Scripture says:

“Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love.”

— 1 John 4:8

That changes the way you look at everything.

The Creator who possesses unimaginable power...

Is also the source of love.

And now the Quest becomes personal.

Because the Bible doesn't merely say God created **humanity**.

It describes a Creator who knows **you**.

David wrote:

**“You have searched me, LORD,
and you know me.
You know when I sit and when I rise;
you perceive my thoughts from afar.”**

— Psalm 139:1–2

Think about that.

The One who created galaxies...

Knows when you sit down.

Knows when you get up.

Knows your thoughts.

Knows the things you say out loud...

And the things you never tell anyone.

He knows the parts of your story other people understand.

And the parts no one understands.

He knows your strengths.

Your fears.

Your wounds.

Your questions.

The things you understand about yourself...

And the things you don't.

He knows the questions you haven't figured out how to ask.

He knows **you**.

And He knew you before anyone else did.

David continues:

**“For you created my inmost being;
you knit me together in my mother's womb.”**

—Psalm 139:13

You weren't invisible to the Creator before you were born.

You weren't unknown.

You weren't overlooked.

Your life didn't surprise Him.

The One who created the world you woke up in...

Knew you before you ever opened your eyes inside it.

But there's still one question.

Does He want you to know Him?

This may be the greatest surprise yet.

Yes.

The Creator didn't make you simply so you could know **about** Him.

He created you to know **Him**.

Remember your character build?

Body.

Soul.

Spirit.

Your spirit was created for communion with the One who gave you life.

Relationship was always part of the design.

In fact...

It goes even deeper than that.

WHY ARE YOU HERE?

Human beings have been asking that question for thousands of years.

Why am I here?

What is the purpose of life?

What am I supposed to accomplish?

What am I supposed to become?

What am I supposed to do?

We look for the answer in careers.

Relationships.

Families.

Achievements.

Experiences.

Success.

Pleasure.

Possessions.

Causes.

Legacy.

And many of those things can be meaningful.

But none of them answer the deepest question.

Because before you were created to **do** anything...

You were created to **know Someone**.

Before assignment...

Relationship.

Before accomplishment...

Relationship.

Before mission...

Relationship.

Before anything you could ever do **for** God...

You were created to live **with** God.

Jesus would later define eternal life in a way you might not expect:

“Now this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent.”

—John 17:3

Read that carefully.

Eternal life isn't described merely as...

Living forever.

It's knowing God.

Relationship.

Communion.

Life with the Creator.

You weren't created merely to exist inside God's world.

You were created to **know the One who made it.**

KNOWING ABOUT HIM ISN'T THE SAME AS KNOWING HIM

Think about the difference.

You can know everything about someone...

Without actually knowing them.

You can know their birthday.

Their hometown.

Their accomplishments.

Their favorite food.

You can watch every interview they've ever given.

Read everything they've ever written.

And still...

You've never spoken to them.

You've never walked with them.

You've never shared your heart with them.

You've never had a relationship.

Knowing **about** someone...

Isn't the same as knowing them.

And the same is true with God.

You can know facts about Him.

You can know Bible stories.

You can know religious traditions.

You can know theology.

You can attend church.

You can even believe He exists.

And still not know Him.

The Creator wants something deeper.

Relationship.

To know Him.

Trust Him.

Listen to Him.

Walk with Him.

Love Him.

Be loved by Him.

Live in communion with Him.

That's what you were created for.

YOU WERE NEVER DESIGNED TO DO LIFE ALONE

And this changes something else.

Maybe you've assumed that the goal of life is to become completely self-sufficient.

Strong enough to handle anything.

Wise enough to make every decision.

Knowledgeable enough to understand everything.

Disciplined enough to overcome every weakness.

Independent enough to need no one.

But what if that was never the design?

Think about your player build.

You are not all-knowing.

You are not all-powerful.

You cannot see the future.

You cannot see every consequence of every decision.

You cannot know what is happening everywhere at once.

You don't always know what is true.

You don't always know what you need.

Sometimes...

You don't even understand yourself.

Those aren't surprising limitations.

You're not the Creator.

You were never supposed to know everything.

You were created to know **the One who does.**

You were never supposed to possess unlimited strength.

You were created to know **the One who does.**

You were never supposed to see the entire map.

You were created to walk with **the One who can.**

The Creator wasn't supposed to be a distant observer you occasionally called when your own resources ran out.

Relationship with Him was supposed to be the way human life worked.

His wisdom.

His counsel.

His strength.

His truth.

His love.

His life.

Not replacing you.

Not erasing your personality.

Not turning you into a puppet.

But flowing into a life that was designed to remain in communion with its Source.

Later, Jesus would describe it like this:

“I am the vine; you are the branches.”

—John 15:5

A branch is still a branch.

It doesn't lose its identity.

But it was never designed to live independently from the vine.

It receives life...

And produces fruit.

Maybe the goal was never to become strong enough that you wouldn't need God.

Maybe you were created...

To live with Him.

THE HUNGER YOU CAN'T QUITE NAME

That may explain something you've felt your entire life.

That strange sense...

That there has to be something more.

Maybe you've tried to fill it with achievement.

Money.

Relationships.

Sex.

Success.

Approval.

Entertainment.

Knowledge.

Adventure.

Spirituality.

Possessions.

Another goal.

Another experience.

Another version of yourself.

And some of those things can make you happy.

Some are genuinely good.

But eventually...

The feeling returns.

Is this it?

Scripture says God:

“has also set eternity in the human heart.”

—Ecclesiastes 3:11

Maybe that's why temporary things never seem able to carry the full weight of what you're asking them to do.

You're asking something temporary...

To satisfy something eternal.

Money can be useful.

Achievement can be rewarding.

Relationships can be beautiful.

Adventure can be exciting.

Success can feel incredible.

But none of them were designed to replace the Creator.

You were created for Someone.

Maybe what you've been looking for...

Isn't ultimately...

Something.

Maybe...

It's...

Someone.

The Creator knows you.

And He wants you to know Him.

To walk with Him.

To hear His voice.

To trust Him.

To love Him.

To experience His love.

To learn from Him.

To depend on Him.

To live in communion with the One who gave you life.

That was the original design.

THE FIRST PURPOSE

So before you ask:

What should I do with my life?

There is a deeper question.

Who was I created to know?

Before your career.

Before your accomplishments.

Before your platform.

Before your possessions.

Before your reputation.

Before your side quests.

Before even the things you may someday do for God...

Comes this:

KNOW GOD.

Because God doesn't need you to complete something He is incapable of doing without you.

He's God.

The Creator isn't recruiting you because He's short-staffed.

He wants **you**.

Relationship comes before assignment.

And eventually...

As you come to know Him...

You'll discover that He does have things for you to do.

A purpose.

Good works.

People to love.

A Kingdom to represent.

A mission to join.

But those things flow **from relationship.**

You don't serve God so that He will finally want you.

You discover that He wanted you...

Before you ever knew how to serve Him.

CREATOR CONNECTION

CREATOR: God

PLAYER: You

CREATED IN: His image

KNOWN BY GOD: Yes

CREATED TO KNOW GOD: Yes

RELATIONSHIP: Intended

SOURCE OF LIFE: God

SOURCE OF WISDOM: God

SOURCE OF STRENGTH: God

SOURCE OF TRUTH: God

SOURCE OF LOVE: God

PURPOSE: Know Him • Walk With Him • Live in Communion With Him

But now...

Something doesn't make sense.

If you were created to know God...

Why doesn't that relationship feel natural?

Why does God sometimes seem distant?

Why don't you automatically recognize His voice?

Why do people hide from Him?

Why are we afraid of Him?

Why do we resist Him?

Why do we keep trying to live independently from Him?

And if the Creator is good...

Why is His world filled with so much pain?

Disease.

War.

Betrayal.

Hatred.

Loneliness.

Death.

Something doesn't fit.

The world you explored in Quest 2 was filled with breathtaking beauty.

But look closer...

And you'll see cracks everywhere.

Not only in the world.

Inside us.

QUEST COMPLETE

You began this Quest asking:

Who is the Creator?

Now you know more than you did before.

CREATOR DISCOVERED

He existed before creation.

He created everything.

He is eternal.

He is powerful.

He knows you completely.

He is holy, just, good, and loving.

And perhaps most importantly...

He created you to know Him.

Not merely know about Him.

Know Him.

You weren't created to possess everything you need within yourself.

You were created for relationship with the One who does.

You weren't created merely to live in His world.

You were created to live **with Him.**

The greatest Quest isn't ultimately about discovering the meaning of the universe.

It's about discovering the One who made it.

But there's a problem.

You were created for relationship with the Creator...

Yet something has come between you.

Something happened to the world.

Something happened to humanity.

Something happened to us.

Humanity chose something it was never designed for:

Life apart from the Source of life.

And until you understand what broke...

You'll never understand why you need to be rescued.

Time to go back to the beginning.

QUEST 4 — WHAT WENT WRONG?

QUEST 4

What Went Wrong?

Objective

Discover what broke humanity's relationship with the Creator—and why the world no longer works the way it was designed to.

ENTER

Something doesn't add up.

You've discovered an extraordinary world.

Beauty.

Order.

Life.

Purpose.

You've discovered that behind it is a Creator who knows you...

And created you to know Him.

That sounds incredible.

Except...

Look around.

Something is terribly wrong.

People lie.

People betray.

People abuse power.

Families break apart.

Children suffer.

Wars destroy entire cities.

Disease attacks healthy bodies.

People hurt the people they claim to love.

People who desperately want peace sometimes can't find it.

People who have everything can still feel empty.

And eventually...

Everyone dies.

Then look even closer.

Not at the world.

At yourself.

You want to do what's right...

Yet sometimes you choose what you already know is wrong.

You want to forgive...

Yet resentment can feel easier.

You want peace...

Yet fear takes over.

You want to love...

Yet selfishness gets in the way.

You know what you should do...

And sometimes do the exact opposite.

Something isn't right.

Not just with the world.

With us.

The Bible says the world wasn't created this way.

At the beginning...

Humanity lived in relationship with the Creator.

No shame.

No fear.

No hiding.

No death.

The Creator provided everything they needed.

He gave humanity freedom.

Explore.

Create.

Build.

Multiply.

Care for creation.

Walk with Him.

The first players weren't prisoners inside God's world.

They were invited to rule within it **with Him**.

But there was one boundary.

One command.

One tree.

God told Adam:

**“You are free to eat from any tree in the garden;
but you must not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil...”**
—Genesis 2:16–17

Notice how the command begins.

“You are free...”

The Creator wasn't withholding an entire world.

He had given them one.

There was abundance everywhere.

Only one boundary.

And that boundary required something essential to every relationship.

Trust.

Then another voice entered the story.

Quietly.

Cleverly.

The serpent approached Eve with a question:

“Did God really say...?”

—Genesis 3:1

And there it is.

The first attack wasn't against humanity's body.

It was against humanity's **trust in the Creator**.

Did God really say that?

Can you really trust Him?

Is He actually good?

Maybe He's keeping something from you.

Maybe His rules are limiting you.

Maybe life would be better if **you** decided what was good and evil.

The enemy didn't begin by asking Eve to hate God.

He simply asked her to doubt Him.

Then came the lie:

“You will not certainly die...”

—Genesis 3:4

God had spoken.

The serpent contradicted Him.

And humanity stood between two voices.

The Creator said one thing.

The serpent said another.

Sound familiar?

Because that battle has never stopped.

Whose voice will you trust?

The temptation wasn't ultimately about fruit.

The fruit was the choice.

The deeper temptation was independence.

You don't need the Creator to tell you what is good.

You can decide for yourself.

You can define reality.

You can become your own authority.

The serpent told them:

“You will be like God, knowing good and evil.”

—Genesis 3:5

But humanity had already been created **in God's image**.

They were already meant to reflect Him.

The enemy offered them a counterfeit:

Don't reflect God.

Replace Him.

Don't receive truth from the Creator.

Define it yourself.

Don't live under His authority.

Become your own.

They took the fruit.

They ate.

And immediately...

Something changed.

Their eyes opened.

But not in the way they expected.

They didn't become free.

They became ashamed.

“Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they realized they were naked...”

—Genesis 3:7

For the first time...

They hid.

They covered themselves.

They became afraid.

And when the Creator came near...

The people who had been created to know Him...

Ran from Him.

Adam said:

“I was afraid... so I hid.”

—Genesis 3:10

Think about how much changed in that one sentence.

Fear.

Shame.

Hiding.

Separation.

The relationship had been broken.

And then came blame.

God asked Adam what happened.

Adam blamed Eve.

And even indirectly blamed God:

“The woman you put here with me...”

—Genesis 3:12

Eve blamed the serpent.

The harmony between God and humanity was fractured.

The harmony between human beings was fractured.

Even humanity's relationship with creation was fractured.

Sin didn't remain one isolated act.

It spread through everything.

SYSTEM DAMAGE DETECTED

RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD: Broken

TRUST: Corrupted

IDENTITY: Distorted

SHAME: Entered

FEAR: Entered

BLAME: Entered

SUFFERING: Entered

DEATH: Entered

CREATION: Fractured

The world was still beautiful.

But now...

It was broken.

The Bible calls what happened **sin**.

But sin is much bigger than a list of bad behaviors.

Sin begins with the same fundamental decision made in Eden:

I will trust myself instead of the Creator.

I will determine what is right.

I will determine what is wrong.

I will decide how I should live.

I will be my own authority.

That's why Isaiah describes humanity's problem this way:

**“We all, like sheep, have gone astray,
each of us has turned to our own way.”**

—Isaiah 53:6

Our **own way**.

That's the heart of it.

And this isn't merely Adam and Eve's story.

It's ours.

Paul writes:

“For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.”

—Romans 3:23

All.

Not some.

Not merely criminals.

Not merely obviously evil people.

All.

Every player has repeated Eden.

Maybe not with a piece of fruit.

But with the same choice.

My way instead of Yours.

Every lie.

Every betrayal.

Every selfish act.

Every cruelty.

Every abuse of power.

Every time we know what is right and deliberately choose otherwise...

We repeat the ancient rebellion.

This is why simply becoming a “better person” cannot solve the deepest problem.

Imagine unplugging your game console from its power source...

And then trying to fix the problem by polishing the controller.

You can make it look better.

Clean it.

Decorate it.

Upgrade it.

But the real problem isn't cosmetic.

The connection has been broken.

Humanity's deepest problem isn't simply bad behavior.

Bad behavior is evidence of something deeper.

We became separated from the One we were created to know.

And separation from the Source of Life has consequences.

God warned Adam that rebellion would bring death.

Paul later explained:

“Sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, and in this way death came to all people...”

—Romans 5:12

Death entered the story.

Something that had never belonged there.

And suddenly...

The world you woke up in begins making more sense.

Why is it so beautiful?

Because it was created by God.

Why is it so broken?

Because creation is no longer functioning exactly as it was intended.

Why do human beings have such an incredible capacity for love...

And such a horrifying capacity for evil?

Because we still bear the image of God...

But that image has been distorted by sin.

Why do we long for justice?

Because something inside us knows evil is wrong.

Why do we grieve death?

Because something inside us knows death doesn't belong here.

Why do we hide?

Why do we blame?

Why do we feel shame?

Why do we keep trying to fill ourselves with things that never completely satisfy us?

Because humanity walked away from the One we were created to know.

But here's something important.

The Creator didn't walk away first.

Remember what happened after Adam and Eve sinned.

They hid.

God came looking.

“But the LORD God called to the man, ‘Where are you?’”

—Genesis 3:9

God knew where Adam was.

The Creator of the universe hadn't misplaced him behind a tree.

The question wasn't about geography.

It was relational.

Where are you?

You were walking with Me.

Now you're hiding from Me.

What happened?

And those may be some of the most important words in the entire Bible.

Because almost immediately after humanity runs from God...

God comes looking for humanity.

They broke the relationship.

He came looking.

They hid.

He called.

They were ashamed.

He covered them.

They rebelled.

And before they even left the Garden...

God gave the first hint that the story wasn't over.

Speaking to the serpent, He said:

**“I will put enmity between you and the woman,
and between your offspring and hers;
he will crush your head,
and you will strike his heel.”**

—Genesis 3:15

Someone was coming.

The enemy would strike Him.

But He would crush the enemy.

The rescue mission had already begun.

QUEST COMPLETE

Now you know what went wrong.

The Creator made humanity to know Him.

To trust Him.

To walk with Him.

To reflect Him.

But another voice entered the story.

Humanity believed the lie.

Trust became suspicion.

Obedience became rebellion.

Relationship became separation.

Life became death.

And the world has never been the same.

WORLD STATUS UPDATED

ORIGINAL DESIGN: Good

CREATOR: Only good

HUMANITY: Fallen

RELATIONSHIP WITH CREATOR: Broken

SIN: Active

DEATH: Active

ENEMY ACTIVITY: Detected

RESCUE PLAN: Already in motion

And now another piece of the puzzle appears.

Because the serpent wasn't just a talking animal in an ancient story.

There was an intelligence behind the deception.

A rebel.

A liar.

An enemy who understood exactly where to attack.

Not your strength.

Not your body.

Your trust in God.

You've discovered what went wrong.

Now it's time to discover **who wanted it to go wrong.**

QUEST 5 — Meet the Enemy

QUEST 5

Meet the Enemy



Objective

Discover who the real enemy is, how he operates, and why his greatest weapon is deception.

ENTER

You just discovered something disturbing.

The first humans weren't alone in the Garden.

Another voice was there.

A voice questioning the Creator.

Twisting His words.

Challenging His goodness.

Offering humanity another version of reality.

“Did God really say...?”

And suddenly the story becomes much bigger.

Because if the Creator designed the world...

Who wanted to corrupt it?

If the Creator gives life...

Who introduced the lie that led to death?

If the Creator speaks truth...

Who keeps twisting it?

The Bible doesn't leave you guessing.

There is an enemy.

Before you go any further, understand something important.

He is not another god.

This isn't a game with two equally powerful forces battling to see who wins.

God on one side.

Satan on the other.

Good versus evil.

Winner still undetermined.

Not even close.

Satan is created.

God is Creator.

Satan's knowledge is limited.

God knows everything.

Satan's power is limited.

God is almighty.

Satan exists within creation.

God existed before creation.

The enemy is dangerous.

But he has never been equal to the Creator.

The ending of this story isn't uncertain.

So who is he?

Jesus called him:

“the evil one.”

—Matthew 13:19

Scripture calls him:

“the ancient serpent called the devil, or Satan, who leads the whole world astray.”

—Revelation 12:9

Satan means adversary.

An opponent.

One who stands against.

Devil carries the idea of slanderer or accuser.

And notice what Revelation says he does:

He leads the world astray.

That tells you something about his strategy.

His greatest weapon isn't brute force.

It's **deception**.

Think back to the Garden.

Satan didn't physically force Eve to take the fruit.

He didn't overpower Adam.

He didn't destroy the tree.

He introduced a lie.

First:

Question God's Word.

“Did God really say...?”

—Genesis 3:1

Then:

Contradict God's Word.

“You will not certainly die.”

—Genesis 3:4

Then:

Question God's motives.

Maybe God is keeping something good from you.

Maybe He doesn't really have your best interests at heart.

Then:

Offer independence.

“You will be like God...”

—Genesis 3:5

The entire attack targeted one thing.

Trust.

If the enemy can make you distrust the Creator...

He doesn't need to drag you away.

You'll walk away yourself.

ENEMY PROFILE UNLOCKED

NAME: Satan

ROLE: Adversary

STATUS: Rebel

POWER: Limited

KNOWLEDGE: Limited

PRIMARY WEAPON: Deception

TARGET: Your trust in God

OBJECTIVE: Separation from the Creator

FINAL STATUS: Defeated

Jesus described Satan's character even more clearly:

“He was a murderer from the beginning, not holding to the truth, for there is no truth in him... for he is a liar and the father of lies.”

—John 8:44

A liar.

That's important.

Because lies don't usually arrive labeled:

WARNING: THIS IS A LIE.

If they did...

They wouldn't work.

The most dangerous lies contain enough truth to sound believable.

A slight distortion.

A missing piece.

A truth taken out of context.

A promise that sounds good...

But leads somewhere very different.

The strategy hasn't changed much.

It just gets updated for each generation.

“God doesn't really love you.”

“You can never be forgiven.”

“Your past defines you.”

“You don't need God.”

“You decide what truth is.”

“Everyone else is doing it.”

“This one compromise won't matter.”

“If God were good, He wouldn't let this happen.”

“You should be ashamed to come back to Him.”

“You're alone.”

“There's no way out.”

Different lies.

Same enemy.

Same objective.

Separate the player from the Creator.

Jesus described the contrast between His mission and the enemy's mission this way:

“The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.”

—John 10:10

Look at the two kingdoms.

THE THIEF

Steal.

Kill.

Destroy.

JESUS

Life.

And life to the full.

Opposite directions.

Opposite kingdoms.

Opposite destinations.

But now comes one of the most important discoveries in the entire Quest.

The enemy wants you looking in the wrong direction.

He wants you convinced that **people are your enemy**.

The person who hurt you.

The person who disagrees with you.

The person from another political party.

Another country.

Another religion.

Another generation.

Another race.

Another social class.

Another worldview.

Someone who insulted you.

Someone who betrayed you.

Someone who seems to stand against everything you believe.

It's easy to look at another human being and think:

Enemy.

But the Creator's Walkthrough pulls back the curtain.

“For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in

the heavenly realms.”

—Ephesians 6:12

Read the first line again.

Our struggle is not against flesh and blood.

People are not the real enemy.

That doesn't mean people can't do terrible things.

They can.

It doesn't mean evil behavior shouldn't be confronted.

It should.

It doesn't mean there are never consequences for wrongdoing.

There are.

But it means you must learn to see beyond the visible player...

To the larger battle.

Remember your AR goggles?

You're not wearing them yet.

That Quest is still ahead.

But for a moment...

The Walkthrough gives you a glimpse behind the screen.

There is more happening than what your physical eyes can see.

There is an unseen realm.

A spiritual battle.

A war over truth.

A war over trust.

A war over worship.

A war over human hearts.

And one of the enemy's greatest victories occurs whenever he convinces God's image-bearers to destroy one another...

While forgetting who the real enemy is.

Paul gives another warning:

“Satan himself masquerades as an angel of light.”

—2 Corinthians 11:14

That should get your attention.

The enemy doesn't always appear evil.

Sometimes deception looks enlightened.

Compassionate.

Sophisticated.

Spiritual.

Logical.

Liberating.

Even good.

Which means appearances aren't enough.

Feelings aren't enough.

Popularity isn't enough.

Someone confidently saying something is true...

Doesn't make it true.

You need a way to test what you're hearing.

You need to know the Creator's voice.

And eventually...

You're going to need His Word.

There is another strategy the enemy uses.

Accusation.

Revelation calls Satan:

“the accuser of our brothers and sisters.”

—Revelation 12:10

First he tempts you.

Then, when you fall...

He accuses you.

“Look what you did.”

“God could never want you now.”

“You're filthy.”

“You're hopeless.”

“Don't go back.”

Do you see the trap?

Temptation pulls you toward sin.

Accusation tries to keep you away from God afterward.

The enemy's objective remains the same.

Separation.

But remember what you learned in the last Quest.

When Adam and Eve sinned...

Who hid?

They did.

Who came looking?

God did.

The enemy says:

Run from God.

The Creator says:

Where are you?

One voice drives you deeper into hiding.

The other calls you home.

Learning to recognize the difference between those voices will eventually become one of the most important skills you develop.

And there is one more thing you need to know before leaving this Quest.

You do not need to be terrified of Satan.

You need to understand him.

A good player studies the enemy...

Not to obsess over him...

But so they aren't deceived by him.

The Bible says:

“Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.”

—James 4:7

But don't miss the words immediately before that:

“Submit yourselves, then, to God.”

—James 4:7

That's the order.

Not:

Become obsessed with the enemy.

Not:

Become stronger than Satan.

Not:

Figure out every demonic strategy.

Submit to God.

Then resist the enemy.

Your safety isn't found in becoming fascinated with darkness.

It's found in staying close to the Light.

QUEST COMPLETE

You now know there is another player in the story.

Not equal to the Creator.

Not all-powerful.

Not all-knowing.

But real.

A rebel.

An adversary.

A deceiver.

An accuser.

A destroyer.

And his oldest strategy is still his favorite.

But now...

You know something you didn't know before.

People are not the real enemy.

And perhaps even more importantly...

You know what the battle is really about.

Truth.

Trust.

Relationship.

Whose voice will you believe?

You've met the Creator.

You've discovered what broke.

You've identified the enemy.

So naturally...

You're ready to learn how to fight.

But the Creator stops you.

Because there's something much more urgent.

Before you can learn how to fight...

Before you can level up...

Before you can equip armor...

Before you can complete your mission...

You need to discover something about your current character status.

Something humanity has misunderstood from the beginning.

The problem isn't simply that you've been playing badly.

The problem goes much deeper.

You don't merely need better skills.

You don't merely need better behavior.

You don't merely need another chance.

You need life.

QUEST 6 — The Walking Dead

QUEST 6

The Walking Dead

Objective

Discover the difference between existing and truly living—and why you need more than self-improvement. You need new life.

ENTER

You've discovered the enemy.

You know there's a battle.

So naturally...

You want to know how to fight.

What weapons do you get?

What armor?

What abilities can you unlock?

How do you become stronger?

How do you level up?

But before the Creator teaches you any of that...

He stops you.

Because there's something much more important you need to understand first.

Your current status.

And what the Creator's Walkthrough says about humanity is shocking.

The problem isn't simply that you're weak.

It isn't simply that you've made mistakes.

It isn't simply that you don't know how to play.

Your problem goes much deeper.

Imagine walking into an emergency room.

A patient is rushed through the doors.

Doctors and nurses immediately surround them.

No one asks about their cholesterol.

No one worries about a broken finger.

No one starts physical therapy.

Why?

Because there is an order.

Life comes first.

Everything else comes after.

If there is no life...

Nothing else matters.

First...

Airway.

Then breathing.

Then circulation.

Restore life.

Then begin healing.

Spiritually...

The order is much the same.

Most of us spend our lives trying to improve our character.

Become healthier.

Become smarter.

Become wealthier.

Become happier.

Become more successful.

Become more disciplined.

Become more spiritual.

Become a better person.

None of those things are necessarily bad.

But none of them answer the deepest question.

What if your greatest need isn't improvement...

...but life?

Every morning you wake up.

Your heart beats.

Your lungs breathe.

You eat.

Work.

Study.

Laugh.

Cry.

Dream.

Build friendships.

Make plans.

Fall in love.

Create things.

By every visible measure...

You're alive.

But the Creator's Walkthrough reveals another dimension of life.

Paul writes:

“As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins...”
—Ephesians 2:1

Dead?

How can someone walking...

Talking...

Thinking...

Working...

Laughing...

And breathing...

Be dead?

Clearly Scripture is describing something deeper than physical death.

Remember your character build.

Body.

Soul.

Spirit.

Your body can be alive...

While something is terribly wrong with your relationship to the Source of Life.

Go back to the beginning.

Scripture describes the creation of Adam:

“Then the LORD God formed a man from the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life...”

—Genesis 2:7

First...

A body.

Formed from the earth.

Then...

God breathed life into him.

Life came from the Creator.

Adam didn't generate it himself.

He received it.

Then God gave Adam a warning about the tree of the knowledge of good and evil:

“When you eat from it you will certainly die.”

—Genesis 2:17

But something strange happened.

Adam ate...

And he didn't immediately collapse.

His heart kept beating.

His lungs kept breathing.

He continued talking.

Walking.

Working.

Eventually, physical death would come.

But something had already happened immediately.

Adam hid from God.

The relationship was broken.

Humanity became separated from the One who had given them life.

Think about your phone.

The device can look perfectly fine.

Screen intact.

Battery installed.

Apps loaded.

Everything where it belongs.

But if it loses its connection...

Certain things it was designed to do become impossible.

Humanity's problem is infinitely deeper than losing Wi-Fi.

But the analogy helps.

We were created for communion with God.

And sin broke that communion.

We didn't stop existing.

We became separated from the **Source of Life**.

That's why Scripture can describe people as physically alive...

Yet spiritually dead.

Paul says:

“You were dead in your transgressions and sins, in which you used to live...”

—Ephesians 2:1–2

Notice the strange combination.

Dead...

Yet...

Living.

Walking.

Working.

Thinking.

Choosing.

Existing.

But spiritually separated from God.

In that sense...

Humanity became...

the walking dead.

PLAYER STATUS DETECTED

BODY: Alive

SOUL: Active

SPIRITUAL CONDITION: Separated from God

SIN: Present

CONNECTION TO SOURCE OF LIFE: Broken

SELF-REPAIR: Impossible
NEED: Life

This explains something about humanity that otherwise seems strange.

We are incredibly good at existing.

We've built cities.

Written symphonies.

Created art.

Mapped the human genome.

Built computers.

Explored space.

Developed medicine.

Written poetry.

Built civilizations.

We fall in love.

Raise children.

Laugh.

Dream.

Create.

And yet...

Something inside humanity keeps searching.

More money.

More success.

More pleasure.

More recognition.

More relationships.

More followers.

More experiences.

More achievements.

More.

More.

More.

As though the next thing might finally fill something we can't quite name.

Sometimes it works.

For a while.

Then the hunger returns.

Maybe you've felt it.

You finally get something you desperately wanted.

The relationship.

The degree.

The promotion.

The money.

The house.

The achievement.

The experience.

For a moment...

It feels incredible.

Then eventually...

It becomes normal.

And your heart begins looking for the next thing.

Why?

Because temporary things were never designed to satisfy an eternal hunger.

You were created for Someone.

Remember what Jesus said:

“Now this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent.”

—John 17:3

Life isn't merely existence.

The fullness of life is found in relationship with its Source.

And now another problem becomes clear.

If humanity is spiritually dead...

Religion alone cannot fix us.

Rules cannot give life.

Knowledge cannot give life.

Good behavior cannot give life.

Trying harder cannot give life.

You can teach a dead person excellent manners.

They're still dead.

You can put expensive clothes on them.

Still dead.

You can give them a rulebook.

Still dead.

You can explain exactly what they did wrong.

Still dead.

Dead people don't need better instructions.

They need life.

That's why the gospel is so radically different from self-improvement.

Jesus didn't come merely to make bad people behave better.

He didn't come to give humanity a motivational speech.

He didn't come merely to hand us a better list of rules.

He didn't come to polish your character.

He came to restore what had been lost.

Life.

Jesus said:

“I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.”

—John 10:10

And then He made an even more astonishing claim:

“I am the resurrection and the life.”

—John 11:25

Not...

“I know where life is.”

Not...

“I can teach you how to find life.”

I am the Life.

Now you begin to understand why Jesus said something that completely confused one of the most religious men of His time.

A Pharisee named Nicodemus came to Jesus at night.

He knew Scripture.

He knew God's commandments.

He was respected.

Educated.

Religious.

If anyone could level up enough to reach God...

Nicodemus seemed like the guy.

But Jesus didn't tell him:

Try harder.

He didn't say:

Learn more rules.

He didn't say:

Become more religious.

He told him:

“You must be born again.”

—John 3:7

Born again?

Nicodemus was confused.

How could a grown man be born a second time?

But Jesus wasn't talking about another physical birth.

He said:

“Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit.”

—John 3:6

There it is.

The missing piece.

Your first birth gave you physical life.

But you need something only the Creator can give.

Spiritual life.

This changes the entire Quest.

You cannot level up your way into new birth.

You cannot earn it.

You cannot buy it.

You cannot become moral enough to create it.

You couldn't create your first life...

And you cannot create your second.

Life must be given.

Paul explains the problem in one sentence:

“For the wages of sin is death...”

—Romans 6:23

That's the bad news.

Sin produces death.

Separation from the Source of Life.

But the verse doesn't end there.

“...but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.”

—Romans 6:23

Notice the word.

Gift.

Not achievement.

Not reward.

Not salary.

Not something you unlock because you've accumulated enough experience points.

Gift.

Life comes from the Creator.

Just like it did in the beginning.

And this is where the story becomes almost unbelievable.

Remember what Paul said?

“You were dead in your transgressions...”

Keep reading.

“But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ...”

—Ephesians 2:4–5

There it is.

The entire rescue mission in three words:

Made us alive.

Not...

Made us more impressive.

Not...

Made us more religious.

Not...

Made us better at pretending.

Alive.

The Creator does for humanity what humanity cannot do for itself.

He gives life to the dead.

MISSION UPDATE

You thought you needed:

BETTER BEHAVIOR

But you need:

NEW LIFE

You thought you needed:

MORE RULES

But you need:

THE CREATOR

You thought you needed:

SELF-IMPROVEMENT

But you need:

REBIRTH

You thought the objective was:

BECOME GOOD ENOUGH

But the Creator offers:

A GIFT

And suddenly everything you've discovered so far begins connecting.

You were created by God.

You were created to know Him.

Humanity walked away.

Sin broke the relationship.

The enemy works to keep humanity separated from God.

And separation from the Source of Life produces death.

So humanity's greatest problem isn't simply:

How can bad people become good?

It's:

How can the dead become alive?

And there's only one Person who can answer that question.

The One who created life in the first place.

QUEST COMPLETE

You began this Quest thinking you needed to become stronger.

Now you understand something far more important.

Before you can level up...

You need life.

Before you can learn to walk with the Creator...

The broken relationship must be restored.

Before you can fight the enemy...

You need the Spirit of God.

Before you can become the person you were created to be...

You must be born from above.

PLAYER STATUS UPDATED

PHYSICAL LIFE: Active

SPIRITUAL PROBLEM: Separation from God

CAUSE: Sin

SELF-RESCUE: Impossible

CREATOR'S OFFER: Eternal life

But now there's a question.

If you can't rescue yourself...

Who can?

Who can deal with sin?

Who can defeat death?

Who can restore the broken connection?

Who can bring humanity back to the Creator?

You already know the answer is going to require more than another human being.

Because a player trapped inside the same broken system can't rescue everyone else from it.

Someone has to come from outside.

Someone untouched by sin.

Someone with authority over death.

Someone who doesn't merely **have** life...

But **is** Life.

And that's exactly what happened.

The Creator entered His own creation.

QUEST 7 — The Creator Entered the Game

QUEST 7

The Creator Entered the Game

Objective

Discover who Jesus really is—and why the Creator entered His own creation to rescue you.

ENTER

You have a problem.

A problem you cannot solve yourself.

You were created to know God.

Sin broke that relationship.

Separation from the Source of Life brought death.

And no amount of effort can manufacture the life you've lost.

You can't level up enough.

You can't perform enough good deeds.

You can't become religious enough.

You can't undo your past.

You can't defeat death.

You need rescue.

But who could possibly rescue humanity?

Another human being?

They're trapped inside the same broken world.

Another teacher?

Instructions can't make the dead alive.

Another prophet?

A messenger can point toward the Creator...

But humanity needs more than directions.

We need the Creator Himself.

And that's when the story takes a turn no one could have invented.

The Creator entered the game.

Actually...

He had been telling humanity He was coming for a very long time.

Remember the Garden?

Humanity rebelled.

Humanity hid.

And God came looking.

“But the LORD God called to the man, ‘Where are you?’”

—Genesis 3:9

That question echoes through the entire Bible.

Where are you?

Humanity keeps running.

God keeps pursuing.

And before Adam and Eve even left Eden, God announced that someone was coming who would crush the serpent.

The rescue mission had begun.

Generations passed.

Kingdoms rose.

Kingdoms fell.

And the Creator kept leaving clues.

A Deliverer was coming.

A King.

A Shepherd.

A Servant.

A Savior.

A Son.

Isaiah wrote:

“The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel.”

—Isaiah 7:14

Immanuel.

God with us.

Then Isaiah said something even more astonishing:

**“For to us a child is born,
to us a son is given...
And he will be called
Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God,
Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.”**
—Isaiah 9:6

A child would be born.

Yet He would be called...

Mighty God.

The clues were getting clearer.

Then...

The Creator stepped into human history.

Not with an army.

Not in a palace.

Not surrounded by earthly power.

As a baby.

Jesus.

But if you think Jesus was merely a great religious teacher...

The Walkthrough asks you to look closer.

The Gospel of John begins by taking you all the way back to the beginning:

“In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.”
—John 1:1

The Word wasn't created at Bethlehem.

He already existed.

John continues:

“Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made.”

—John 1:3

Wait.

The One who entered creation...

created it.

The hands that would one day touch lepers...

Made human skin.

The eyes that would look with compassion on crowds...

Created sight.

The voice that would command storms...

Created the laws governing wind and sea.

The One who would walk beneath the stars...

Made the stars.

And then John gives you the reveal:

“The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us.”

—John 1:14

The Creator entered His creation.

Imagine designing an enormous world.

Every mountain.

Every ocean.

Every law.

Every living thing.

Every piece of code.

Then imagine the world becoming corrupted.

Your characters can't repair it.

They can't escape it.

They can't even fully understand what has gone wrong.

So instead of abandoning the world...

you enter it.

Except Jesus didn't enter a simulation.

He entered suffering.

Hunger.

Exhaustion.

Rejection.

Grief.

Pain.

Temptation.

Human flesh.

And eventually...

Death.

Jesus didn't stop being God when He became human.

And He didn't merely appear human.

He truly entered humanity.

Scripture says of Jesus:

“Who, being in very nature God... made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness.”

—Philippians 2:6–7

Creator...

Becomes servant.

King...

Enters His Kingdom as a child.

The One who needs nothing...

Experiences hunger.

The One who created water...

Experiences thirst.

The One who created humanity...

Allows human beings to reject Him.

Why?

Because the rescue required Him to come where we were.

And when Jesus arrived...

He began showing humanity what the Creator is actually like.

Want to know how God responds to the broken?

Watch Jesus.

Want to know how God sees the rejected?

Watch Jesus.

Want to know how God treats sinners who come to Him?

Watch Jesus.

He touched lepers others wouldn't touch.

He welcomed people society rejected.

He ate with sinners.

He defended the condemned.

He restored the broken.

He opened blind eyes.

He made the lame walk.

He cast out demons.

He calmed storms.

He fed the hungry.

He forgave sins.

He raised the dead.

And everywhere He went...

Life pushed back against death.

Light pushed back against darkness.

The Kingdom of God invaded the broken world.

Then Jesus said things no ordinary teacher could say.

He didn't merely say:

I'll show you the way.

He said:

“I am the way and the truth and the life.”

—John 14:6

He didn't merely say:

I'll teach you about resurrection.

He said:

“I am the resurrection and the life.”

—John 11:25

He didn't merely say:

I'll give you spiritual nourishment.

He said:

“I am the bread of life.”

—John 6:35

He didn't merely point toward light.

He said:

“I am the light of the world.”

—John 8:12

And He said:

“Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father.”

—John 14:9

Jesus wasn't merely bringing humanity information about God.

God had come near.

But there was still a problem.

Sin.

The broken relationship couldn't simply be ignored.

If God is loving...

He wants to forgive.

But if God is just...

Evil matters.

Imagine a judge looking at terrible evil and saying:

It doesn't matter.

We wouldn't call that loving.

We would call it unjust.

God doesn't pretend sin isn't real.

He deals with it.

And this is where the rescue mission becomes almost impossible to comprehend.

The Creator came...

to take the consequence Himself.

Long before the crucifixion, Isaiah described a suffering servant:

**“He was pierced for our transgressions,
he was crushed for our iniquities...
and by his wounds we are healed.”**

—Isaiah 53:5

The rescue would cost Him something.

Jesus knew exactly where His mission was leading.

He told His disciples:

“The Son of Man came... to give his life as a ransom for many.”

—Mark 10:45

A ransom.

A rescue.

His life...

For ours.

Then came the cross.

The Creator who gave humanity life...

Allowed humanity to nail Him to wood.

The hands that formed creation...

Were pierced by His creation.

The One who had no sin...

Carried ours.

Scripture says:

**“God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the
righteousness of God.”**

—2 Corinthians 5:21

Jesus took what belonged to us...

So He could give us what belongs to Him.

This wasn't Plan B.

It wasn't the moment the Creator lost control.

Jesus said:

“No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord.”

—John 10:18

He chose the cross.

Why?

One of the most famous verses in Scripture tells you:

“For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son...”

—John 3:16

Love.

The Creator wasn't trying to figure out how to keep you away.

He was making a way to bring you back.

Paul puts it this way:

“God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.”

—Romans 5:8

Not after you fixed yourself.

Not after you became worthy.

Not after you mastered the game.

While you were still a sinner.

Jesus died.

His body was placed in a tomb.

The stone was rolled into place.

For a moment...

It looked like death had won.

The enemy had struck.

Remember the ancient prophecy?

“You will strike his heel...”

—Genesis 3:15

But the prophecy wasn't finished.

“He will crush your head.”

On the third day...

The tomb was empty.

Jesus rose.

Paul summarizes the message:

“Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day...”

—1 Corinthians 15:3–4

The resurrection changed everything.

Sin had been confronted.

Death had been challenged.

The enemy's greatest weapon had met someone it couldn't hold.

Jesus didn't merely teach about eternal life.

He walked out of a grave.

RESCUE MISSION STATUS

CREATOR: Entered creation

IDENTITY: Jesus Christ

MISSION: Seek and save the lost

SIN: Paid for at the cross

DEATH: Defeated through resurrection

ENEMY: Judgment assured

TOMB: Empty

KING: Alive

RESCUE: Available

And now you can finally see the pattern.

In the Garden...

Humanity sinned.

Humanity hid.

God came looking.

Throughout history...

Humanity wandered.

God kept calling.

Then finally...

God didn't merely call from Heaven.

He came Himself.

Jesus described His mission this way:

“For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost.”

—Luke 19:10

Seek.

And save.

The same Creator who called:

“Where are you?”

Entered the world to find us.

QUEST COMPLETE

You needed rescue.

The Creator came.

You needed forgiveness.

Jesus carried your sin.

You needed someone who could defeat death.

Jesus walked out of the grave.

You needed a way back to God.

Jesus said:

“I am the way.”

You needed truth.

Jesus said:

“I am the truth.”

You needed life.

Jesus said:

“I am the life.”

CREATOR IDENTITY UPDATED

THE WORD: God

THE WORD: Became flesh

NAME: Jesus Christ

ROLE: Creator • Savior • King

MISSION: Seek and save the lost

CROSS: Rescue accomplished

TOMB: Empty

STATUS: Alive

But now the Quest becomes personal.

Knowing that Jesus died...

Isn't the same as receiving what He offers.

Knowing that the tomb was empty...

Isn't the same as being made alive.

Knowing who the Rescuer is...

Isn't the same as being rescued.

Remember Nicodemus?

Jesus told him:

“You must be born again.”

So how does that happen?

How does what Jesus accomplished become yours?

How is the broken relationship restored?

How does someone spiritually dead...

Become alive?

That's your next Quest.

QUEST 8 — New Life Unlocked

QUEST 8

New Life Unlocked

Objective

Discover how the Creator gives you new life—and how His rescue becomes yours.

ENTER

The rescue has been accomplished.

Jesus came.

He lived.

He died.

He rose again.

The tomb is empty.

But now the most personal question in the entire Quest appears:

What does that have to do with you?

Knowing that a rescue exists...

Isn't the same as being rescued.

Knowing that medicine exists...

Isn't the same as receiving it.

Knowing that a door is open...

Isn't the same as walking through it.

So how does someone spiritually dead become alive?

Jesus already gave you the answer.

“You must be born again.”

—John 3:7

Not improved.

Not upgraded.

Not rebranded.

Born again.

YOU DIDN'T CAUSE YOUR FIRST BIRTH

Think about your first birth.

You didn't earn it.

You didn't plan it.

You didn't accomplish it.

You didn't accumulate enough points to qualify for existence.

Life was given to you.

And Jesus says spiritual life works the same way.

Nicodemus asked how someone could possibly be born again.

Jesus answered:

“Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit.”

—John 3:6

Your first birth gave you physical life.

Your new birth gives you spiritual life.

And the One who gives that life is...

the Holy Spirit.

This is important.

The Holy Spirit isn't an energy.

He isn't a vague spiritual force.

He isn't a power-up.

He isn't the universe.

He is God.

The Spirit of God.

And when God gives you new life...

He doesn't merely repair something from a distance.

He comes to dwell within you.

Jesus promised:

“He lives with you and will be in you.”

—John 14:17

Think about that.

The Creator you were separated from...

The Creator you were made to know...

The Creator who came looking for humanity...

The Creator who entered creation to rescue you...

Now offers to make His dwelling **within you** by His Spirit.

The broken relationship can be restored.

BUT HOW?

This is where humans tend to complicate things.

We like achievement systems.

Earn enough.

Perform enough.

Prove yourself.

Be good enough.

Make up for your failures.

Do more good than bad.

Maybe then God will accept you.

But the Creator's Walkthrough destroys that entire scoring system.

“For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith... it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast.”

—Ephesians 2:8–9

SALVATION SYSTEM

PRICE: Already paid by Jesus

PLAYER MERIT REQUIRED: None

ACHIEVEMENT POINTS REQUIRED: None

PERFECT RECORD REQUIRED: None

GOOD DEEDS REQUIRED TO PURCHASE IT: None

METHOD: Grace

RECEIVED THROUGH: Faith

SOURCE: God

TYPE: Gift

You don't earn salvation.

You receive it.

GRACE

Grace means God gives you what you could never earn.

You sinned.

Jesus paid.

You were separated.

Jesus came looking.

You were dead.

God offers life.

You were guilty.

Jesus offers forgiveness.

You were far away.

God invites you home.

That's grace.

FAITH

But faith is more than agreeing that God exists.

James says:

“Even the demons believe that—and shudder.”

—James 2:19

The enemy knows God exists.

So biblical faith goes deeper than acknowledging facts.

Faith means **trust**.

Remember where everything broke?

The Garden.

The serpent attacked trust.

Did God really say?

Humanity chose:

I trust myself instead of God.

Now the gospel brings you back to the same fundamental question:

Whom will you trust?

Salvation means you stop trusting yourself to save yourself...

And place your trust in Jesus.

Imagine falling from a cliff.

Someone reaches down to rescue you.

You can study their hand.

Believe the hand exists.

Explain the anatomy of the hand.

Write books about the hand.

Attend meetings with other people who believe in the hand.

You can even tell everyone:

“I believe that hand could save me.”

But eventually...

You have to trust the One reaching for you.

Christian faith isn't merely knowing facts about Jesus.

It's entrusting yourself **to Jesus**.

REPENTANCE

And genuine faith involves another word Scripture uses repeatedly:

Repentance.

Jesus began His public ministry saying:

“Repent and believe the good news!”

—Mark 1:15

Repentance doesn't mean:

Become perfect before coming to God.

If you could do that...

You wouldn't need rescue.

Repentance is a turning.

You've been walking your own way.

Now you turn toward God.

Remember Isaiah?

“We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to our own way.”

—Isaiah 53:6

Sin says:

My way.

Repentance says:

Your way.

It's a change of allegiance.

A change of direction.

A surrender of the throne.

This doesn't mean you'll never struggle again.

It doesn't mean temptation disappears.

It doesn't mean you instantly understand everything.

It means something fundamental has changed.

You no longer want to live separated from the Creator.

You turn toward Him.

JESUS IS LORD

Paul describes the response to the gospel this way:

“If you declare with your mouth, ‘Jesus is Lord,’ and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.”

—Romans 10:9

Don't rush past those words.

Jesus is Lord.

Not merely:

Jesus existed.

Not merely:

Jesus was a good teacher.

Not merely:

Jesus can help me improve my life.

Lord.

King.

Your life no longer belongs to you alone.

You are placing your trust in the One who made you...

Died for you...

Rose for you...

And calls you to follow Him.

THE GREAT EXCHANGE

Something extraordinary happens when you come to Christ.

Your sins aren't merely overlooked.

They are forgiven.

Your debt isn't merely ignored.

Jesus paid it.

Your old identity no longer gets the final word.

Scripture says:

“If anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!”
—2 Corinthians 5:17

New creation.

There's the language again.

Creation.

Life.

Birth.

This isn't cosmetic.

God is doing something new.

Long before Jesus came, God promised this would happen.

Through the prophet Ezekiel, He said:

“I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you...”
—Ezekiel 36:26

And then:

“I will put my Spirit in you and move you to follow my decrees...”
—Ezekiel 36:27

Do you see the difference?

God doesn't simply stand outside you shouting:

TRY HARDER!

He changes you from within.

A new heart.

A new spirit.

His Spirit within you.

This is why following Jesus isn't merely another religious rule system.

The Creator begins restoring His creation **from the inside out.**

PLAYER STATUS CHANGING...

OLD STATUS: Spiritually dead
NEW STATUS: Alive in Christ

OLD STATUS: Separated
NEW STATUS: Reconciled

OLD STATUS: Guilty
NEW STATUS: Forgiven

OLD STATUS: Stranger
NEW STATUS: Child of God

OLD STATUS: Living for self
NEW STATUS: Jesus is Lord

OLD STATUS: Spiritually empty
NEW STATUS: Holy Spirit dwelling within

OLD STATUS: Old creation
NEW STATUS: New creation

And there's something even more personal.

God doesn't merely forgive you and send you away.

He brings you into His family.

Scripture says:

“Those who are led by the Spirit of God are the children of God.”

—Romans 8:14

And:

“The Spirit you received brought about your adoption to sonship. And by him we cry, ‘Abba, Father.’”

—Romans 8:15

Remember where this Quest began?

Who am I?

Now your identity is changing.

You aren't merely a creature who knows there is a Creator.

Through Christ...

You are being brought into relationship with Him.

God becomes not merely:

Creator.

But:

Father.

THE CONNECTION IS RESTORED

Remember the broken connection?

Humanity walked away from the Source of Life.

Sin separated us.

But through Jesus...

The relationship is restored.

Paul says:

“Since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.”

—Romans 5:1

Peace with God.

The war is over.

The hiding can stop.

You don't have to stay behind the tree.

The Creator already came looking for you.

And now...

He invites you to come home.

Jesus said:

“Whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life... they have crossed over from death to life.”

—John 5:24

Read that again.

Death → Life

That's the transfer.

That's the rescue.

That's the new birth.

WHAT DO I DO?

The gospel invitation is astonishingly simple...

But it isn't shallow.

Repent.

Turn from your own way toward God.

Believe.

Trust that Jesus Christ is who He says He is—the Son of God, the Creator who came in the flesh, who died for your sins and rose from the dead.

Confess Jesus as Lord.

Stop claiming the throne of your own life.

Give your allegiance to the King.

Receive.

You cannot purchase a gift.

You receive it.

And then...

Follow Him.

Not to earn the life He gives you...

But because you've been given life.

This distinction changes everything.

You don't obey God **so that He will love you.**

You learn to obey because He already loved you.

“We love because he first loved us.”

—1 John 4:19

You don't perform good works to purchase salvation.

Good works begin flowing from the life you've received.

In fact, immediately after saying salvation is not by works, Paul says:

“For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works...”

—Ephesians 2:10

The order matters.

Not:

GOOD WORKS → NEW LIFE

But:

NEW LIFE → GOOD WORKS

You don't work your way into becoming alive.

God makes you alive...

And then teaches you how to live.

WHAT HAPPENS NOW?

This isn't the end of the Quest.

It's the beginning.

A newborn baby is completely alive...

But still needs to grow.

Learn.

Walk.

Recognize voices.

Eat.

Become strong.

And spiritually...

So do you.

You now have to learn to recognize the Creator's voice.

Learn His Word.

Learn to walk by His Spirit.

Learn what is true.

Learn what isn't.

Learn how to resist the enemy.

Learn how to love.

Learn how to forgive.

Learn how to use what God has given you.

Learn how to become more like Jesus.

You were born.

Now...

you learn to walk.

QUEST COMPLETE

You thought salvation meant becoming religious.

It means being made alive.

You thought you had to earn God's acceptance.

Jesus already paid the price.

You thought you needed to fix yourself before coming to Him.

He came looking for you while you were still lost.

You thought God would give you another list of rules.

He gives you **His Spirit**.

You thought eternal life began after death.

Jesus says eternal life is knowing God.

And that relationship begins...

now.

NEW LIFE UNLOCKED

SAVIOR: Jesus Christ

RESPONSE: Repent • Believe • Confess

SALVATION: By grace through faith

PRICE: Paid

SIN: Forgiven

RELATIONSHIP: Restored

NEW HEART: Given
NEW SPIRIT: Given
HOLY SPIRIT: Dwelling within
IDENTITY: Child of God
LIFE STATUS: Alive in Christ
QUEST STATUS: Just beginning

But something has changed.

The world looks the same.

Your eyes look the same.

The people around you may look exactly the same.

And yet...

You aren't seeing reality from the same position anymore.

Because the Creator hasn't merely forgiven you.

His Spirit now lives within you.

And when the Holy Spirit begins opening your eyes...

You start seeing things you couldn't see before.

Not because reality suddenly changed.

Because **you did.**

The hidden layer was there all along.

Now...

Your eyes are beginning to open.

QUEST 9 — Eyes Opened

QUEST 9

Eyes Opened

Objective

Discover how the Holy Spirit opens your eyes to reality—and teaches you to see what you couldn't see before.

ENTER

Something has changed.

The world looks the same.

Same streets.

Same people.

Same sky.

Same phone.

Same problems.

Same responsibilities.

But you're not the same.

The Creator's Spirit now lives within you.

And slowly...

You begin noticing things you didn't notice before.

Scripture starts making sense in ways it didn't before.

Things you once thought were harmless begin bothering you.

Things you once chased begin losing their power over you.

You begin recognizing truth...

And sometimes recognizing lies.

You notice people differently.

You notice yourself differently.

You begin sensing that what you can see with your physical eyes...

Isn't the whole story.

It's almost like someone switched on another layer of reality.

Imagine putting on a pair of augmented-reality glasses.

Before you put them on...

You see a room.

Walls.

Doors.

Furniture.

People.

Then the display activates.

Suddenly...

Information appears everywhere.

Directions.

Warnings.

Names.

Objectives.

Hidden paths.

Things were present that you didn't know how to identify before.

The room didn't change.

Your ability to perceive it did.

But what the Holy Spirit does is far greater than AR.

Because He doesn't merely add information to your eyesight.

He gives you...

Eyes to see.

Ears to hear.

A heart to understand.

A mind being renewed by truth.

And He doesn't merely stand beside you explaining the map.

He lives within you.

THE HIDDEN REALM

There's a story in the Old Testament that gives you an extraordinary glimpse of this.

The prophet Elisha and his servant were surrounded by an enemy army.

The servant woke up...

Looked outside...

And saw soldiers.

Horses.

Chariots.

An army surrounding the city.

From everything his physical eyes could see...

They were trapped.

So he panicked.

“Oh no, my lord! What shall we do?”

—2 Kings 6:15

Elisha answered:

“Don't be afraid... Those who are with us are more than those who are with them.”

—2 Kings 6:16

That probably sounded ridiculous.

The servant could count.

Enemy army:

Everywhere.

Elisha and servant:

Two.

But Elisha could perceive something his servant couldn't.

So he prayed:

“Open his eyes, LORD, so that he may see.”

—2 Kings 6:17

Then...

God opened the servant's eyes.

And suddenly he saw:

“The hills full of horses and chariots of fire all around Elisha.”

—2 Kings 6:17

Think about that.

The heavenly army didn't suddenly arrive.

It was already there.

The servant simply couldn't see it.

His physical eyes were working perfectly.

But they weren't showing him the whole picture.

REALITY UPDATE

WHAT THE SERVANT SAW: Enemy army

WHAT WAS ACTUALLY THERE: Enemy army + heavenly army

His first perception wasn't completely false.

It was **incomplete**.

That's important.

Following Jesus doesn't mean pretending visible problems aren't real.

The army was real.

The danger was real.

The servant wasn't hallucinating the soldiers.

But there was another dimension to the situation...

And once his eyes were opened...

He understood that the visible threat wasn't the whole story.

This is one of the most important lessons you'll learn.

What you can see is real.

But it isn't necessarily **all that is real.**

Paul writes:

“We fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen...”

—2 Corinthians 4:18

There is a visible realm.

And an unseen realm.

You already discovered this when you met the enemy.

Remember?

“Our struggle is not against flesh and blood...”

—Ephesians 6:12

The battle is larger than what your physical senses can detect.

But here's where you need to be careful.

Spiritual sight does **not** mean becoming obsessed with invisible things.

It doesn't mean assuming every coincidence is a supernatural message.

It doesn't mean trusting every thought that enters your mind.

It doesn't mean chasing signs everywhere.

It doesn't mean abandoning wisdom.

And it definitely doesn't mean believing every spiritual claim someone makes.

You need discernment.

And discernment begins with knowing the Creator.

THE SPIRIT OF TRUTH

Jesus called the Holy Spirit:

“the Spirit of truth.”

—John 16:13

And He said:

“When he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all the truth.”

—John 16:13

Notice something.

The Holy Spirit doesn't guide you into **your truth**.

Or **my truth**.

Or whatever truth is currently popular.

He guides you into:

the truth.

Because truth isn't something we invent.

Truth comes from the One who created reality.

The Holy Spirit also does something essential:

He points you to Jesus.

Jesus said of the Spirit:

“He will glorify me...”

—John 16:14

That's one of the most useful checkpoints in your journey.

The Holy Spirit doesn't make you obsessed with yourself.

He doesn't make you the hero of the story.

He doesn't replace Jesus.

He reveals Jesus more clearly.

The closer you walk with the Spirit...

The more clearly you begin to see the King.

THE WALKTHROUGH STARTS LIGHTING UP

Something else happens.

The Bible begins changing.

Not the words.

Your understanding.

Maybe you've read Scripture before.

Maybe it seemed confusing.

Ancient.

Distant.

Like a book written for another world.

But now...

Certain words begin jumping off the page.

Connections appear.

Conviction comes.

Comfort comes.

Questions come.

Understanding grows.

Why?

Paul explains:

“What we have received is not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, so that we may understand what God has freely given us.”

— 1 Corinthians 2:12

The Holy Spirit teaches.

He reveals.

He helps you understand.

Jesus promised:

“The Holy Spirit... will teach you all things and will remind you of everything I have said to you.”

— John 14:26

The Creator didn't give you a Walkthrough...

And then leave you alone to decode it.

The Author lives within you.

That doesn't mean you'll instantly understand every verse.

You won't.

It doesn't mean you no longer need to study.

You do.

It doesn't mean you don't need wise teachers.

You do.

It means Scripture is no longer merely information about God.

You're learning it **with God**.

EYES OF YOUR HEART

Paul prayed something fascinating for believers:

“I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened...”

—Ephesians 1:18

The eyes...

Of your heart.

Physical eyes see surfaces.

God gives understanding that goes deeper.

You begin seeing people differently.

The person everyone ignores...

Bears God's image.

The person who hurt you...

Isn't the ultimate enemy.

The temptation that looks harmless...

Has a destination.

The success everyone envies...

May not be worth the price.

The suffering that seems meaningless...

May not be the end of the story.

The person who appears powerful...

May actually be enslaved.

The person the world considers insignificant...

May be precious in the Kingdom of God.

The world ranks players one way.

The Creator sees differently.

And slowly...

You're learning to see through His eyes.

YOU BEGIN SEEING YOURSELF DIFFERENTLY TOO

Before...

Your identity may have come from what people said about you.

Successful.

Failure.

Attractive.

Unattractive.

Popular.

Rejected.

Smart.

Stupid.

Wanted.

Unwanted.

Winner.

Loser.

Maybe your identity came from something you accomplished.

Or something someone did to you.

Or something you did.

But now the Spirit begins reminding you:

That's not your deepest identity anymore.

You belong to Christ.

You're being made new.

You're a child of God.

You're known.

You're loved.

You're being transformed.

And when the enemy whispers:

“Your past is who you are.”

The Spirit points you toward what Jesus has done.

CONVICTION IS ALSO PART OF SEEING

Sometimes having your eyes opened doesn't feel comfortable.

Because the Spirit doesn't only show you beautiful things.

He shows you things in yourself that need to change.

Jesus said the Holy Spirit would:

“prove the world to be in the wrong about sin and righteousness and judgment.”

—John 16:8

You may suddenly recognize:

That attitude is pride.

That relationship is pulling me away from God.

That habit is controlling me.

I need to forgive.

I need to apologize.

I need to stop.

I need to tell the truth.

I need to obey.

This isn't the enemy saying:

Hide from God.

Remember the difference.

The enemy accuses to drive you away.

The Holy Spirit convicts to bring you **closer**.

ACCUSATION

“You're disgusting. Hide.”

CONVICTION

“This is wrong. Bring it to Me.”

One produces hopelessness and hiding.

The other calls you back into truth and relationship.

TEST THE SIGNAL

You're learning to hear.

But not every signal comes from God.

Some thoughts come from you.

Some messages come from culture.

Some come from other people.

Some are temptations.

Some may be spiritual deception.

So how do you know?

The Creator doesn't ask you to follow every impression blindly.

Scripture says:

“Test the spirits to see whether they are from God.”

— 1 John 4:1

How?

You learn the Creator's character.

You learn His Word.

You look at where something leads.

Does it agree with what God has revealed?

Does it point toward Jesus?

Does it produce obedience to God?

Does it lead toward truth?

Love?

Holiness?

Humility?

Or does it feed pride?

Fear?

Hatred?

Deception?

Rebellion?

Self-glorification?

The more you know the real thing...

The easier it becomes to recognize the counterfeit.

Think about someone trained to recognize counterfeit money.

They don't spend all their time studying every fake bill ever produced.

They study the genuine.

Texture.

Details.

Patterns.

Security features.

The better they know the real thing...

The faster something false feels wrong.

It's similar with the Creator.

The more you know Him...

The more you know His Word...

The more you recognize His character...

The easier it becomes to notice when a voice doesn't sound like Him.

YOUR SENSES ARE BEING TRAINED

Scripture describes mature believers as those:

“who by constant use have trained themselves to distinguish good from evil.”

—Hebrews 5:14

Notice:

trained.

Discernment grows.

You learn.

You practice.

You make mistakes.

You return to Scripture.

You pray.

You listen.

You obey.

You grow.

The objective isn't to become fascinated with supernatural experiences.

The objective is to know the Creator so well...

That you learn to recognize what is true.

PERCEPTION SYSTEM ONLINE

PHYSICAL EYES: Active

SPIRITUAL UNDERSTANDING: Awakening

HOLY SPIRIT: Within

SCRIPTURE: Illuminated

DISCERNMENT: Developing

CONVICTION: Active

ENEMY DECEPTION: Detectable

PRIMARY FOCUS: Jesus

TRAINING STATUS: In progress

QUEST COMPLETE

You thought reality was limited to what you could see.

Now you know better.

The visible world is real...

But it isn't the entire map.

There is an unseen realm.

There is a spiritual battle.

There are truths your physical senses alone cannot discover.

But the Creator hasn't left you blind.

He has given you His Spirit.

The Spirit teaches.

Guides.

Reminds.

Convicts.

Reveals truth.

Glorifies Jesus.

Opens the eyes of your heart.

And trains you to discern.

But learning to see is only the beginning.

Because relationship requires more than sight.

You were created to **know** the Creator.

To walk with Him.

Talk with Him.

Listen.

Trust.

Follow.

Abide.

Remember the question from the beginning?

Does the Creator want you to know Him?

Now you know the answer.

Yes.

And He hasn't merely opened your eyes from a distance.

He has come to live within you.

So how do you actually walk with Him...

Every day?

How do you recognize His voice?

How do you pray?

How do you follow when you don't know where the path leads?

How do you stay connected when life becomes loud?

Your eyes are open.

Now...

learn to walk with the One who opened them.

QUEST 10

CONNECTED

WHEN WHAT YOU SEE DISAGREES WITH WHAT GOD SAID

Objective

Discover what it means to live connected to the Creator—and learn to trust His presence, His voice, and His wisdom when what you see tells a different story.

ENTER

One night...

Jesus' disciples were in a boat.

The wind was strong.

The waves were rough.

And Jesus came toward them...

Walking...

On the water.

Peter saw Him and said:

“Lord, if it's you... tell me to come to you on the water.”

—Matthew 14:28

Jesus answered:

“Come.”

—Matthew 14:29

One word.

That's all Peter had.

Now look at the available information.

PLAYER DATA

WIND: Strong

WAVES: Dangerous

WATER: Cannot support human weight

BOAT: Familiar

JESUS: Standing on water

INSTRUCTION: COME

Everything Peter could see said:

STAY IN THE BOAT.

Jesus said:

COME.

Peter had to decide...

Which source...

He trusted more.

What he could see...

Or the One...

Calling him.

Peter stepped out.

And walked...

On water.

Toward Jesus.

Then something changed.

Scripture says:

“But when he saw the wind, he was afraid...”

—Matthew 14:30

When he saw...

Don't miss that.

The wind...

Was already there.

The waves...

Were already there.

The storm...

Was already there.

Peter didn't suddenly enter...

A different environment.

What changed?

His focus.

Jesus had said:

COME.

The storm said:

IMPOSSIBLE.

And Peter began navigating...

By what he could see.

Fear took over.

And he began...

To sink.

Then Peter cried:

“Lord, save me!”

—Matthew 14:30

And Scripture says:

“Immediately Jesus reached out his hand and caught him.”

—Matthew 14:31

Immediately.

Peter's faith...

Faltered.

Jesus didn't disappear.

Peter became afraid.

Jesus didn't abandon him.

Peter started sinking.

Jesus...

Reached.

That's important.

Because following God...

Is not learning...

How to perform perfectly...

So He will stay near you.

It's learning...

To live...

In relationship...

With the One...

Who already is.

And something was about to happen...

That would make that relationship...

Even more extraordinary.

SOMETHING WAS ABOUT TO CHANGE

Before Jesus went to the cross...

He told His disciples:

“I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever—the Spirit of truth.”

—John 14:16–17

Then He said:

“You know him, for he lives with you and will be in you.”

—John 14:17

Stop there.

WITH YOU.

And then...

IN YOU.

Until now...

You've learned that God...

Created you.

Knows you.

Loves you.

Came looking for you.

Rescued you.

Gave you...

New life.

But being born from above...

Doesn't mean God simply...

Restores your life...

Then sends you off...

To figure everything out alone.

The Creator...

Comes...

To dwell...

Within you.

By His Spirit.

Remember Quest 8?

You were...

Born from above.

Remember Quest 9?

Your eyes...

Opened.

And now...

Something even deeper...

Becomes clear.

You aren't merely...

Alive.

You are...

CONNECTED.

Scripture says:

“Whoever is united with the Lord is one with him in spirit.”

— 1 Corinthians 6:17

The relationship...

That was broken...

In Eden...

Has been restored...

Through Jesus.

And now...

The Spirit of God...

Dwells...

Within His people.

Not because you become...

God.

You don't.

You remain...

You.

Your personality.

Your memories.

Your gifts.

Your questions.

Your voice.

Your individuality.

But you are no longer...

Living...

Alone.

The Creator...

Isn't merely...

Watching...

From Heaven.

His Spirit...

Dwells...

Within you.

CONNECTED

Think about what that means.

You were created...

To know God.

Not merely...

Know facts...

About Him.

Not merely...

Memorize...

Information...

About Him.

Not merely...

Believe...

That He exists.

You were created...

For...

relationship.

Communion.

Trust.

Dependence.

Life...

With Him.

And this changes...

The way you navigate...

Everything.

Because you were never...

Supposed...

To know...

Everything.

You were created...

To know...

THE ONE WHO DOES.

You were never...

Supposed...

To possess...

Unlimited wisdom.

You were created...

To walk...

With...

THE ONE WHO DOES.

You were never...

Supposed...

To become...

So strong...

That eventually...

You wouldn't need...

Your Creator.

You were created...

To receive...

Life...

Wisdom...

Counsel...

Strength...

Truth...

And love...

From Him.

That's...

CONNECTED.

SOMETIMES YOU CAN'T SEE THE PROVISION

A widow living in Zarephath...

Once faced...

An impossible situation.

A famine...

Had devastated...

The land.

She had...

Almost nothing...

Left.

She told Elijah:

“I have only a handful of flour in a jar and a little olive oil in a jug.”

— 1 Kings 17:12

Enough...

For one last meal.

Then...

She expected...

She and her son...

Would die.

That's what...

She could see.

HER SCREEN

FLOUR: Almost Gone

OIL: Almost Gone

FAMINE: Continuing

VISIBLE PROVISION: None

FUTURE: Hopeless

But God...

Saw...

What she couldn't.

Through Elijah...

He promised:

“The jar of flour will not be used up and the jug of oil will not run dry...”

— 1 Kings 17:14

She trusted...

And obeyed.

And:

“The jar of flour was not used up and the jug of oil did not run dry...”

— 1 Kings 17:16

She could see...

One meal.

God could see...

the entire famine.

That's one of the reasons...

Relationship with God...

Changes...

The way you live.

You don't know...

Everything.

He does.

You don't see...

Everything.

He does.

You don't know...

What tomorrow...

Will bring.

He does.

You don't know...

Every consequence...

Of every decision.

He does.

And you were never...

Supposed to.

Maybe one of the greatest...

Spiritual realizations...

Is this:

Your limitation...

Isn't...

A design flaw.

You're a creature.

Not...

The Creator.

You weren't designed...

To carry...

The knowledge...

Of the entire universe.

You were designed...

To walk...

With...

The One...

Who does.

SOMETIMES GOD SHOWS YOU

Remember Elisha's servant?

He looked outside...

And saw...

An enemy army...

Surrounding them.

From his perspective...

They were trapped.

Outnumbered.

Finished.

Then Elisha prayed:

“Open his eyes, LORD, so that he may see.”

—2 Kings 6:17

And suddenly...

The servant saw...

The hills...

Filled...

With horses...

And chariots...

Of fire.

The invisible reality...

Had been there...

The entire time.

He just...

Couldn't see it.

Sometimes...

God does that.

Something becomes...

Clear.

A Scripture...

Suddenly makes sense.

A door opens.

A prayer...

Is answered.

A pattern...

Appears.

You look backward...

And finally realize:

THAT'S WHAT GOD WAS DOING.

But sometimes...

He doesn't show you.

Sometimes...

The storm...

Still looks...

Like a storm.

Sometimes...

The jar...

Still looks...

Almost empty.

Sometimes...

The enemy...

Still looks...

Enormous.

Sometimes...

The road ahead...

Makes...

Absolutely...

No sense.

And in those moments...

Faith says:

I DON'T SEE...

WHAT YOU SEE.

BUT I KNOW...

WHO YOU ARE.

SO I TRUST YOU.

Notice that.

Faith isn't merely:

I believe something good will happen.

It's deeper.

I know...

who You are.

That's relationship.

The more...

You know...

Someone...

The more you know...

Whether they can...

Be trusted.

And the more...

You know God...

His character.

His goodness.

His wisdom.

His faithfulness.

His love.

The more you can say:

I DON'T UNDERSTAND...

WHAT YOU'RE DOING.

BUT I KNOW YOU.

SO I TRUST YOU.

LEARNING THE SHEPHERD'S VOICE

But how do you know...

What God is saying?

Jesus gives...

Another picture.

Sheep.

A Shepherd.

He says:

“My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me.”

—John 10:27

Look at the relationship.

They listen.

He knows them.

They follow.

This isn't a picture...

Of strangers...

Exchanging...

Information.

The Shepherd...

Knows...

The sheep.

And the sheep...

Learn...

The Shepherd.

Think about someone...

You know...

Really well.

They call you...

From an unfamiliar number.

You answer.

They say...

A few words.

And immediately...

You know...

Who it is.

Why?

Relationship...

creates recognition.

You know...

The voice.

The tone.

The character.

The way...

They speak.

And spiritually...

You're learning...

The Shepherd's voice.

The Holy Spirit may...

Convict you.

Remind you...

Of Scripture.

Bring someone...

Strongly...

To mind...

To pray for.

Prompt you...

To speak.

Stay silent.

Go.

Wait.

Give.

Forgive.

Call.

Help.

Walk away.

Stay.

But remember...

Not every thought...

Is God's voice.

Not every feeling...

Is God's direction.

Not every impulse...

Is the Holy Spirit.

Not every open door...

Means...

GO.

So how do you learn...

To recognize...

The signal?

You get to know...

The One...

Speaking.

And you test...

What you think...

You're hearing...

Against...

What He has...

Already revealed...

In His Word.

God will not...

Guide you...

To become...

Less like...

Jesus.

He will not...

Contradict...

His own character.

That's why...

Knowing Scripture...

Matters so much.

The more...

You know...

The Creator's Word...

The more...

You know...

His character.

And the more...

You know...

His character...

The easier...

It becomes...

To recognize...

What doesn't sound...

Like Him.

PRAYER IS COMMUNION

Prayer isn't...

Uploading information...

To God.

He already...

Knows.

Jesus said:

“Your Father knows what you need before you ask him.”

—Matthew 6:8

So why pray?

Because prayer...

Isn't merely...

Information transfer.

It's...

relationship.

communion.

You talk...

To Him.

Praise Him.

Thank Him.

Ask Him.

Confess.

Listen.

Bring Him...

Your questions.

Your fear.

Your anger.

Your hopes.

Your confusion.

Your decisions.

Your pain.

Prayer means...

You stop living...

As though...

Every problem...

Has to remain...

Locked...

Inside...

Your own head.

You bring...

Your life...

Into...

The relationship.

Maybe you need...

Wisdom.

Ask Him.

Scripture says:

“If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God...”

—James 1:5

You need...

Direction?

Ask.

Strength?

Ask.

Courage?

Ask.

Understanding?

Ask.

Peace?

Ask.

Help?

Ask.

Sometimes...

Prayer...

Is beautiful.

Sometimes...

Prayer...

Is messy.

Sometimes...

It's long.

Sometimes...

It's...

One sentence.

GOD...

HELP ME.

And sometimes...

You don't even know...

What to say.

But even there...

You're not alone.

Scripture says:

“The Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans.”

—Romans 8:26

Think about that.

The Holy Spirit...

Doesn't merely...

Observe your prayer...

From far away.

He helps...

You pray...

From...

within.

That's...

Connected.

KEEP IN STEP

Paul describes...

The life...

Of someone...

Born from above...

This way:

“Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit.”

—Galatians 5:25

Notice...

The order.

LIVE...

By the Spirit.

Then...

KEEP IN STEP...

With the Spirit.

Life...

First.

Walking...

Second.

You don't walk...

In order...

To become alive.

You walk...

Because you...

Have been...

Made alive.

Now...

You are learning...

How to live...

From that...

New reality.

Step...

By step.

Not:

God, give me the entire map...

Before I move.

Sometimes...

He gives...

One instruction.

Come.

One step.

Then another.

Then another.

And that's difficult...

Because your instinct...

May be:

I WANT TO KNOW...

EVERYTHING FIRST.

Where is this going?

What happens next?

What if...

I make the wrong decision?

What will...

This cost me?

How will...

This end?

But relationship...

Changes the question.

Instead of:

DO I KNOW...

THE WHOLE MAP?

You begin asking:

DO I KNOW...

THE ONE...

I'M WALKING WITH?

YOU DON'T NEED THE WHOLE MAP

Maybe you've been...

Trying to make...

Every decision...

Like this:

Collect...

Enough information.

Analyze...

Every possibility.

Predict...

Every outcome.

Control...

Every variable.

Then...

Move.

But life...

Doesn't work...

Like that.

There will always...

Be variables...

You can't see.

Information...

You don't have.

Outcomes...

You can't predict.

People...

You can't control.

Events...

You didn't expect.

And maybe...

That's intentional.

Because you were never...

Supposed to navigate...

Reality...

As though...

You were...

The Creator.

You were created...

To know...

the Creator.

And sometimes...

He gives...

Enough light...

For the next step.

Not...

The next hundred.

You may ask:

God...

Where is this going?

And His answer...

May simply be:

FOLLOW ME.

Because the objective...

Isn't merely...

Getting you...

To a destination.

It's teaching you...

To walk...

with Him.

STOP TRYING TO BE THE POWER SOURCE

There's another habit...

You may need...

To unlearn.

For most of your life...

You may have assumed...

The goal...

Was becoming...

Strong enough...

Smart enough...

Capable enough...

Disciplined enough...

Independent enough...

To handle...

Life...

By yourself.

And maybe...

You even brought...

That same idea...

Into your relationship...

With God.

God...

Give me enough...

Wisdom...

So eventually...

I won't need...

To ask You.

Give me enough...

Strength...

So eventually...

I won't need...

To depend...

On You.

Give me enough...

Understanding...

So eventually...

I can navigate...

Everything...

Myself.

But what if...

The goal...

Was never...

Independence?

Jesus gives...

A completely different...

Picture:

“I am the vine; you are the branches...”

—John 15:5

A branch...

Doesn't become...

More mature...

By disconnecting...

From the vine.

It becomes...

More fruitful...

By remaining...

Connected.

Jesus continues:

“Apart from me you can do nothing.”

Not:

Apart from Me...

you'll have a harder time.

He says:

Nothing.

Because you were never...

Supposed to be...

The Source.

You're...

The branch.

He...

Is the Vine.

Paul gives...

Another image:

“But we have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us.”

—2 Corinthians 4:7

You...

Are the jar.

He...

Is the treasure.

You remain...

You.

But now...

You don't have to pretend...

That everything...

You need...

Must originate...

From you.

Maybe you've spent...

Your whole life...

Asking God...

To give you...

Enough wisdom...

Enough strength...

Enough peace...

Enough understanding...

Enough power...

To successfully...

Do life.

And then...

You discover...

Something much bigger.

HE INTENDED...

TO GIVE YOU...

HIMSELF.

THE SPIRIT WITHIN YOU

Remember...

John 14:17.

“He lives with you and will be in you.”

And Isaiah describes...

The Spirit of the LORD...

As:

**“the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding,
the Spirit of counsel and of might,
the Spirit of the knowledge and fear of the LORD.”**

—Isaiah 11:2

Wisdom.

Understanding.

Counsel.

Might.

Knowledge.

Maybe you don't...

Know...

What to do.

But you know...

the Spirit of wisdom.

Maybe you don't...

Understand.

But you know...

the Spirit of understanding.

Maybe you're not sure...

Which way...

To go.

But you know...

the Spirit of counsel.

Maybe you feel...

Weak.

But you know...

the Spirit of might.

You don't have...

To become...

Omniscient.

You know...

THE ONE WHO IS.

You don't have...

To become...

Omnipotent.

You know...

THE ONE WHO IS.

You don't have...

To see...

The entire map.

You're learning...

To walk...

With...

THE ONE WHO DOES.

That's...

Connected.

AND YES...

YOU WILL FORGET

Sometimes...

You'll still...

Grab...

The controls.

You'll start...

Trying...

To figure...

Everything out...

Alone.

You'll worry.

Control.

Overthink.

Push.

Try harder.

You'll forget...

For a moment...

That you were never...

Supposed...

To carry...

Everything...

By yourself.

And eventually...

You'll remember.

WAIT.

I'M NOT ALONE.

You'll pray.

Ask.

Listen.

Return...

Your attention...

To the One...

Walking...

With you.

And there's going...

To be much more...

To learn...

About those moments.

About old reactions.

New choices.

Failure.

Growth.

Transformation.

Becoming...

More like...

Jesus.

But that's coming...

Later.

For now...

Learn this:

YOU ARE NOT ALONE.

Dwells...

Within you.

Scripture says...

You are...

United...

With the Lord...

In spirit.

The relationship...

You were created...

For...

Has begun...

To be restored.

And now...

You're learning...

How to live...

From it.

Peter...

Saw...

The waves.

The widow...

Saw...

The empty jar.

Elisha's servant...

Saw...

The enemy army.

Each of them...

Had access...

To information...

That wasn't visible...

On the screen.

And so do you.

You have...

The Creator's Word.

The Spirit...

Within you.

Prayer.

His wisdom.

His counsel.

His presence.

His character.

His promises.

You will not...

Always know...

What He's doing.

You will not...

Always understand...

What you see.

You will not...

Always know...

Where the road...

Is going.

But the goal...

Was never...

To become...

The one...

Who knows...

Everything.

The goal...

Was to know...

THE ONE WHO DOES.

You're learning...

To recognize...

His voice.

Trust...

His character.

Ask...

For wisdom.

Bring...

Your life...

Into prayer.

Take...

The next step.

Remain...

Connected.

Because maybe...

The deepest change...

Isn't that God...

Gave you...

A better map.

It's that...

The Creator...

Who knows...

The map...

Now walks...

with you.

And by His Spirit...

Dwells...

within you.

CONNECTED.

Not merely...

To information.

Not merely...

To guidance.

Not merely...

To power.

Not merely...

To answers.

TO HIM.

But if you're going...

To learn...

To recognize...

His voice...

And know...

What sounds...

Like Him...

You need...

To know...

What He has...

Already said.

You need...

The Walkthrough.

Not someone else's...

Opinion...

About it.

Not a few...

Random verses...

Online.

You need...

To open it.

Read it.

Learn it.

Ask the Spirit...

To teach you...

Through it.

Because the better...

You know...

His Word...

The better...

You recognize...

The One...

Who spoke it.

OPEN THE WALKTHROUGH.

QUEST 11

The Greatest Walkthrough Ever Written

 **Objective**

Discover why the Creator gave you His Word—and learn to trust the Holy Spirit to teach you as you read it, so you can know God, recognize truth, and navigate reality.

ENTER

You're CONNECTED.

The Creator's Spirit lives within you.

You're learning to listen.

To trust.

To follow.

But there's a problem.

There are a lot of voices.

Your own thoughts.

Your emotions.

Your friends.

Your family.

Teachers.

Pastors.

Influencers.

Podcasts.

Algorithms.

Advertisements.

Culture.

Tradition.

Religion.

Fear.

Desire.

The enemy.

Everyone seems to have an opinion about...

Who you are.

What matters.

What's right.

What's wrong.

What will make you happy.

What God is like.

What God wants.

Whether God even exists.

And sometimes...

They completely contradict one another.

So how do you know what's true?

How do you know what God actually said?

How do you recognize the Creator's voice when thousands of other voices are competing for your attention?

The Creator didn't leave you guessing.

He gave you the Walkthrough.

And He didn't just give you the Walkthrough.

He gave you the Teacher.

THE WALKTHROUGH

Imagine being dropped into the most complicated game ever created.

Massive open world.

Hidden realms.

Multiple kingdoms.

Enemies.

Allies.

Consequences.

Abilities.

Objectives.

Rules you don't completely understand.

Decisions that affect things you cannot see.

A story that began long before you arrived.

And a final destination toward which everything is moving.

Then someone tells you:

The Developer wrote a Walkthrough.

Not some random player.

Not someone guessing online.

Not someone who played three levels and started a channel.

The One who designed the game.

Would you open it?

Because that's what Scripture claims to be.

Paul writes:

“All Scripture is God-breathed...”

—2 Timothy 3:16

God-breathed.

Remember that phrase.

Because you've encountered God's breath before.

At creation:

“The LORD God formed a man from the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life...”

—Genesis 2:7

God breathed...

And humanity lived.

Now Scripture says His Word is...

God-breathed.

The Creator who gave you life...

has spoken.

AND HE GAVE YOU THE TEACHER

This may be one of the most important things you understand about reading Scripture:

You are not reading it alone.

Before Jesus left His disciples, He promised:

“The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you all things...”

—John 14:26

Notice the word:

TEACH.

Jesus didn't say:

Maybe the Holy Spirit will teach you.

He said:

He will teach you.

And later Jesus said:

“When he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all the truth.”

—John 16:13

The Holy Spirit is your Teacher.

And if the Holy Spirit is God...

And He is...

Then think about who is teaching you.

He isn't limited by time.

He isn't limited by location.

He doesn't become distracted.

He doesn't misunderstand your question.

He doesn't forget where you are in the lesson.

God is omnipresent.

He is everywhere.

God is omniscient.

He knows everything.

David wrote:

“You have searched me, LORD, and you know me... Before a word is on my tongue you, LORD, know it completely.”

—Psalm 139:1, 4

He knows every question forming in your mind.

Every misconception.

Every gap in your understanding.

Every experience that shaped the way you interpret what you're reading.

He knows what you learned yesterday.

He knows what you're ready to understand today.

And He knows what foundation needs to be built before you'll understand something tomorrow.

You can trust God to teach you.

THE AUTHOR LIVES WITHIN YOU

Now connect this to the last Quest.

Who lives within you?

The Holy Spirit.

And who inspired Scripture?

Peter explains:

“Prophets, though human, spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit.”

—2 Peter 1:21

Think about that.

The Spirit who inspired the Word...

Is the Spirit who now dwells within you.

You have:

The Walkthrough.

And...

The Teacher.

The Holy Spirit doesn't replace Scripture.

And Scripture doesn't replace the Holy Spirit.

God gave you both.

The Word gives you objective truth.

The Spirit illuminates truth, teaches you, convicts you, reminds you, and helps you understand.

And because the Spirit inspired Scripture...

He will not contradict what He inspired.

So if a voice tells you something contrary to what God has already revealed...

test the signal.

The Spirit of truth does not contradict Himself.

NAVIGATION SYSTEM

CREATOR: God

WALKTHROUGH: Scripture

SOURCE: God-breathed

TEACHER: Holy Spirit

PLAYER: Learning
DISCERNMENT: Developing
CENTER OF THE STORY: Jesus Christ
ACCESS: Open

THIS ISN'T JUST A RULEBOOK

Maybe you've thought of the Bible as a giant book of rules.

DO THIS.

DON'T DO THAT.

BE GOOD.

TRY HARDER.

Yes...

The Bible contains commands.

But if that's all you see...

You're missing the story.

The Bible tells you:

Who created the world.

Who you are.

Why you exist.

What went wrong.

Who the enemy is.

Why death entered the world.

What sin does.

How God responds to rebellion.

How God keeps His promises.

How He deals with nations.

How He rescues people.

How He disciplines His children.

How He speaks.

How He loves.

How He judges.

How He forgives.

How He restores.

What happens in the unseen realm.

How spiritual battles work.

What wisdom looks like.

What foolishness produces.

What faith looks like.

What rebellion produces.

Where history is going.

And most importantly...

Who God is.

Remember what Jesus said eternal life actually is:

“Now this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent.”

—John 17:3

The objective isn't merely knowing the Bible.

It's **knowing God.**

And Scripture is where He has revealed His story, His character, His purposes, and ultimately...

His Son.

YOU LEARN HIS CHARACTER

Imagine someone sends you a message claiming to be from your closest friend.

But the message sounds completely unlike them.

Cruel.

Dishonest.

Manipulative.

You immediately think:

That doesn't sound like them.

Why?

Because you know their character.

The more deeply you know someone...

The easier it becomes to recognize what sounds like them.

Scripture teaches you the Creator's character.

You discover:

He is holy.

He is just.

He is merciful.

He is faithful.

He is patient.

He is compassionate.

He hates evil.

He loves truth.

He keeps His promises.

He forgives.

He disciplines.

He rescues.

He loves.

And as you learn His character...

You become better equipped to recognize His voice.

YOU LEARN FROM OTHER PLAYERS

The Bible doesn't give you sanitized heroes.

It gives you real people.

Abraham trusted God...

And sometimes became afraid.

Moses encountered God...

And still struggled.

David loved God...

And committed terrible sin.

Elijah called down fire...

And later ran for his life.

Peter walked on water...

And sank.

He promised never to abandon Jesus...

And denied Him three times.

Thomas doubted.

Jonah ran.

Samson compromised.

Solomon possessed extraordinary wisdom...

And still wandered.

Israel repeatedly trusted God...

Forgot God...

Suffered...

Cried out...

And was rescued.

Why show you all of that?

Because the Walkthrough doesn't merely tell you what to do.

It shows you what happened to players who walked the map before you.

Choices.

Consequences.

Faith.

Failure.

Repentance.

Mercy.

Judgment.

Restoration.

Paul says:

“These things happened to them as examples and were written down as warnings for us...”

— 1 Corinthians 10:11

You get to learn from people who walked parts of the map before you.

YOU LEARN THE RULES OF THE GAME

Yes...

There are rules.

But God's commands aren't arbitrary restrictions designed to ruin your fun.

They come from the One who designed you.

Imagine the Developer tells you:

Don't enter that area.

You can interpret that two ways.

He's controlling me.

Or...

He knows something about that area that I don't.

Remember Eden.

The enemy's first strategy was to make humanity question God's Word and reinterpret God's boundary as deprivation.

God is keeping something good from you.

That lie still works.

But once you begin knowing the Creator's character...

His commands begin looking different.

Instead of asking:

Why is God restricting me?

You begin asking:

What does my Creator know that I don't?

The Psalmist says:

“Your word is a lamp for my feet, a light on my path.”

—Psalm 119:105

Notice what a lamp does.

It doesn't necessarily illuminate the next twenty years.

It gives you enough light...

for the next step.

THE WORD EXPOSES YOU

But sometimes...

You won't like what the Walkthrough says.

Because Scripture doesn't merely reveal God.

It reveals you.

The writer of Hebrews says:

“For the word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword...”

—Hebrews 4:12

It penetrates beneath the surface.

It exposes things you might rather leave hidden.

Because you're very good at explaining yourself...

To yourself.

Everyone is.

I only said that because...

I did it because they deserved it...

It's not really pride...

I'm not jealous...

I can stop whenever I want...

Everybody does it...

God understands...

Then Scripture cuts through the excuses.

It reveals motives.

Pride.

Bitterness.

Lust.

Fear.

Selfishness.

Unforgiveness.

Idolatry.

And the Holy Spirit says:

Look at this.

Not to destroy you.

To transform you.

Remember:

The enemy accuses so you'll hide.

The Holy Spirit convicts so you'll bring things into the light.

The Walkthrough becomes a mirror.

James explains:

“Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like someone who looks at his face in a mirror and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like. But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues in it—not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it—they will be blessed in what they do.”

—James 1:23–25

You don't look in a mirror so the mirror can insult you.

You look because you want to see what's actually there.

And once you see it...

You respond.

Scripture shows you reality.

Even when reality is uncomfortable.

JESUS IS AT THE CENTER

But here's the most important thing about the Walkthrough.

The Bible isn't ultimately pointing you toward...

the Bible.

It's pointing you toward...

Jesus.

Jesus told people who knew Scripture extremely well:

“These are the very Scriptures that testify about me.”

—John 5:39

Genesis.

The covenants.

The Law.

The Passover lamb.

The sacrifices.

The priesthood.

The tabernacle.

The temple.

The kings.

The prophets.

The promises.

The suffering servant.

The coming King.

The rescue.

The story keeps moving toward Him.

John begins his Gospel:

“In the beginning was the Word...”

—John 1:1

And then:

“The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us.”

—John 1:14

The written Word reveals...

the Living Word.

You aren't studying Scripture merely to accumulate information.

You're learning the character...

Voice...

Ways...

Promises...

And story...

Of the One you're walking with.

THE VEIL COMES OFF IN CHRIST

And there's another reason Jesus has to remain at the center of the Walkthrough.

Paul describes something remarkable about Scripture:

“Only in Christ is it taken away.”

—2 Corinthians 3:14

He was talking about a **veil** over the understanding of the old covenant.

Then he says:

“Whenever anyone turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away.”

—2 Corinthians 3:16

Think about that.

You can read the words...

Know the stories...

Memorize the commands...

Study the history...

And still miss what the story is ultimately revealing.

Jesus.

Remember what Jesus Himself said:

“These are the very Scriptures that testify about me.”

—John 5:39

In Christ...

The pieces begin coming together.

The Passover lamb looks different.

The sacrifices look different.

The priesthood looks different.

The temple looks different.

The manna looks different.

The serpent lifted in the wilderness looks different.

The suffering servant looks different.

The promises look different.

You begin recognizing that the Walkthrough has been pointing toward the Rescue Mission all along.

And now the Holy Spirit—the Teacher—helps you see it.

Paul continues:

“Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom.”

—2 Corinthians 3:17

And then he describes what happens as the veil is removed:

“We all, who with unveiled faces contemplate the Lord's glory, are being transformed into his image...”

—2 Corinthians 3:18

There it is again.

Eyes opened.

Christ revealed.

Spirit teaching.

Player transformed.

The objective isn't simply to understand more information.

The Walkthrough reveals Jesus...

And as you behold Him...

you are changed.

JESUS KNEW THE WALKTHROUGH

When Satan tempted Jesus in the wilderness...

The enemy spoke.

Jesus answered:

“It is written...”

—Matthew 4:4

The enemy tried again.

“It is also written...”

—Matthew 4:7

Again.

“For it is written...”

—Matthew 4:10

The enemy speaks.

The Word answers.

But then something fascinating happens.

Satan quotes Scripture too.

He takes words from the Psalms and tries to use them against Jesus.

That's important.

Because merely quoting a Bible verse doesn't make someone's interpretation correct.

A verse can be quoted...

And twisted.

Removed from context.

Misapplied.

Used to manipulate.

That's why you need more than a collection of favorite verses.

You need to know the Walkthrough.

DON'T TRUST MAN MORE THAN GOD

God absolutely uses people to teach you.

Pastors.

Teachers.

Scholars.

Parents.

Friends.

Authors.

Other believers.

Scripture itself says God gives teachers to His Church.

So this isn't:

Never listen to people.

It's:

Never place a human teacher above the Teacher.

Human beings can misunderstand Scripture.

They can repeat traditions they've never examined.

They can be influenced by culture.

They can be mistaken.

They can even be deceptive.

God isn't.

So receive teaching...

But test teaching.

Listen...

But verify.

Learn...

But keep returning to the Word.

Your faith ultimately rests on **God's truth**, not another person's reputation.

HOW WILL YOU KNOW IF THEY'RE RIGHT?

This creates an obvious problem.

If you don't know Scripture...

How will you know whether someone is teaching it correctly?

If you've only read a few verses...

How will you recognize when someone has taken one out of context?

If you've never seen the whole map...

How will you recognize when someone describes the map incorrectly?

That's why it's important to read...

the entire Walkthrough.

Not just the famous parts.

Not only the verses someone sends you.

Not only the New Testament.

Not only Psalms and Proverbs.

Start in Genesis.

Keep going.

Read through Revelation.

See the whole story.

And when you're finished?

Go back to Genesis.

Start again.

Because the second journey won't be the same as the first.

You'll start noticing things.

You'll read Genesis and think:

Wait... I've seen this somewhere else.

You'll encounter something in Exodus and recognize it when you reach the Gospels.

You'll read about the Passover lamb...

And think about Jesus.

You'll read about the tabernacle...

Then encounter Hebrews.

You'll read Daniel...

Then Revelation.

You'll see:

Lambs.

Blood.

Bread.

Water.

Wilderness.

Gardens.

Trees.

Mountains.

Temples.

Priests.

Kings.

Weddings.

Kingdoms.

Exile.

Return.

Death.

Resurrection.

Things that once looked disconnected...

Begin fitting together.

The map starts taking shape.

DON'T GET DISCOURAGED

Maybe you open the Bible and think:

I don't understand this.

Good.

You're learning.

Maybe you understand half of what you're reading.

Maybe less.

Keep going.

You aren't expected to understand everything on your first journey through the Walkthrough.

Think about school.

You didn't begin with literature.

First you learned:

A B C D E...

Then you learned letters have sounds.

Sounds create words.

Words become sentences.

Sentences become paragraphs.

Then came vocabulary.

Grammar.

Context.

Metaphor.

History.

And eventually...

You could read an entire book and understand ideas that would have been impossible when you were learning the alphabet.

Nobody looks at a child learning **A B C** and says:

Why don't you understand Shakespeare yet?

They're building the foundation.

Scripture can be like that.

At first you're learning:

Who is Abraham?

What is a covenant?

Who is Israel?

Why are there sacrifices?

What is the Law?

Why is there a tabernacle?

Why a temple?

What's a prophet?

What's the difference between Israel and Judah?

Why did they go into exile?

Who are the Pharisees?

Why does Jesus talk about the Kingdom?

Why does Revelation suddenly contain images that seem strangely familiar?

At first...

It may feel like disconnected information.

Keep reading.

You're building the framework that allows later understanding.

FIRST... GET THE BIG PICTURE

On your first journey through Scripture...

You don't have to solve every mystery.

Get the map.

See the story.

Creation.

Fall.

Promise.

Covenant.

Israel.

Law.

Sacrifice.

Kings.

Prophets.

Exile.

Return.

Messiah.

Cross.

Resurrection.

Holy Spirit.

Church.

Kingdom.

Restoration.

New Creation.

Once you begin seeing the whole story...

The individual pieces have somewhere to go.

Think about assembling a giant puzzle.

When only three pieces are sitting on the table...

You may have no idea what you're looking at.

Add fifty pieces...

Something begins appearing.

Add five hundred...

Now you recognize the picture.

Scripture works like that.

Something confusing in Leviticus becomes clearer when you read Hebrews.

Something in Daniel connects with Revelation.

Something in Exodus illuminates something Jesus says in John.

Something Jesus says sends you back to Genesis.

Scripture begins illuminating Scripture.

Understanding builds.

Piece upon piece.

Truth connecting with truth.

TRUST THE TEACHER

And this is where you need to remember who is reading with you.

The Holy Spirit.

Don't become discouraged because another believer understands something you don't.

Don't assume God has forgotten to teach you.

Don't think:

Maybe I'm not smart enough for this.

The Creator knows exactly where you are.

He knows the foundation you already have.

He knows the pieces you're missing.

He knows the questions you haven't even learned to ask yet.

And He is perfectly capable of teaching you.

Paul writes:

“What we have received is not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, so that we may understand what God has freely given us.”

—1 Corinthians 2:12

Your Teacher is not limited by your classroom.

He isn't limited by your education.

He isn't limited to Sunday morning.

He isn't available only when someone with a theological degree is standing nearby.

He is with you.

Open Scripture at your kitchen table...

He's there.

Read on your phone during lunch...

He's there.

Sit alone with your Bible at two in the morning...

He's there.

Ask a question no one else hears...

He hears it.

God knows every thought before you speak it.

You can trust Him to teach you.

ASK QUESTIONS

So ask.

Why did God say that?

What does this word mean?

Who is this person?

Where is this place?

Why does this matter?

Have I seen this somewhere else?

Is Jesus referring to something from the Old Testament?

What would the original audience have understood?

What happened before this?

What happens afterward?

What does this reveal about God?

What does this reveal about humanity?

How does this fit into the larger story?

Questions aren't enemies of faith.

Questions can drive you deeper into truth.

Look things up.

Compare passages.

Use cross-references.

Learn history.

Use study tools.

Ask mature believers.

Listen to trustworthy teachers.

But then...

go back to Scripture.

Test what you're being told against the Walkthrough.

THE BEREANS CHECKED PAUL

This is exactly what a group of believers called the Bereans did.

Paul came teaching them.

And Scripture says they:

“received the message with great eagerness and examined the Scriptures every day to see if what Paul said was true.”

—Acts 17:11

Think about that.

Paul.

The apostle Paul was teaching them...

And they still checked Scripture.

They didn't say:

He's an apostle. He sounds convincing. Just believe everything.

They examined the Scriptures.

Is this true?

That's not rebellion.

That's discernment.

So listen to teachers.

Learn from pastors.

Read books.

Join Bible studies.

Ask questions.

Use resources.

But never hand another human being the responsibility for knowing God's Word **for you.**

Trust God over man.

And trust God...

to teach you.

KEEP READING

Something remarkable happens over time.

The passage that confused you six months ago...

Suddenly makes sense.

Why?

Maybe another passage gave you the missing piece.

Maybe you learned the historical context.

Maybe you've now encountered the same idea five different times.

Maybe you've matured.

Maybe you've experienced something that helps you understand it.

Or maybe the Holy Spirit simply opens your understanding to something that was there all along.

The Bible didn't change.

You did.

Your understanding grew.

So...

Read.

Ask.

Study.

Pray.

Listen.

Obey.

Then...

read again.

And again.

Understanding builds upon understanding.

The map becomes clearer.

The story becomes deeper.

And eventually...

You begin seeing connections you couldn't see before.

Not because someone gave you a secret Bible.

Because you're learning the Walkthrough.

WHEN THE WORLD SAYS SOMETHING DIFFERENT

There will be moments when culture tells you one thing...

And Scripture says another.

Your emotions may tell you one thing...

And Scripture says another.

Your friends may tell you one thing...

And Scripture says another.

A teacher may tell you one thing...

And Scripture says another.

Your circumstances may tell you one thing...

And Scripture says another.

The enemy may whisper one thing...

And Scripture says another.

Then you're back in the cockpit.

What do you trust?

What you can currently see?

What everyone around you says?

What feels right in the moment?

Or the One who sees the entire map?

Jesus prayed:

“Sanctify them by the truth; your word is truth.”

—John 17:17

This is why you need to know the Walkthrough.

THE WALKTHROUGH CHANGES YOU

Scripture isn't only information.

God uses it to transform you.

Paul writes:

“Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind.”

—Romans 12:2

Think about how much information has already entered your mind.

Family.

Culture.

Education.

Pain.

Entertainment.

Relationships.

Social media.

Algorithms.

Advertising.

Fear.

Desire.

Some of what you've absorbed is true.

Some isn't.

The Walkthrough begins recalibrating your mind to reality.

CREATOR SETTINGS RESTORING...

Lies get exposed.

Truth replaces them.

Your thinking changes.

Your desires begin changing.

Your choices change.

Your character changes.

And slowly...

You begin seeing reality more like the Creator sees it.

THE WALKTHROUGH IS ALIVE

This isn't merely an ancient document.

God still uses His Word to speak into human lives.

The writer of Hebrews says:

“The word of God is alive and active.”

—Hebrews 4:12

You may read something you've read ten times before...

And suddenly...

There it is.

The words didn't change.

But now you see something you couldn't see before.

The Walkthrough was already there.

The Teacher was already there.

But now...

Another piece connects.

Another layer opens.

Another truth becomes clear.

And you realize:

God is teaching me.

WALKTHROUGH UNLOCKED

SOURCE: Creator

STATUS: God-breathed

TEACHER: Holy Spirit

CENTER: Jesus Christ

PURPOSE: Know God

FUNCTION: Reveal truth

FUNCTION: Expose deception

FUNCTION: Train discernment

FUNCTION: Illuminate the path

FUNCTION: Renew the mind

FUNCTION: Correct the player

FUNCTION: Equip the player

PLAYER UNDERSTANDING: Growing

ACCESS: Open

QUEST COMPLETE

The Creator didn't drop you into this world without instructions.

He gave you His Word.

And He didn't hand you His Word and walk away.

He gave you His Spirit.

The Walkthrough...

And the Teacher.

Scripture isn't merely a rulebook.

It's revelation.

History.

Warning.

Wisdom.

A mirror.

A lamp.

A weapon against deception.

A map.

A story.

And ultimately...

a revelation of Jesus Christ.

So open it.

Don't be intimidated.

Don't worry if you don't understand everything.

Start.

Read the whole story.

Genesis to Revelation.

Get the map.

Ask questions.

Keep going.

And when you finish...

start again.

The second journey will not look like the first.

And the tenth won't look like the second.

Because you're growing.

You're learning.

Your eyes are opening.

And the Holy Spirit is teaching you.

Listen to human teachers.

Learn from them.

Be grateful for them.

But never trust a human voice above the Creator's Word.

Know the Walkthrough well enough to check.

Because the more you know Scripture...

The more you learn God's character.

The more you know His character...

The more easily you recognize His voice.

And the more clearly you recognize His voice...

The harder it becomes for a counterfeit to fool you.

But there's something else you need to understand.

Owning the Walkthrough isn't the same as using it.

Downloading a guide doesn't help if you never open it.

And reading Scripture isn't meant to be merely an intellectual exercise.

Jesus described God's Word as something even more essential than instructions.

Food.

Your new life has been born.

Now...

It needs nourishment.

You don't merely need to **read** the Word.

You need to **feed on it**.

QUEST 12 — Feed Your Character

QUEST 12

Feed Your Character

Objective

Discover why your new life needs spiritual nourishment—and how God's Word feeds your mind, strengthens your faith, renews your thinking, and helps you grow in Christ.

ENTER

You're alive.

Born from above.

A new creation.

The Holy Spirit lives within you.

You've opened the Walkthrough.

You've begun learning the map.

But remember something about new life:

Living things need food.

A baby can be completely alive...

And desperately hungry.

Birth is the beginning.

Not the end.

Your new birth gave you life.

Now...

you need to grow.

PLAYER STATUS

SPIRITUAL STATUS: Alive

NEW BIRTH: Complete

HOLY SPIRIT: Within

GROWTH: Beginning

NOURISHMENT REQUIRED: Yes

FOOD SOURCE: Unlocked

YOU ALREADY UNDERSTAND THIS

Stop eating physical food.

What happens?

At first...

You're hungry.

Then weak.

Your concentration drops.

Your energy disappears.

Eventually your entire body begins suffering because it isn't receiving what it needs.

Nobody says:

I ate last Sunday. Why am I hungry again?

Of course you're hungry again.

You're alive.

Living things require continual nourishment.

And Jesus said something astonishing about your spiritual life:

“Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.”

—Matthew 4:4

Bread keeps your physical body alive.

But you are more than a body.

Remember your character build?

BODY.

SOUL.

SPIRIT.

You need more than physical food.

You need truth.

You need the Word of God.

THIS STARTED A LONG TIME AGO

Jesus was quoting Scripture when He said that.

The words came from Deuteronomy.

God had allowed Israel to experience hunger in the wilderness and then provided manna from Heaven.

Why?

Moses explains:

“He humbled you, causing you to hunger and then feeding you with manna... to teach you that man does not live on bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of the LORD.”

—Deuteronomy 8:3

God was teaching Israel something through physical hunger.

You are dependent on Me for life.

The manna fed their bodies.

But the lesson went deeper.

Human beings don't live by physical provision alone.

They live by what comes from God.

YOUR NEW LIFE NEEDS FOOD

Peter writes to believers:

“Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation.”

— 1 Peter 2:2

There it is.

Newborn.

Food.

Growth.

You've been born.

Now grow.

A newborn doesn't need to be ashamed because it isn't an adult yet.

It needs to eat.

That's important.

Maybe you're reading Scripture and thinking:

I should know more by now.

Maybe.

But shame won't grow you.

Eat.

Maybe someone else understands Scripture better.

Good.

Eat.

Maybe you've made mistakes.

Eat.

Maybe you barely understand what you're reading.

Keep going.

Eat.

Growth happens through nourishment over time.

BUT WHAT ARE YOU ACTUALLY FEEDING ON?

This is where we need to make an important distinction.

The Bible is God's Word written...

But the objective of Scripture isn't merely to fill your brain with biblical information.

The Walkthrough is leading you to a Person.

Remember Quest 11:

Jesus is at the center.

And Jesus says:

“I am the bread of life.”

—John 6:35

Jesus doesn't merely **give** you life.

He is Life.

He doesn't merely point toward the bread.

He is the Bread.

John calls Him:

“the Word.”

—John 1:1

And then:

“The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us.”

—John 1:14

So don't confuse the pages with the Person.

You don't worship a book.

You worship the God the book reveals.

You don't read Scripture merely to collect facts about Jesus.

You read Scripture to know Him.

The written Word continually directs you toward...

the Living Word.

YOU ARE ALWAYS EATING SOMETHING

Here's the problem.

Your mind doesn't stop consuming information just because you aren't reading Scripture.

You're being fed...

all day long.

Scroll.

Swipe.

Watch.

Listen.

Click.

Repeat.

Social media feeds.

News feeds.

Video feeds.

Music.

Movies.

Advertising.

Comments.

Influencers.

Algorithms.

Opinions.

Images.

Messages.

Your phone literally calls some of these things...

feeds.

Interesting word.

Because that's exactly what they're doing.

Feeding you.

The question isn't:

Am I being fed?

The question is:

What am I eating?

DAILY INPUT

Every day something is teaching you:

WHAT MATTERS

WHAT SUCCESS LOOKS LIKE

WHAT BEAUTY LOOKS LIKE

WHAT LOVE LOOKS LIKE

WHAT SEX IS FOR

WHAT MONEY IS FOR

WHAT POWER IS FOR

WHAT YOUR BODY IS FOR

WHAT WILL MAKE YOU HAPPY

WHO YOU SHOULD FEAR

WHO YOU SHOULD HATE

WHO YOU SHOULD BECOME

You may never consciously choose those lessons.

But repeated exposure teaches.

And eventually...

What enters your mind begins shaping how you see reality.

THE ALGORITHM KNOWS WHAT KEEPS YOU WATCHING

Think about how a digital feed works.

You click something.

The algorithm notices.

You watch longer.

It notices.

You search.

It notices.

You react.

It notices.

Then it gives you...

more.

More of what keeps your attention.

More of what provokes emotion.
More of what confirms your interests.
More of what keeps you scrolling.
And gradually your feed becomes personalized.
Not necessarily around what is **true**...
But around what keeps you **engaged**.
The Creator has a different objective.
He isn't trying to keep you scrolling.
He's transforming you.

YOUR MIND NEEDS RENEWING

Remember:

You were born again...

But you didn't wake up the next morning having forgotten everything the world ever taught you.

You still have habits.

Assumptions.

Memories.

Wounds.

Fears.

Desires.

Patterns of thinking.

Some are healthy.

Some aren't.

Some are true.

Some are lies you've believed for years.

That's why Paul says:

“Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind.”

—Romans 12:2

Renewing.

Your spirit has been made alive...

And now God begins transforming how you think.

Think of it like recalibration.

SYSTEM SCAN

OLD LIE: My worth depends on what people think of me.

TRUTH: My identity begins with the Creator who made me.

OLD LIE: I need to control everything.

TRUTH: I can trust the One who sees the entire map.

OLD LIE: My desires determine what is good.

TRUTH: The Creator knows what I was designed for.

OLD LIE: My past determines my identity.

TRUTH: I am a new creation in Christ.

OLD LIE: I'm alone.

TRUTH: His Spirit dwells within me.

OLD LIE: Death wins.

TRUTH: Keep playing.

That Boss is coming later.

THE WORD WASHES YOUR THINKING

Paul uses another image when describing what Christ does for His people.

He speaks of:

“washing with water through the word.”

—Ephesians 5:26

Think about that.

The world deposits layer after layer of messages into your mind.

God's truth begins washing away what doesn't belong.

Not instantly.

Not mechanically.

But over time...

Truth replaces lies.

Your perspective changes.

Things you once desired may begin losing their power.

Things you once ignored become important.

Things you once justified begin bothering you.

Things you once couldn't understand begin making sense.

You start thinking:

Why did I ever believe that?

The Word is renewing your mind.

And the Holy Spirit is teaching you through it.

FAITH NEEDS SOMETHING TO STAND ON

There's another reason you need the Word.

Remember Peter in the storm?

Faith wasn't Peter convincing himself that he could walk on water.

Jesus said:

Come.

Peter trusted what Jesus said.

Biblical faith isn't:

I really, really believe something will happen.

Faith responds to **God**.

That's why Paul writes:

“Faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ.”

—Romans 10:17

The more you know what God has actually said...

The more your faith has something solid to stand on.

You begin learning His promises.

His character.

His faithfulness.

His ways.

And when the storm comes...

You have something inside you besides fear.

You have truth.

STORE IT IN YOUR INVENTORY

There will be moments when you don't have time to open a Bible.

A temptation hits.

Fear hits.

Someone confronts you.

Something goes wrong.

Your thoughts begin spiraling.

The enemy whispers.

And suddenly...

A verse comes to mind.

Where did that come from?

You stored it.

David writes:

“I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you.”

—Psalm 119:11

Hidden in your heart.

Stored.

Available.

Ready.

Remember Jesus in the wilderness?

Satan tempted Him...

And Jesus answered:

“It is written.”

He knew the Word.

The truth was already there when the battle came.

INVENTORY UPDATE

ITEM ACQUIRED: Truth

LOCATION: Heart

ACCESS: Immediate

USES: Guidance • Discernment • Resistance • Encouragement • Correction

CAPACITY: Expandable

MEDITATION ISN'T EMPTYING YOUR MIND

Scripture talks repeatedly about meditation.

But biblical meditation isn't about making your mind empty.

It's about filling your mind with truth...

And staying with it long enough for it to sink in.

God told Joshua:

“Keep this Book of the Law always on your lips; meditate on it day and night...”

—Joshua 1:8

The first Psalm describes the person whose:

“delight is in the law of the LORD, and who meditates on his law day and night.”

—Psalm 1:2

Meditation is when you stop merely reading words...

And begin thinking about them.

What does this mean?

What does this show me about God?

What does this reveal about me?

Where am I not living this?

How does this connect with something else I've read?

Holy Spirit, teach me.

You chew on truth.

And that's an appropriate metaphor.

Because you don't swallow an entire meal without chewing.

You take it in.

Slowly.

THE TREE

Psalm 1 tells you what happens to someone who continually feeds on God's truth.

That person is:

“like a tree planted by streams of water...”

—Psalm 1:3

Picture it.

Heat comes.

The tree remains.

Wind comes.

The tree bends...

But stays rooted.

Why?

Its life isn't dependent only on what's happening above ground.

Its roots have reached the water.

And then Scripture says the tree:

“yields its fruit in season.”

Notice:

in season.

Growth takes time.

Fruit takes time.

Roots grow where nobody can see them.

For a while...

It may look like nothing is happening.

But underground...

the tree is becoming harder to move.

That's what happens when you continually feed on truth.

MILK DOESN'T STAY MILK FOREVER

But God doesn't intend for you to remain spiritually newborn forever.

Babies drink milk.

Adults eat solid food.

The writer of Hebrews tells believers:

“Solid food is for the mature, who by constant use have trained themselves to distinguish good from evil.”

—Hebrews 5:14

Look at those words:

CONSTANT USE.

TRAINED.

That's how discernment develops.

Not instantly.

Through practice.

You read.

You learn.

You apply.

You make mistakes.

You return.

You understand more.

You obey.

You encounter another situation.

You apply truth again.

And slowly...

Your spiritual reflexes change.

You begin recognizing deception faster.

You recognize temptation earlier.

You notice your own motives more quickly.

You recognize God's character more clearly.

You're growing.

DON'T JUST CONSUME—OBEY

But there's another danger.

You can know a lot of Scripture...

And still resist what God is telling you to do.

Remember James and the mirror?

Looking isn't enough.

Once the Word shows you something...

you respond.

Jesus said:

“If you love me, keep my commands.”

—John 14:15

But be careful here.

This does **not** mean:

Now that God saved me, I need to become strong enough to obey Him by myself.

That would take you right back to trying to navigate independently.

Remember the cockpit.

The Air Traffic Controller can see what you can't.

He gives you direction.

But you can still grab the controls and insist:

I know where I'm going.

That's what happens when your flesh insists on having control.

YOUR OLD PATTERNS STILL WANT THE CONTROLS

You've been born again.

The Holy Spirit lives within you.

But you still live in a body with desires and patterns that don't always want what God wants.

Scripture calls this conflict between...

the flesh and the Spirit.

Paul writes:

“For the flesh desires what is contrary to the Spirit, and the Spirit what is contrary to the flesh.”

—Galatians 5:17

So when you know what God says...

But something inside you screams:

I DON'T WANT TO.

Or:

I WANT THIS ANYWAY.

Or:

I KNOW IT'S WRONG, BUT I DON'T WANT TO GIVE IT UP.

You're encountering that conflict.

The old way wants the controls.

Anger says:

Let me fly.

Fear says:

Let me fly.

Lust says:

Let me fly.

Pride says:

Let me fly.

Bitterness says:

Let me fly.

The need for control says:

Move over. I know what I'm doing.

And every time you choose to navigate independently of God...

You're doing exactly what humanity did in the beginning.

Trusting your own limited vision over the One who sees the entire map.

YOU DON'T HAVE TO FIGHT ALONE

But here's what changes everything:

The Holy Spirit is already within you.

You're not standing outside the cockpit screaming instructions toward a distant God.

You're not being told:

Here's the rule. Good luck. Try harder.

God gave you Himself.

Paul says:

“Walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh.”

—Galatians 5:16

And:

“If by the Spirit you put to death the misdeeds of the body, you will live.”

—Romans 8:13

Notice what it doesn't say.

Defeat your flesh by your own strength.

It says:

“by the Spirit.”

The Holy Spirit helps you do what you could not do by yourself.

So when temptation comes...

bring Him into it.

When anger rises...

bring Him into it.

When fear takes over...

bring Him into it.

When an old desire comes roaring back...

bring Him into it.

Instead of simply clenching your teeth and saying:

I will not do this.

You can pray:

Holy Spirit, I don't want this desire anymore.

Take it away from me.

Give me Your desires instead.

Show me why I keep reaching for this.

Heal whatever in me needs healing.

Take away the fear underneath this.

Take away the anger.

Help me forgive.

Help me surrender control.

Give me the strength to obey You right now.

I can't overcome this in my own strength. I'm trusting You.

That's not weakness.

That's dependence.

And dependence was the design all along.

SOMETIMES THE BATTLE IS DEEPER THAN THE BEHAVIOR

You may discover that what looks like one problem on the surface...

Has roots underneath it.

Maybe anger is covering fear.

Maybe control is covering insecurity.

Maybe bitterness is protecting an old wound.

Maybe a destructive habit has become a place you run for comfort.

Maybe you're trying to satisfy with something temporary...

A hunger only God can satisfy.

So don't only pray:

God, stop me from doing this behavior.

You can also ask:

God, show me what's underneath it.

Heal what needs healing.

Expose what I'm believing that isn't true.

Show me where I'm afraid.

Show me what I'm trying to control.

Show me what I'm trying to get from this that I should be receiving from You.

Then let the Word expose the lie...

And let the Spirit lead you into truth.

This is why transformation goes deeper than behavior modification.

God isn't merely trimming bad fruit off a tree.

He's working at the roots.

SOMETIMES GOD CHANGES THE DESIRE

And something beautiful can happen as you continue walking with Him.

The thing you once had to fight desperately...

May begin losing its appeal.

The temptation that once screamed...

May become quieter.

Something you once thought you could never surrender...

You suddenly realize you don't even want anymore.

God can change your desires.

Remember:

“For it is God who works in you to will and to act in order to fulfill his good purpose.”
—Philippians 2:13

He works in you...

to will.

And...

to act.

He can work on the behavior.

But He can also work on the **want.**

So ask Him.

Change what I want.

Make me want what You want.

Make me hate what is destroying me.

Give me an appetite for what gives life.

This is not merely learning to control the old character better.

The Creator is transforming you from within.

BUT YOU STILL HAVE TO YIELD

The Holy Spirit empowers you...

But He doesn't make obedience meaningless.

When He shows you the exit...

take it.

When Scripture tells you to forgive...

Forgive.

When He convicts you to apologize...

Apologize.

When something needs to leave your life...

Remove it.

When you need to flee temptation...

Flee.

When you need help...

Ask for help.

Paul writes:

“No temptation has overtaken you except what is common to mankind. And God is faithful... when you are tempted, he will also provide a way out so that you can endure it.”

— 1 Corinthians 10:13

Sometimes the Spirit's answer to your prayer:

Take this temptation away

may be...

There's the exit. Take it.

Delete it.

Leave.

Turn it off.

Tell someone.

Stop going there.

Put distance between yourself and the temptation.

Forgive.

Confess.

Ask for help.

Obedience and dependence aren't opposites.

Obedience is what dependence looks like when God gives you the next instruction.

STOP GRABBING THE CONTROLS

Remember Quest 10.

The issue isn't whether the Controller knows the route.

He does.

The issue is whether you'll trust Him enough to follow His direction when what He says conflicts with what you currently want.

Your flesh says:

MY WAY.

The Spirit says:

FOLLOW ME.

And Paul gives you the navigation instruction:

“Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit.”
—Galatians 5:25

You don't need to fly the entire route yourself.

You need to listen...

Trust...

Yield...

And take the next instruction.

And when you fail?

Don't run from Him.

Run to Him.

Bring the failure into the light.

Ask forgiveness.

Ask what happened.

Ask Him to show you the lie you believed.

Ask Him to strengthen you where you're weak.

Then get back up...

And keep walking.

Because the One teaching you to obey...

is the same One living within you.

YOUR TASTE CAN CHANGE

Here's something interesting about food.

What you continually eat can affect what you crave.

If you're constantly feeding your mind on noise...

Silence can feel uncomfortable.

If you're constantly consuming stimulation...

Stillness can feel boring.

If you're constantly absorbing the world's values...

God's values may initially feel strange.

But something begins changing as you feed on truth.

You begin wanting more.

Peter doesn't merely say:

Drink spiritual milk.

He says:

“Crave pure spiritual milk...”

— 1 Peter 2:2

Crave it.

Eventually you may find yourself wanting Scripture.

Thinking about it.

Wondering what something means.

Seeing connections.

Opening it because you actually want to know what God says.

The Walkthrough stops feeling like homework.

It becomes...

food.

ASK HIM TO MAKE YOU HUNGRY

But what if you don't crave it yet?

What if you read:

“Crave pure spiritual milk...”

— 1 Peter 2:2

And think:

But I don't.

Then tell God.

Seriously.

You don't have to pretend with the One who already knows every thought in your mind.

Pray:

God, make me hungry for You.

Give me a hunger for Your Word.

Help me want truth more than distraction.

Open my eyes.

Give me understanding.

Teach me.

Help me know You.

That's a prayer you can keep praying.

Because remember...

You're not trying to transform yourself without Him.

He is the One transforming you.

Paul says:

“For it is God who works in you to will and to act in order to fulfill his good purpose.”

—Philippians 2:13

Did you catch the first part?

God works in you...

“to will.”

Even the **desire** to follow Him is something God can work within you.

So if your appetite isn't there yet...

ask Him to change your appetite.

ASK HIM TO HELP YOU UNDERSTAND

And you can ask for understanding too.

You don't have to approach Scripture thinking:

I have to figure all of this out by myself.

Remember who your Teacher is.

The Holy Spirit.

Before Jesus opened the Scriptures to His disciples, Luke tells us:

“Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures.”

—Luke 24:45

That's an incredible prayer to bring to your Bible:

Jesus, open my mind so I can understand Your Word.

The Psalmist prayed something similar:

“Open my eyes that I may see wonderful things in your law.”

—Psalm 119:18

And James tells you:

“If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault...”

—James 1:5

So ask.

Before you read...

Holy Spirit, teach me.

When you don't understand...

Give me understanding.

When you're distracted...

Help me focus.

When you don't want to read...

Make me hungry.

When something confronts you...

Help me receive the truth.

When something confuses you...

Show me what I need to understand—and help me keep going when I'm not ready to understand it yet.

This is relationship.

You're not studying for an exam while the Teacher waits outside the room.

The Teacher is with you.

And something may begin happening.

At first...

You read because you decided to.

Then you begin becoming curious.

Then you start asking questions.

Then you notice connections.

Then a passage suddenly opens up.

Then you find yourself thinking about something you read hours earlier.

Then you want to know what happens next.

Then you want to understand another passage.

Then another.

And one day you realize...

I'm hungry.

You asked God to change your appetite.

And somewhere along the way...

He did.

WHAT IF I MISS A DAY?

Don't turn this into another religious scoreboard.

READ BIBLE: +10 POINTS

MISSED TUESDAY: GOD DISAPPOINTED

That's not relationship.

Remember Quest 10.

You're CONNECTED.

God isn't leaving because you missed your reading plan.

This isn't about earning His presence.

His Spirit already dwells within you.

You read because you're alive.

You eat because you're hungry.

You return because you want to know Him.

If you miss a day...

Open it again.

If you've missed a month...

Open it again.

If you haven't opened a Bible in years...

Open it.

The objective isn't maintaining a perfect streak.

The objective is...

growth.

MAKE IT PART OF YOUR LIFE

You don't need a complicated system.

Start somewhere.

Read.

Ask questions.

Think.

Pray.

Come back tomorrow.

Some days...

Read several chapters and follow the story.

Other days...

One paragraph may stop you.

Stay there.

Ask:

Holy Spirit, what are You teaching me?

Look at the context.

Compare Scripture with Scripture.

Write something down.

Memorize a verse.

Talk about it with another believer.

Then...

Live it.

Remember Quest 11:

Read the entire Walkthrough.

Get the big picture.

Then start again.

But along the way...

feed.

Don't race through Scripture merely to say you finished it.

Let it enter you.

DAILY BREAD

There's a reason Jesus taught His disciples to pray:

“Give us today our daily bread.”

—Matthew 6:11

Physical bread reminds you of dependence.

You don't store one meal in your body and declare:

I'm set for life.

You return.

Again.

And again.

And again.

Your relationship with God is like that.

Not because your connection disappears...

But because relationship is living.

You keep coming.

Listening.

Learning.

Receiving.

Responding.

Growing.

TEACHER: Holy Spirit

QUEST COMPLETE

You were born again.

But birth was never the finish line.

It was the beginning.

Your new life needs nourishment.

Jesus is the Bread of Life.

Scripture reveals Him.

The Holy Spirit teaches you.

And as you continually take God's truth into your life...

Something begins happening.

Your mind changes.

Your perspective changes.

Your desires begin changing.

Your faith grows.

Your discernment strengthens.

Your roots deepen.

The lies you've believed begin losing their power.

You're being transformed.

You're becoming more like Jesus.

Time to level up.

—Matthew 14:29

One word.

That's all Peter had.

Now look at the available information.

PLAYER DATA

WIND: Strong

WAVES: Dangerous

WATER: Cannot support human weight

BOAT: Familiar

JESUS: Standing on water

INSTRUCTION: COME

Everything Peter could see said:

STAY IN THE BOAT.

Jesus said:

COME.

Peter had to decide...

Which source...

He trusted more.

What he could see...

Or the One...

Calling him.

Peter stepped out.

And walked...

On water.

Toward Jesus.

Then something changed.

Scripture says:

“But when he saw the wind, he was afraid...”

—Matthew 14:30

When he saw...

Don't miss that.

The wind...

Was already there.

The waves...

Were already there.

The storm...

Was already there.

Peter didn't suddenly enter...

A different environment.

What changed?

His focus.

Jesus had said:

COME.

The storm said:

IMPOSSIBLE.

And Peter began navigating...

By what he could see.

Fear took over.

And he began...

To sink.

Then Peter cried:

“Lord, save me!”

—Matthew 14:30

And Scripture says:

“Immediately Jesus reached out his hand and caught him.”

—Matthew 14:31

Immediately.

Peter's faith...

Faltered.

Jesus didn't disappear.

Peter became afraid.

Jesus didn't abandon him.

Peter started sinking.

Jesus...

Reached.

That's important.

Because following God...

Is not learning...

How to perform perfectly...

So He will stay near you.

It's learning...

To live...

In relationship...

With the One...

Who already is.

And something was about to happen...

That would make that relationship...

Even more extraordinary.

SOMETHING WAS ABOUT TO CHANGE

Before Jesus went to the cross...

He told His disciples:

“I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever—the Spirit of truth.”

—John 14:16–17

Then He said:

“You know him, for he lives with you and will be in you.”

—John 14:17

Stop there.

WITH YOU.

And then...

IN YOU.

Until now...

You've learned that God...

Created you.

Knows you.

Loves you.

Came looking for you.

Rescued you.

But being born from above...

Doesn't mean God simply...

The Creator...

Comes...

To dwell...

Becomes clear.

You aren't merely...

Alive.

CONNECTED.

Scripture says:

“Whoever is united with the Lord is one with him in spirit.”

The relationship...

That was broken...

In Eden...

Has been restored...

Through Jesus.

And now...

The Spirit of God...

Dwells...

Within His people.

Not because you become...

God.

You don't.

You remain...

You.

Your personality.

Your memories.

Your gifts.

Your questions.

Your voice.

Your individuality.

But you are no longer...

Living...

Alone.

The Creator...

Isn't merely...

Watching...

From Heaven.

His Spirit...

Dwells...

Within you.

CONNECTED

Think about what that means.

You were created...

To know God.

Not merely...

Know facts...

About Him.

Not merely...

Memorize...

Information...

About Him.

Not merely...

Believe...

That He exists.

You were created...

For...

relationship.

Communion.

Trust.

Dependence.

Life...

With Him.

And this changes...

The way you navigate...

Everything.

Because you were never...

Supposed...

To know...

Everything.

You were created...

To know...

THE ONE WHO DOES.

You were never...

Supposed...

To possess...

Unlimited wisdom.

You were created...

To walk...

With...

THE ONE WHO DOES.

You were never...

Supposed...

To become...

So strong...

That eventually...

You wouldn't need...

Your Creator.

You were created...

To receive...

Life...

Wisdom...

Counsel...

Strength...

Truth...

And love...

From Him.

That's...

CONNECTED.

SOMETIMES YOU CAN'T SEE THE PROVISION

A widow living in Zarephath...

Once faced...

An impossible situation.

A famine...

Had devastated...

The land.

She had...

Almost nothing...

Left.

She told Elijah:

“I have only a handful of flour in a jar and a little olive oil in a jug.”

— 1 Kings 17:12

Enough...

For one last meal.

Then...

She expected...

She and her son...

Would die.

That's what...

She could see.

HER SCREEN

FLOUR: Almost Gone

OIL: Almost Gone

FAMINE: Continuing

VISIBLE PROVISION: None

FUTURE: Hopeless

But God...

Saw...

What she couldn't.

Through Elijah...

He promised:

“The jar of flour will not be used up and the jug of oil will not run dry...”

— 1 Kings 17:14

She trusted...

And obeyed.

And:

“The jar of flour was not used up and the jug of oil did not run dry...”

— 1 Kings 17:16

She could see...

One meal.

God could see...

the entire famine.

That's one of the reasons...

Relationship with God...

Changes...

The way you live.

You don't know...

Everything.

He does.

You don't see...

Everything.

He does.

You don't know...

What tomorrow...

Will bring.

He does.

You don't know...

Every consequence...

Of every decision.

He does.

And you were never...

Supposed to.

Maybe one of the greatest...

Spiritual realizations...

Is this:

Your limitation...

Isn't...

A design flaw.

You're a creature.

Not...

The Creator.

You weren't designed...

To carry...

The knowledge...

Of the entire universe.

You were designed...

To walk...

With...

The One...

Who does.

SOMETIMES GOD SHOWS YOU

Remember Elisha's servant?

He looked outside...

And saw...

An enemy army...

Surrounding them.

From his perspective...

They were trapped.

Outnumbered.

Finished.

Then Elisha prayed:

“Open his eyes, LORD, so that he may see.”

—2 Kings 6:17

And suddenly...

The servant saw...

The hills...

Filled...

With horses...

And chariots...

Of fire.

The invisible reality...

Had been there...

The entire time.

He just...

Couldn't see it.

Sometimes...

God does that.

Something becomes...

Clear.

A Scripture...

Suddenly makes sense.

A door opens.

A prayer...

Is answered.

A pattern...

Appears.

You look backward...

And finally realize:

THAT'S WHAT GOD WAS DOING.

But sometimes...

He doesn't show you.

Sometimes...

The storm...

Still looks...

Like a storm.

Sometimes...

The jar...

Still looks...

Almost empty.

Sometimes...

The enemy...

Still looks...

Enormous.

Sometimes...

The road ahead...

Makes...

Absolutely...

No sense.

And in those moments...

Faith says:

I DON'T SEE...

WHAT YOU SEE.

BUT I KNOW...

WHO YOU ARE.

SO I TRUST YOU.

Notice that.

Faith isn't merely:

I believe something good will happen.

It's deeper.

I know...

who You are.

That's relationship.

The more...

You know...

Someone...

The more you know...

Whether they can...

Be trusted.

And the more...

You know God...

His character.

His goodness.

His wisdom.

His faithfulness.

His love.

The more you can say:

I DON'T UNDERSTAND...

WHAT YOU'RE DOING.

BUT I KNOW YOU.

SO I TRUST YOU.

LEARNING THE SHEPHERD'S VOICE

But how do you know...

What God is saying?

Jesus gives...

Another picture.

Sheep.

A Shepherd.

He says:

“My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me.”

—John 10:27

Look at the relationship.

They listen.

He knows them.

They follow.

This isn't a picture...

Of strangers...

Exchanging...

Information.

The Shepherd...

Knows...

The sheep.

And the sheep...

Learn...

The Shepherd.

Think about someone...

You know...

Really well.

They call you...

From an unfamiliar number.

You answer.

They say...

A few words.

And immediately...

You know...

Who it is.

Why?

Relationship...

creates recognition.

You know...

The voice.

The tone.

The character.

The way...

They speak.

And spiritually...

You're learning...

The Shepherd's voice.

The Holy Spirit may...

Convict you.

Remind you...

Of Scripture.

Bring someone...

Strongly...

To mind...

To pray for.

Prompt you...

To speak.

Stay silent.

Go.

Wait.

Give.

Forgive.

Call.

Help.

Walk away.

Stay.

But remember...

Not every thought...

Is God's voice.

Not every feeling...

Is God's direction.

Not every impulse...

Is the Holy Spirit.

Not every open door...

Means...

GO.

So how do you learn...

To recognize...

The signal?

You get to know...

The One...

Speaking.

And you test...

What you think...

You're hearing...

Against...

What He has...

Already revealed...

In His Word.

God will not...

Guide you...

To become...

Less like...

Jesus.

He will not...

Contradict...

His own character.

That's why...

Knowing Scripture...

Matters so much.

The more...

You know...

The Creator's Word...

The more...

You know...

His character.

And the more...

You know...

His character...

The easier...

It becomes...

To recognize...

What doesn't sound...

Like Him.

PRAYER IS COMMUNION

Prayer isn't...

Uploading information...

To God.

He already...

Knows.

Jesus said:

“Your Father knows what you need before you ask him.”

—Matthew 6:8

So why pray?

Because prayer...

Isn't merely...

Information transfer.

It's...

relationship.

communion.

You talk...

To Him.

Praise Him.

Thank Him.

Ask Him.

Confess.

Listen.

Bring Him...

Your questions.

Your fear.

Your anger.

Your hopes.

Your confusion.

Your decisions.

Your pain.

Prayer means...

You stop living...

As though...

Every problem...

Has to remain...

Locked...

Inside...

Your own head.

You bring...

Your life...

Into...

The relationship.

Maybe you need...

Wisdom.

Ask Him.

Scripture says:

“If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God...”

—James 1:5

You need...

Direction?

Ask.

Strength?

Ask.

Courage?

Ask.

Understanding?

Ask.

Peace?

Ask.

Help?

Ask.

Sometimes...

Prayer...

Is beautiful.

Sometimes...

Prayer...

Is messy.

Sometimes...

It's long.

Sometimes...

It's...

One sentence.

GOD...

HELP ME.

And sometimes...

You don't even know...

What to say.

But even there...

You're not alone.

Scripture says:

“The Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans.”

—Romans 8:26

Think about that.

The Holy Spirit...

Doesn't merely...

Observe your prayer...

From far away.

He helps...

You pray...

From...

within.

That's...

Connected.

KEEP IN STEP

Paul describes...

The life...

Of someone...

Born from above...

This way:

“Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit.”

—Galatians 5:25

Notice...

The order.

LIVE...

By the Spirit.

Then...

KEEP IN STEP...

With the Spirit.

Life...

First.

Walking...

Second.

You don't walk...

In order...

To become alive.

You walk...

Because you...

Have been...

Made alive.

Now...

You are learning...

How to live...

From that...

New reality.

Step...

By step.

Not:

God, give me the entire map...

Before I move.

Sometimes...

He gives...

One instruction.

Come.

One step.

Then another.

Then another.

And that's difficult...

Because your instinct...

May be:

I WANT TO KNOW...

EVERYTHING FIRST.

Where is this going?

What happens next?

What if...

I make the wrong decision?

What will...

This cost me?

How will...

This end?

But relationship...

Changes the question.

Instead of:

DO I KNOW...

THE WHOLE MAP?

You begin asking:

DO I KNOW...

THE ONE...

I'M WALKING WITH?

YOU DON'T NEED THE WHOLE MAP

Maybe you've been...

Trying to make...

Every decision...

Like this:

Collect...

Enough information.

Analyze...

Every possibility.

Predict...

Every outcome.

Control...

Every variable.

Then...

Move.

But life...

Doesn't work...

Like that.

There will always...

Be variables...

You can't see.

Information...

You don't have.

Outcomes...

You can't predict.

People...

You can't control.

Events...

You didn't expect.

And maybe...

That's intentional.

Because you were never...

Supposed to navigate...

Reality...

As though...

You were...

The Creator.

You were created...

To know...

the Creator.

And sometimes...

He gives...

Enough light...

For the next step.

Not...

The next hundred.

You may ask:

God...

Where is this going?

And His answer...

May simply be:

FOLLOW ME.

Because the objective...

Isn't merely...

Getting you...

To a destination.

It's teaching you...

To walk...

with Him.

STOP TRYING TO BE THE POWER SOURCE

There's another habit...

You may need...

To unlearn.

For most of your life...

You may have assumed...

The goal...

Was becoming...

Strong enough...

Smart enough...

Capable enough...

Disciplined enough...

Independent enough...

To handle...

Life...

By yourself.

And maybe...

You even brought...

That same idea...

Into your relationship...

With God.

God...

Give me enough...

Wisdom...

So eventually...

I won't need...

To ask You.

Give me enough...

Strength...

So eventually...

I won't need...

To depend...

On You.

Give me enough...

Understanding...

So eventually...

I can navigate...

Everything...

Myself.

But what if...

The goal...

Was never...

Independence?

Jesus gives...

A completely different...

Picture:

“I am the vine; you are the branches...”

—John 15:5

A branch...

Doesn't become...

More mature...

By disconnecting...

From the vine.

It becomes...

More fruitful...

By remaining...

Connected.

Jesus continues:

“Apart from me you can do nothing.”

Not:

Apart from Me...

you'll have a harder time.

He says:

Nothing.

Because you were never...

Supposed to be...

The Source.

You're...

The branch.

He...

Is the Vine.

Paul gives...

Another image:

“But we have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us.”

—2 Corinthians 4:7

You...

Are the jar.

He...

Is the treasure.

You remain...

You.

But now...

You don't have to pretend...

That everything...

You need...

Must originate...

From you.

Maybe you've spent...

Your whole life...

Asking God...

To give you...

Enough wisdom...

Enough strength...

Enough peace...

Enough understanding...

Enough power...

To successfully...

Do life.

And then...

You discover...

Something much bigger.

HE INTENDED...

TO GIVE YOU...

HIMSELF.

THE SPIRIT WITHIN YOU

Remember...

John 14:17.

“He lives with you and will be in you.”

And Isaiah describes...

The Spirit of the LORD...

As:

**“the Spirit of wisdom and of understanding,
the Spirit of counsel and of might,
the Spirit of the knowledge and fear of the LORD.”**

—Isaiah 11:2

Wisdom.

Understanding.

Counsel.

Might.

Knowledge.

Maybe you don't...

Know...

What to do.

But you know...

the Spirit of wisdom.

Maybe you don't...

Understand.

But you know...

the Spirit of understanding.

Maybe you're not sure...

Which way...

To go.

But you know...

the Spirit of counsel.

Maybe you feel...

Weak.

But you know...

the Spirit of might.

You don't have...

To become...

Omniscient.

You know...

THE ONE WHO IS.

You don't have...

To become...

Omnipotent.

You know...

THE ONE WHO IS.

You don't have...

To see...

The entire map.

You're learning...

To walk...

With...

THE ONE WHO DOES.

That's...

Connected.

AND YES...

YOU WILL FORGET

Sometimes...

You'll still...

Grab...

The controls.

You'll start...

Trying...

To figure...

Everything out...

Alone.

You'll worry.

Control.

Overthink.

Push.

Try harder.

You'll forget...

For a moment...

That you were never...

Supposed...

To carry...

Everything...

By yourself.

And eventually...

You'll remember.

WAIT.

I'M NOT ALONE.

You'll pray.

Ask.

Listen.

Return...

Your attention...

To the One...

Walking...

With you.

And there's going...

To be much more...

To learn...

About those moments.

About old reactions.

New choices.

Failure.

Growth.

Transformation.

Becoming...

More like...

But that's coming...

Later.

For now...

That's not an accident.

David says:

Knit together.

He writes:

“There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them.”

— 1 Corinthians 12:4

Different gifts.

Same Spirit.

Then:

“There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord.”

— 1 Corinthians 12:5

Different service.

Same Lord.

And:

“There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work.”

— 1 Corinthians 12:6

Different workings.

Same God.

The Kingdom isn't a factory producing identical players.

It's a body.

And a body only works because its parts are...

different.

THE EYE ISN'T THE HAND

Paul asks:

“If the whole body were an eye, where would the sense of hearing be?”

— 1 Corinthians 12:17

Imagine it.

One gigantic eye.

Impressive?

Maybe.

Useful?

Not really.

No hands.

No feet.

No ears.

No lungs.

No heart.

A body works because the parts aren't identical.

The hand doesn't need to become the eye.

The eye doesn't need to become the foot.

The foot doesn't need to become the mouth.

And you don't need to become...

another player.

Paul says:

“God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be.”

— 1 Corinthians 12:18

So don't spend the mission staring at someone else's build.

There is something the Creator wants to do...

through yours.

SO WHAT ARE THE GIFTS?

Paul gives several lists across the New Testament.

And they're not all identical.

In 1 Corinthians 12, he mentions manifestations such as:

Wisdom.

Knowledge.

Faith.

Gifts of healing.

Miraculous powers.

Prophecy.

Discernment of spirits.

Different kinds of tongues.

Interpretation of tongues.

Elsewhere Scripture speaks of...

Serving.

Teaching.

Encouraging.

Giving.

Leadership.

Mercy.

And other roles God gives His people for building up the body.

The point isn't merely to create a master inventory screen.

The point is:

God equips His people.

You weren't sent into the mission...

empty-handed.

THE SPIRIT GIVES...

AND YOU ARE TOLD TO SEEK

So how does this work?

Does God choose the gifts?

Do you desire them?

Do you ask?

Do you just wait?

Scripture gives you both sides.

First:

“All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, and he distributes them to each one, just as he determines.”

— 1 Corinthians 12:11

The gifts come from...

the Holy Spirit.

He is the Source.

He knows every player.

He knows the whole body.

He knows every assignment.

He knows what His people need.

He knows what you need.

He knows what He's preparing you for.

And He distributes according to His wisdom.

But that does **not** mean you are supposed to be passive.

Paul also says:

“Now eagerly desire the greater gifts.”

— 1 Corinthians 12:31

And then:

“Follow the way of love and eagerly desire gifts of the Spirit, especially prophecy.”

— 1 Corinthians 14:1

So Scripture gives you both:

THE SPIRIT DISTRIBUTES

AND

YOU EAGERLY DESIRE

Those aren't contradictions.

They're relationship.

You don't manufacture a spiritual gift.

You don't control the Holy Spirit.

You don't demand that God conform to your build specifications.

But you also don't sit back and say:

Whatever.

Paul says:

Eagerly desire.

Be hungry for what God wants to give.

Ask.

Seek.

Be available.

Pray:

Holy Spirit, equip me.

I desire Your gifts.

Give me whatever You want me to have.

Teach me how to use what You give me.

Use me however You choose.

That's not controlling God.

That's opening your hands.

LOVE FIRST

But notice Paul's order:

“Follow the way of love and eagerly desire gifts of the Spirit...”

He doesn't say:

CHASE POWER.

He says:

PURSUE LOVE.

And...

DESIRE GIFTS.

That's exactly why you had to complete the last Quest first.

Character before platform.

Love before power.

Christlikeness before recognition.

Because gifts without love can become dangerous.

Paul says:

“If I have a faith that can move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing.”

— 1 Corinthians 13:2

Think about that.

Move mountains.

And still...

nothing.

Why?

Because the objective was never merely power.

The objective has always been...

Jesus.

And Jesus loves.

GIFTS ARE NOT THE SAME AS FRUIT

This distinction matters.

FRUIT

Shows...

who you are becoming.

GIFTS

Help accomplish...

what God is calling you to do.

Fruit is character.

Gifts are equipment.

Fruit shows Christ being formed in you.

Gifts allow the Spirit to work through you for others.

That means someone can be highly gifted...

And still be immature.

Someone can speak powerfully.

Teach brilliantly.

Lead thousands.

Possess enormous knowledge.

Even demonstrate remarkable spiritual gifts...

And still need growth in...

Humility.

Patience.

Gentleness.

Self-control.

Love.

Never mistake...

giftedness

for...

maturity.

The most impressive build isn't necessarily the most mature player.

Look for...

fruit.

WHY WOULD YOU WANT THE GIFTS?

Because people need help.

That's the point.

Paul says:

“Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good.”

— 1 Corinthians 12:7

For the common good.

Not:

For your ego.

For your reputation.

For your platform.

For your brand.

For everyone to think you're powerful.

The Spirit gives...

So others can receive.

Peter says:

“Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others...”

— 1 Peter 4:10

There it is again.

Serve.

Quest 13 taught you the Kingdom's definition of greatness.

Now you discover that spiritual gifts operate by the same rule.

God gives to you...

so He can give...

through you.

ESPECIALLY PROPHECY

Paul doesn't tell believers merely to desire gifts generally.

He says:

“Eagerly desire gifts of the Spirit, especially prophecy.”

— 1 Corinthians 14:1

And later:

“Be eager to prophesy...”

— 1 Corinthians 14:39

Why does Paul especially emphasize prophecy?

He explains:

“The one who prophesies speaks to people for their strengthening, encouraging and comfort.”

— 1 Corinthians 14:3

There it is again.

The gift moves...

outward.

Strengthening.

Encouraging.

Comforting.

Building someone else up.

So don't be afraid to pray:

Holy Spirit, if You want me to prophesy, teach me.

If You want to give me wisdom, give me wisdom.

If You want to give gifts of healing, use me to bring healing.

If You want to give me discernment, teach me to discern.

Give me whatever will help me serve Your people and accomplish Your purposes.

Ask boldly.

Desire eagerly.

And then...

Leave the distribution to Him.

GIFTS MUST BE TESTED

But spiritual gifts aren't an excuse to become careless.

Especially with statements like:

GOD TOLD ME.

Remember **Eyes Opened?**

Not every thought is God.

Not every feeling is God.

Not every impression is God.

Not every spiritual-sounding message is God.

Paul tells the church:

“Two or three prophets should speak, and the others should weigh carefully what is said.”

— 1 Corinthians 14:29

And Scripture says:

“Do not treat prophecies with contempt but test them all; hold on to what is good.”

— 1 Thessalonians 5:20–21

So the biblical response isn't:

Reject everything supernatural.

And it isn't:

Believe everything supernatural.

It's:

Test the signal.

Does it agree with Scripture?

Does it point toward Jesus?

Does it reflect God's character?

Does it produce good fruit?

Does it build up rather than manipulate?

Is it being used in humility?

The Holy Spirit is...

the Spirit of truth.

He will not contradict Himself.

DESIRE...

WITHOUT ENVY

There is a difference between eagerly desiring gifts...

And envying another player's build.

Desire says:

Holy Spirit, I want everything You want to give me.

Envy says:

Why did THEY get that?

Desire looks toward God.

Envy keeps staring at another player's screen.

So...

Ask boldly.

Desire eagerly.

Receive gratefully.

Use faithfully.

And trust the Spirit with the distribution.

YOUR BUILD IS BIGGER THAN A GIFT LIST

But don't reduce your entire calling to figuring out which box you check on a spiritual-gifts test.

God can use...

Your personality.

Your natural abilities.

Your education.

Your occupation.

Your relationships.

Your resources.

Your creativity.

Your life experiences.

Your understanding.

Your opportunities.

Your suffering.

Your failures.

Your victories.

Your testimony.

Your spiritual gifts.

Your entire surrendered life...

Can become part of the mission.

GOD CAN REDEEM YOUR HISTORY

Maybe you've walked through something painful.

Loss.

Failure.

Rejection.

Loneliness.

Fear.

A broken relationship.

A season when you made terrible choices.

Those things aren't automatically good simply because they happened.

But God is extraordinarily good at...

redemption.

Paul writes:

“In all things God works for the good of those who love him...”

—Romans 8:28

That doesn't mean everything that happened was good.

It means evil doesn't get the final word.

The place where you once desperately needed help...

May become the place where you recognize someone else's pain.

The lesson you learned the hard way...

May someday help someone else.

The place where God brought healing...

May become a place from which you serve.

Don't assume the broken pieces are useless.

Give them to the Creator.

He knows what redemption looks like.

YOU WERE CREATED FOR ASSIGNMENTS

Remember:

You aren't saved **by** good works.

You're saved...

for them.

Paul says:

“We are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.”

—Ephesians 2:10

Prepared...

in advance.

Think about that.

There are assignments on the map...

That you haven't reached yet.

People you haven't met.

Conversations you haven't had.

Needs you haven't seen.

Doors that haven't opened.

Places you haven't gone.

And the Creator already sees...

the entire map.

Remember the Air Traffic Controller?

You see your current coordinates.

He sees...

the intersections.

CALLING OFTEN STARTS SMALL

Maybe you're expecting your calling to arrive with dramatic music.

Lightning.

A vision.

A giant message across the sky:

YOUR DESTINY HAS BEEN UNLOCKED

Maybe God will make something unmistakably clear.

He can.

But often...

Calling begins with whatever is directly in front of you.

Someone needs help.

Help.

Someone needs encouragement.

Encourage.

Someone asks a question you can answer.

Answer.

Someone is hurting.

Listen.

Someone needs prayer.

Pray.

You notice a need nobody else seems to notice.

Respond.

You're given a small responsibility.

Be faithful.

Remember the Kingdom principle?

Faithful with little...

trusted with more.

Sometimes you discover your calling...

While you're already obeying.

STOP WAITING FOR THE PERFECT QUEST

You can become so obsessed with discovering your enormous destiny...

That you miss today's assignment.

What's my calling?

What's my purpose?

What am I supposed to do with my life?

Those are good questions.

But sometimes God's next answer is simply:

Love the person in front of you.

Serve where you are.

Tell the truth.

Help.

Pray.

Give.

Forgive.

Encourage.

Learn.

Obey.

The giant map is traveled...

one step at a time.

JESUS DIDN'T TRAIN SPECTATORS

Following Jesus was never meant to remain purely internal.

Jesus didn't gather disciples just so they could sit around...

Knowing more.

He taught them.

He formed them.

He gave them authority.

And then...

He sent them.

Matthew says:

“Jesus called his twelve disciples to him and gave them authority...”

—Matthew 10:1

Then Jesus told them:

“As you go, proclaim this message: ‘The kingdom of heaven has come near.’”

—Matthew 10:7

And then:

“Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse those who have leprosy, drive out demons.”

—Matthew 10:8

Then comes the principle behind the entire mission:

“Freely you have received; freely give.”

That's the Kingdom.

Receive.

Then...

give.

Jesus didn't train spectators.

He trained...

disciples.

And disciples follow the King into His mission.

THE POWER ISN'T YOURS

This is essential.

If God begins using you...

Never confuse His power with yours.

Peter and John were involved in the healing of a man who couldn't walk.

People stared at them.

Peter immediately said:

“Why do you stare at us as if by our own power or godliness we had made this man walk?”
— Acts 3:12

Exactly.

Not my power.

Not my greatness.

Not my godliness.

God.

You're not...

the Source.

YOU'RE THE LAMP...

NOT THE ELECTRICITY

Imagine a lamp plugged into electricity.

The lamp shines.

But imagine the lamp announcing:

LOOK HOW POWERFUL I AM.

Unplug it.

What happens?

Darkness.

The lamp carries the power.

It isn't...

the source of the power.

Jesus said:

“Apart from me you can do nothing.”
— John 15:5

So if God heals...

give God the glory.

If God gives you wisdom...

give God the glory.

If someone is encouraged through you...

give God the glory.

If someone hears the gospel through you...

give God the glory.

If God gives you a prophetic word that strengthens someone...

give God the glory.

You participate.

You obey.

You make yourself available.

But you never become...

the Source.

AUTHORITY WORKS UNDER AUTHORITY

Jesus gives His followers authority.

But Kingdom authority is...

delegated authority.

Remember the Roman centurion?

He understood authority because he described himself as:

“a man under authority.”

—Matthew 8:9

That's the pattern.

You operate under...

the King.

You don't become sovereign.

You don't command God.

You don't use Jesus' name like a magic spell.

You don't make yourself the center.

You follow.

You listen.

You obey.

You remain submitted.

The more God entrusts to you...

The more important humility becomes.

GIFTS BUILD THE BODY

Paul explains why God gives gifts and ministry roles:

“To equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up.”

—Ephesians 4:12

There's the objective.

Build the body.

Not:

Build your personal empire.

Build your reputation.

Build your following.

Make everyone dependent on you.

Prove you're special.

The gift should make...

the body stronger.

So here's a useful question:

Who is being helped by what God gave me?

Because if the only person your gift consistently elevates...

Is you...

Something has gone wrong.

SOME GIFTS ARE VISIBLE

Teaching can be visible.

Leadership can be visible.

Prophecy can be visible.

Healing can be dramatic.

Miracles can attract attention.

But don't confuse...

visibility

with...

importance.

A heart is hidden.

Try living without it.

Lungs are hidden.

Try living without them.

Much of what keeps a body alive happens...

where nobody applauds.

The same is true in God's Kingdom.

The person praying.

The person giving.

The person encouraging.

The person showing mercy.

The person quietly serving.

The person who notices the lonely person everyone else walked past.

The person faithfully helping behind the scenes.

Don't underestimate hidden assignments.

God doesn't.

MAYBE YOUR BUILD DOESN'T LOOK “SPIRITUAL”

Maybe you're good at...

Writing.

Building.

Organizing.

Designing.

Listening.

Teaching.

Hospitality.

Business.

Medicine.

Technology.

Music.

Creating.

Leading.

Solving problems.

Encouraging.

Giving.

Helping.

Some of these may overlap with spiritual gifts.

Some may be natural abilities surrendered to God.

But don't divide your life into:

SPIRITUAL

and...

EVERYTHING ELSE

If Jesus is Lord...

everything belongs to Him.

Paul says:

“Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord...”

—Colossians 3:23

Your workplace can become mission territory.

Your home.

Your classroom.

Your business.

Your art.

Your technology.

Your conversations.

Your resources.

Your ordinary Tuesday afternoon.

Your entire build can be...

surrendered to the King.

HOW DO I DISCOVER MY BUILD?

Start with the One who designed it.

ASK

Holy Spirit, how have You equipped me?

What gifts do You want me to desire?

What have You already placed in me that I haven't recognized?

What do You want to do through me?

Where do You want me to serve?

Then...

SEEK

Paul says eagerly desire the gifts.

So eagerly desire them.

Learn what Scripture says about them.

Pray.

Remain open.

Ask God to equip you.

Then...

SERVE

You often discover gifts...

in motion.

You may discover you're gifted at teaching...

When you begin helping someone understand.

You may discover mercy...

When hurting people continually find safety with you.

You may discover leadership...

When people naturally begin following your direction.

You may discover generosity...

When the Spirit repeatedly moves you to give.

You may discover gifts of the Spirit...

As you step out in faith and pray for people.

Then...

TEST

Don't assume every impression is God.

Bring everything back to Scripture.

Test.

Discern.

Remain teachable.

And then...

WATCH THE FRUIT

Who is helped?

Who is strengthened?

Who is encouraged?

Who is comforted?

Who is pointed toward Jesus?

Where does God seem repeatedly to work through you?

Pay attention.

Not so you can feel important.

So you can become...

more useful.

YOU DON'T HAVE TO BE FEARLESS FIRST

Maybe you think:

God can't use me.

I'm afraid.

I'm not qualified.

I don't know enough.

I'm not confident.

Good news.

Moses didn't feel qualified.

Jeremiah felt too young.

Gideon felt weak.

Peter sank.

The disciples became afraid.

God has a long history of using people who discover...

they aren't enough by themselves.

Paul records God's words:

“My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.”
—2 Corinthians 12:9

Your weakness doesn't automatically disqualify you.

Sometimes it teaches you...

where the power actually comes from.

THE HOLY SPIRIT EMPOWERS THE MISSION

Before Jesus' disciples carried the gospel outward...

Jesus told them to wait.

Why?

Because the mission required something they didn't possess on their own.

He said:

“You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses...”
—Acts 1:8

The mission isn't fueled merely by...

Personality.

Talent.

Education.

Charisma.

Strategy.

Confidence.

Those things can be useful.

But Jesus promised something greater:

the Holy Spirit.

The same Spirit who opened your eyes...

Who teaches you...

Who lives within you...

Who is transforming your character...

Also...

equips you for the mission.

GIFT PROTOCOL

PLAYER RESPONSE: Eagerly Desire

QUEST COMPLETE

You are not an accident.

You are not a mass-produced copy of another player.

The Creator designed you intentionally.

And when He gave you new life...

He didn't erase your individuality.

He redeemed it.

Your personality.

Your abilities.

Your experiences.

Your opportunities.

Your resources.

Your story.

And...

The Holy Spirit gives His people...

gifts.

So don't be afraid of them.

Scripture doesn't tell you to be afraid.

It tells you:

Eagerly desire.

Especially prophecy.

Ask.

Seek.

Remain open.

But remember the order:

LOVE...

then...

GIFTS.

And remember the purpose:

THE COMMON GOOD.

And remember the posture:

FREELY RECEIVE...

then...

FREELY GIVE.

If He gives you wisdom...

Serve.

If He gives you knowledge...

Serve.

If He gives you faith...

Serve.

If He gives gifts of healing...

Serve.

If He gives prophecy...

Serve.

If He gives discernment...

Serve.

If He gives leadership...

Serve.

If He gives generosity...

Serve.

Whatever He gives...

serve.

And when God works through you...

Never confuse the vessel with the Source.

Don't make people stare at the player.

Point them toward...

the King.

Because your build was never designed to make people say:

Look how powerful you are.

It was designed so that your life could say:

Look how good He is.

And there is one more thing.

A player entering a battle needs more than abilities.

You need to know what you've been given...

For defense.

For truth.

For resistance.

For the moments when the enemy attacks.

The King has already prepared equipment for that too.

It's time to open...

your inventory.

QUEST 15 — Equip Your Inventory

QUEST 15

GEAR UP

Objective

Discover the armor and weapons God has given you for the real battle—and learn how to actually equip and use them when the enemy attacks.

ENTER

You know there's an enemy.

You met him back in Quest 5.

You learned his favorite weapon.

DECEPTION.

You learned that the world you can see...

Isn't all there is.

You were born from above.

The Holy Spirit now lives within you.

Your eyes are being opened.

Your mind is being renewed.

Your character is being transformed.

Your abilities are being unlocked.

And now...

You're entering the mission.

But Jesus never told you the mission would be uncontested.

You're walking into...

a war.

Paul tells you:

“Our struggle is not against flesh and blood...”

—Ephesians 6:12

There is a battle behind the battle.

A war involving...

Truth and lies.

Faith and fear.

Obedience and temptation.

Hope and despair.

Freedom and bondage.

Light and darkness.

The visible...

And the unseen.

But the King doesn't send you onto the battlefield...

unarmed.

Paul says:

“Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes.”

—Ephesians 6:11

Notice the words:

PUT ON.

The armor has already been provided.

But you're told to...

equip it.

So...

Open your inventory.

 **EQUIPMENT SCREEN**

ARMOR OF GOD

BELT: Truth

BREASTPLATE: Righteousness

BOOTS: Gospel of Peace

SHIELD: Faith

HELMET: Salvation

SWORD: Word of God

COMMS: Prayer

PLAYER STATUS

ENEMY: Identified

BATTLEFIELD: Visible + Unseen

ARMOR: Issued

WEAPONS: Available

AUTHORITY: Under Christ

POWER SOURCE: Holy Spirit

COMMAND: Stand

FIRST RULE OF COMBAT:

KNOW WHO YOU'RE FIGHTING

Paul says:

“Our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms.”

—Ephesians 6:12

That's Enemy Intelligence 101.

Your enemy would love to convince you...

That another person is the enemy.

Your spouse.

Your parent.

Your child.

Your coworker.

Your neighbor.

Someone from another political party.

Someone from another country.

Someone who insulted you.

Someone who hurt you.

Someone who believes something completely different from you.

People can do evil things.

Wrongdoing matters.

Truth matters.

Justice matters.

Boundaries can be necessary.

But Scripture says your ultimate struggle is...

not against flesh and blood.

Why does that matter?

Because if Satan can get you to hate the person...

He may have already distracted you from...

the real battle.

Jesus says:

“Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you.”

—Matthew 5:44

The world says:

Destroy your enemy.

Jesus says:

Love them. Pray for them.

That isn't weakness.

That's warfare...

Kingdom style.

YOU DON'T FIGHT WITH THE WORLD'S WEAPONS

Paul says:

“Though we live in the world, we do not wage war as the world does.”

—2 Corinthians 10:3

Then:

“The weapons we fight with are not the weapons of the world.”

—2 Corinthians 10:4

The world reaches for...

Manipulation.

Intimidation.

Revenge.

Control.

Humiliation.

Deception.

Fear.

Hatred.

But those aren't your weapons.

Paul continues:

“On the contrary, they have divine power to demolish strongholds.”

—2 Corinthians 10:4

Your battle is different.

Your weapons are different.

Your power source is different.

So...

GEAR UP.



EQUIP: BELT OF TRUTH

Paul begins:

“Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist...”

—Ephesians 6:14

The first piece of equipment is...

TRUTH.

That makes sense when you remember who you're fighting.

Jesus called Satan:

“A liar and the father of lies.”

—John 8:44

Go back to Eden.

The serpent didn't attack Eve with a physical weapon.

He attacked...

what she believed.

“Did God really say...?”

—Genesis 3:1

First...

Question God's Word.

Then...

Distort God's character.

Then...

Contradict God's warning.

Then...

Offer a counterfeit.

Same enemy.

Same strategy.

Different level.



THE ATTACK

The enemy says:

God doesn't really love you.

God is withholding something good from you.

God's commands are keeping you from being happy.

This sin will satisfy you.

You'll never change.

God has abandoned you.

Nobody will know.

It doesn't matter.

You can't trust Him.

The enemy wants you navigating reality...

Using false information.



HOW TO EQUIP THE BELT

Know the truth.

Read God's Word.

Study it.

Meditate on it.

Learn God's character.

Learn His promises.

Learn His commands.

Learn the gospel.

Learn what He says about Himself.

Learn what He says about you.

Learn what He says about the enemy.

Learn what He says about the world.

Learn what He says about where the story ends.

Because you can't recognize counterfeit information...

If you don't know the truth.

Remember Quest 11?

The Walkthrough.

This is why you need it.

You don't wait until the battle begins...

To start asking what God said.

You buckle truth around you...

before the attack.



COMBAT RESPONSE

ENEMY WEAPON: Lies • Deception • Distortion

DEFENSE: Truth

EQUIP: Know God's Word and character

ACTION: Recognize the lie

RESPONSE: THAT IS NOT WHAT GOD SAID.

EQUIP: BREASTPLATE OF RIGHTEOUSNESS

Paul continues:

“With the breastplate of righteousness in place...”
—Ephesians 6:14

A breastplate protects...

Your chest.

Your heart.

Vital organs.

And the enemy doesn't only lie.

He...

accuses.

Scripture calls him:

“The accuser of our brothers and sisters...”
—Revelation 12:10

Watch his strategy.

First:

Tempt.

Then, if you fall:

Accuse.

Look what you did.

You're disgusting.

God doesn't want you anymore.

Don't pray.

Don't open the Bible.

Don't go near God.

Hide.

Sound familiar?

Garden.

Sin.

Shame.

Hide.

But the gospel says something different.



THE ATTACK

The enemy wants either...

unrighteousness

or...

condemnation.

First he wants you to compromise.

Then he wants your failure to drive you away from God.

But Jesus has already made a way back.

Paul says:

“God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.”

—2 Corinthians 5:21

Your defense isn't:

I've never sinned.

Your defense is:

Jesus.

And because you belong to Him...

You learn to actually...

walk in righteousness.



HOW TO EQUIP THE BREASTPLATE

Know where your righteousness comes from.

Christ.

Then...

Walk in obedience.

When the Spirit convicts you...

Listen.

When you know something is wrong...

Don't keep doing it.

When you sin...

Don't hide.

Confess.

Repent.

Receive forgiveness.

Make things right where necessary.

Return to God.

John writes:

“If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.”

— 1 John 1:9

Don't let sin harden your heart.

And don't let accusation drive you away from the One who cleanses it.



COMBAT RESPONSE

ENEMY WEAPON: Temptation • Shame • Condemnation • Accusation

DEFENSE: Righteousness

EQUIP: Trust Christ's righteousness + walk in obedience

ACTION: Confess • Repent • Return

RESPONSE: I BELONG TO CHRIST. I WILL WALK IN HIS WAY.



EQUIP: BOOTS OF THE GOSPEL OF PEACE

Paul continues:

“With your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace.”

—Ephesians 6:15

Interesting battle gear.

Peace.

The world fights chaos with...

More chaos.

Anger with anger.

Insult with insult.

Hatred with hatred.

But you carry...

the gospel of peace.

Paul says:

“Since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.”

—Romans 5:1

That's where your footing begins.

You are no longer God's enemy.

Through Jesus...

You have peace with God.

And now wherever your feet go...

You carry the message that other people can have peace with Him too.



THE ATTACK

The enemy wants...

Division.

Chaos.

Offense.

Hatred.

Bitterness.

Retaliation.

He wants you reacting from your flesh.

Someone attacks you.

So you attack harder.

Someone insults you.

So you humiliate them.

Someone hurts you.

So you make them pay.

And suddenly...

You're fighting exactly like the world.



HOW TO EQUIP THE BOOTS

Remember:

I have peace with God.

Then ask:

How can I carry His peace into this situation?

Maybe that means...

Refusing to retaliate.

Forgiving.

Speaking truth without hatred.

Apologizing.

Listening.

Walking away from unnecessary conflict.

Praying for the person attacking you.

Sharing the gospel.

Bringing reconciliation where possible.

Jesus said:

“Blessed are the peacemakers...”

—Matthew 5:9

Not peace-fakers.

Not people who pretend evil doesn't exist.

Peacemakers.

People who carry the Kingdom into conflict.



COMBAT RESPONSE

ENEMY WEAPON: Division • Hatred • Retaliation • Chaos

DEFENSE: Gospel of Peace

EQUIP: Remember your peace with God

ACTION: Carry reconciliation

RESPONSE: I WILL NOT FIGHT LIKE THE WORLD. I CARRY PEACE.



EQUIP: SHIELD OF FAITH

Paul says:

“Take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one.”

—Ephesians 6:16

Now you can almost see the battle.

Flaming arrows incoming.

Fear.

Doubt.

Temptation.

Accusation.

Discouragement.

What if?

What if?

What if?

Remember Peter?

The wind was real.

The waves were real.

The storm was real.

But Jesus was also...

real.

Faith doesn't say:

There is no storm.

Faith says:

The storm isn't all the information.

THE ATTACK

What if God doesn't come through?

What if everything falls apart?

What if you're wrong?

What if you lose everything?

What if God can't be trusted?

The dart is aimed at...

trust.

Exactly where the serpent aimed in Eden.

HOW TO EQUIP THE SHIELD

Remember who God is.

Remember what He has said.

Remember what He has already done.

Remember how He has been faithful.

Then choose...

trust.

Not trust in your desired outcome.

Trust in...

God.

Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego knew God could rescue them from the furnace.

But then they said:

“But even if he does not...”

—Daniel 3:18

They still wouldn't bow.

That's faith.

God can.

I will ask Him.

I will believe Him.

But even when I don't understand what He is doing...

I will not bow.



COMBAT RESPONSE

ENEMY WEAPON: Fear • Doubt • Uncertainty

DEFENSE: Faith

EQUIP: Remember God's character and faithfulness

ACTION: Trust despite what you see

RESPONSE: I DON'T SEE THE WHOLE MAP. BUT I KNOW WHO DOES.



EQUIP: HELMET OF SALVATION

Paul says:

“Take the helmet of salvation...”

—Ephesians 6:17

And elsewhere he describes it as:

“The hope of salvation as a helmet.”

—1 Thessalonians 5:8

A helmet protects...

your head.

Your mind.

And one of the enemy's most powerful strategies is to trap your thinking inside...

this present moment.

This loss.

This rejection.

This illness.

This disappointment.

This financial problem.

This loneliness.

This failure.

This fear.

Until your current circumstances become...

your entire reality.

But salvation tells you:

THIS ISN'T THE END OF THE GAME.



THE ATTACK

The enemy says:

You've lost everything.

There is no hope.

Your life is ruined.

Death wins.

This suffering is all there is.

You have nothing to look forward to.

But your salvation says...

No.

Your hope was never ultimately...

This world.

Your career.

Your possessions.

Your appearance.

Your health.

Your comfort.

Your reputation.

Even this temporary body.

Your hope is...

Jesus.



HOW TO EQUIP THE HELMET

Remember where the story ends.

Paul says:

“Our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ.”

—Philippians 3:20

Remember:

You have been born from above.

You belong to Christ.

The Holy Spirit lives within you.

Jesus defeated death.

You have eternal life.

Resurrection is coming.

This world is temporary.

Your current suffering is temporary.

Your final destination is...

HOME.

Jesus said:

“I am the resurrection and the life.”

—John 11:25

Your circumstances can change.

Possessions can disappear.

People can leave.

Your body can become weak.

Plans can collapse.

And unless Jesus returns first...

Your physical body will eventually die.

But death doesn't get...

the final word.

That's why salvation belongs...

on your head.

Protect your mind by remembering...

the prize isn't this temporary life.

Paul says:

“I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus.”

—Philippians 3:14



COMBAT RESPONSE

ENEMY WEAPON: Despair • Hopelessness • Fear of Loss • Fear of Death

DEFENSE: Hope of Salvation

EQUIP: Remember Eternity

ACTION: Lift your eyes beyond the present level

RESPONSE: THIS IS NOT THE END.



EQUIP: SWORD OF THE SPIRIT

Now Paul gives you an offensive weapon:

“The sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.”

—Ephesians 6:17

Remember the progression?

Quest 11:

The Word became...

your Walkthrough.

Quest 12:

The Word became...

your food.

Now:

The Word becomes...

your sword.

And Jesus shows you exactly how to use it.

WATCH THE KING FIGHT

Matthew 4.

Jesus enters the wilderness.

Satan attacks.

And watch what Jesus does.

Satan tempts.

Jesus answers:

“IT IS WRITTEN...”

Satan attacks again.

Jesus:

“IT IS ALSO WRITTEN...”

Another attack.

Jesus:

“FOR IT IS WRITTEN...”

Jesus doesn't negotiate with the lie.

He doesn't entertain it.

He answers...

with the Word.



THE ATTACK

The enemy sends a lie.

The belt helps you...

recognize it.

Then you draw...

the sword.

The enemy says:

God has abandoned you.

You answer:

IT IS WRITTEN:

“Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you.”

—Hebrews 13:5

The enemy says:

You can't resist this temptation.

You answer:

IT IS WRITTEN:

God **“will also provide a way out so that you can endure it.”**
— 1 Corinthians 10:13

The enemy says:

You need what the world offers to truly live.

You answer:

IT IS WRITTEN:

“Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.”
— Matthew 4:4

The enemy says:

There is no hope beyond death.

You answer:

IT IS WRITTEN:

“Death has been swallowed up in victory.”
— 1 Corinthians 15:54



HOW TO EQUIP THE SWORD

Know Scripture...

before you need it.

Read it.

Study it.

Memorize it.

Meditate on it.

Understand it in context.

Store it in your heart.

David said:

“I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you.”

—Psalm 119:11

Then when the attack comes...

Don't just think:

I know there's probably a Bible verse somewhere about this.

Draw the sword.

IT IS WRITTEN.



COMBAT RESPONSE

ENEMY WEAPON: Specific Lie • Temptation • Distortion

WEAPON: Word of God

EQUIP: Store Scripture in your heart

ACTION: Speak truth into the attack

RESPONSE: IT IS WRITTEN.

BUT THE ENEMY KNOWS SCRIPTURE TOO

There's a twist in Matthew 4.

Satan quotes...

Scripture.

He quotes Psalm 91 to Jesus.

That's important.

Because the enemy can use...

Bible verses.

Out of context.

Twisted.

Misapplied.

Manipulated.

That's why you don't merely collect isolated verses.

You learn...

the whole Walkthrough.

Jesus responds:

“It is also written...”

—Matthew 4:7

Scripture interprets Scripture.

Know the Word well enough...

That even a Bible verse used deceptively...

Doesn't fool you.



EQUIP: PRAYER

Paul doesn't stop with the sword.

He says:

“Pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests.”

—Ephesians 6:18

Think of prayer as...

COMMS.

You are not an isolated soldier...

Cut off from command.

Remember Quest 10.

CONNECTED.

The Holy Spirit lives within you.

You are in communion with God.

Prayer keeps you actively dependent on Him...

Throughout the battle.



THE ATTACK

The enemy wants you...

Isolated.

Self-reliant.

Panicked.

Reacting.

Making decisions without God.

Trying to fight spiritual battles...

With your own strength.



HOW TO EQUIP PRAYER

Pray...

Before the battle.

During the battle.

After the battle.

When you're afraid.

When you're tempted.

When you're confused.

When you're angry.

When you need wisdom.

When someone needs healing.

When someone needs deliverance.

When another believer is under attack.

When you don't even know...

what to pray.

Paul says:

“The Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans.”

—Romans 8:26

You don't need perfect words.

You need...

communion.



COMBAT RESPONSE

ENEMY WEAPON: Isolation • Self-Reliance • Confusion

DEFENSE: Prayer

EQUIP: Practice constant communion with God

ACTION: Pray in the Spirit

RESPONSE: I AM NOT FIGHTING ALONE.

NOW WATCH THE LOADOUT WORK TOGETHER

Here comes the dart:

God doesn't care about you.

BELT OF TRUTH

That's a lie.

You recognize it because you know God's character.

SHIELD OF FAITH

I choose to trust God even though I don't understand what is happening.

HELMET OF SALVATION

This moment is not the whole story. My hope is in Christ.

SWORD OF THE SPIRIT

IT IS WRITTEN:

“God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.”

—Romans 5:8

PRAYER

Father, help me believe what You have said instead of what I feel right now. Holy Spirit, strengthen me.

See the difference?

The armor isn't...

Bible trivia.

It's equipment.

You...

use it.

ANOTHER DART

You should never forgive them. Make them pay.

BELT

That's not what Jesus taught.

BREASTPLATE

I choose righteousness over revenge.

BOOTS

I carry the gospel of peace.

SHIELD

I trust God with justice.

SWORD

IT IS WRITTEN:

“Forgive as the Lord forgave you.”

—Colossians 3:13

PRAYER

Lord, I don't feel like forgiving them. Change my heart. Help me obey You.

That's...

spiritual warfare.

SOMETIMES THE MOST SPIRITUAL MOVE...

IS TAKING THE EXIT

James says:

“Submit yourselves, then, to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.”

—James 4:7

Notice the order.

SUBMIT TO GOD

Then...

RESIST THE DEVIL

Sometimes resistance looks dramatic.

But sometimes...

It looks incredibly ordinary.

Close the screen.

Delete the app.

Leave the room.

Don't send the message.

End the conversation.

Call someone for help.

Walk away.

Block the number.

Tell the truth.

Refuse the drink.

Don't click.

Pray.

Open Scripture.

God promises regarding temptation:

“He will also provide a way out so that you can endure it.”

—1 Corinthians 10:13

Sometimes you're praying:

God, deliver me from this temptation!

And God is saying:

I opened the door.

Walk through it.

When you see the exit...

TAKE IT.

DON'T GIVE THE ENEMY A FOOTHOLD

Paul warns:

“Do not give the devil a foothold.”

—Ephesians 4:27

A foothold.

An opening.

A place to operate.

In that immediate passage, Paul is warning about unresolved anger.

That's important.

Spiritual warfare isn't only dramatic encounters.

Sometimes it's refusing to keep feeding...

Bitterness.

Unforgiveness.

Lies.

Pride.

Greed.

Sexual sin.

Hatred.

Jealousy.

Secret compromise.

You don't fight darkness...

While intentionally leaving the door open.

If the Holy Spirit points to something...

Bring it into the light.

Close the door.

GUARD THE GATES

Not every battle begins with an obvious attack.

Sometimes the enemy doesn't need to break the door down...

If you keep opening it.

Scripture says:

“Above all else, guard your heart, for everything you do flows from it.”

—Proverbs 4:23

Think of your eyes and ears like...

gates.

What you repeatedly watch...

Listen to...

Scroll...

Laugh at...

Celebrate...

And normalize...

Enters somewhere.

It trains your imagination.

Shapes your desires.

Feeds your thoughts.

And eventually...

Can influence your choices.

That's why David said:

“I will not look with approval on anything that is vile.”

—Psalm 101:3

And Paul says:

“Whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable... think about such things.”

—Philippians 4:8

This doesn't mean everything you watch or listen to has to carry a Christian label.

The question is deeper:

What is this feeding?

Does it make sin look normal?

Does it make lust look harmless?

Does it make cruelty entertaining?

Does it make greed admirable?

Does it make the occult fascinating?

Does it train you to laugh at what God calls destructive?

Does it stir desires you're trying to put to death?

Does it leave your mind cleaner...

Or dirtier?

More peaceful...

Or more agitated?

Closer to Jesus...

Or more numb to Him?

Paul says:

“Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind.”

—Romans 12:2

You can't ask God to renew your mind...

While continuously feeding it material that trains it in the opposite direction.

Sometimes spiritual warfare means...

closing the gate.

Turn it off.

Unfollow.

Delete it.

Stop watching.

Change the playlist.

Leave the conversation.

Don't keep feeding something...

That you're asking God to kill.

GATE CHECK

WHAT AM I LETTING IN?

WHAT IS IT TRAINING ME TO LOVE?

WHAT DOES IT NORMALIZE?

WHAT KIND OF FRUIT DOES IT PRODUCE IN ME?

DOES THIS HELP ME WALK WITH GOD... OR MAKE IT HARDER?

Guarding the gate isn't fear.

It's wisdom.

You don't have to consume everything the world offers...

Just because it's available.

Some doors...

Are better left closed.

DON'T BECOME OBSESSED WITH THE ENEMY

Once you discover spiritual warfare...

There's another trap.

You can become fascinated by...

The enemy.

Demons.

Attacks.

Signs.

Hidden meanings.

Constantly asking:

Was that Satan?

Is this demonic?

Is that an attack?

Be careful.

Satan would probably be perfectly happy...

To become the center of your attention.

But he isn't...

the main character.

Jesus is.

Scripture says:

“Fixing our eyes on Jesus...”

—Hebrews 12:2

Know the enemy.

Understand his strategies.

Recognize deception.

Resist him.

But keep your eyes...

on the King.

YOU AREN'T TRYING TO MAKE JESUS WIN

Here's the biggest thing to remember about this war.

The outcome isn't uncertain.

Jesus said:

“In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world.”

—John 16:33

And Paul says that through the cross Jesus:

“Disarmed the powers and authorities...”

—Colossians 2:15

The enemy still fights.

Temptation is real.

Deception is real.

Spiritual warfare is real.

But Jesus has already won...

the decisive victory.

You aren't fighting to make Jesus victorious.

You're learning to stand...

because He is.

THE COMMAND ISN'T PANIC IT'S STAND

Look at how many times Paul repeats the idea in Ephesians 6.

Stand.

Take your stand.

Stand your ground.

After you've done everything...

Stand.

Stand firm.

Sometimes victory doesn't look dramatic.

Sometimes victory looks like...

not moving.

The enemy says:

Give up.

STAND.

God abandoned you.

STAND.

Go back to your old life.

STAND.

Compromise.

STAND.

Nobody else is obeying.

STAND.

Nothing is changing.

STAND.

You don't always need a new strategy.

Sometimes you simply need to remain...

Where God put you.

FULL LOADOUT

BELT OF TRUTH

ATTACK: Lies

EQUIP: Know God's truth

ACTION: Recognize deception

RESPONSE: THAT IS NOT WHAT GOD SAID.

BREASTPLATE OF RIGHTEOUSNESS

ATTACK: Temptation • Shame • Accusation

EQUIP: Trust Christ + walk obediently

ACTION: Confess • Repent • Return

RESPONSE: I BELONG TO CHRIST.

BOOTS OF THE GOSPEL OF PEACE

ATTACK: Division • Hatred • Retaliation

EQUIP: Remember your peace with God

ACTION: Carry reconciliation

RESPONSE: I WILL NOT FIGHT LIKE THE WORLD.

SHIELD OF FAITH

ATTACK: Fear • Doubt • Uncertainty

EQUIP: Remember God's character

ACTION: Trust beyond what you see

RESPONSE: I KNOW WHO HOLDS THE MAP.

HELMET OF SALVATION

ATTACK: Despair • Hopelessness • Fear of Loss and Death

EQUIP: Remember eternal life and resurrection

ACTION: Fix your hope beyond this world

RESPONSE: THIS IS NOT THE END.

ACTION: Answer the attack with God's Word
RESPONSE: IT IS WRITTEN.



PRAYER

ATTACK: Isolation • Self-Reliance
EQUIP: Walk in communion with God
ACTION: Pray in the Spirit
RESPONSE: I AM NOT FIGHTING ALONE.

QUEST COMPLETE

You have an enemy.

But you're not helpless.

The King has already...

issued the equipment.

Your job is to...

put it on.

Know truth...

Before the lie comes.

Walk in righteousness...

So accusation doesn't own your heart.

Carry peace...

Into a world addicted to conflict.

Raise faith...

When the arrows start flying.

Protect your mind...

By remembering where the story ends.

Know the Word...

So when the enemy says:

“Did God really say...?”

You can draw the sword and answer:

“IT IS WRITTEN.”

And pray.

Before the battle.

During the battle.

After the battle.

Stay connected.

Stay submitted.

Stay alert.

Take the exit when temptation comes.

Close doors the enemy is trying to use.

Don't mistake people for the real enemy.

Don't become obsessed with darkness.

Keep your eyes...

on Jesus.

And when you don't know what else to do...

STAND.

Truth buckled.

Righteousness guarding your heart.

Peace under your feet.

Faith raised.

Salvation protecting your mind.

Word in your hand.

Prayer on your lips.

Holy Spirit within you.

King before you.

Enemy identified.

Armor equipped.

PLAYER STATUS

ARMOR: Equipped

SWORD: Ready

COMMS: Open

POWER SOURCE: Holy Spirit

COMMANDER: Jesus

ENEMY: Not Flesh and Blood

MISSION: Active

COMMAND: Stand

But look around.

You're not the only player wearing armor.

There are others on the field.

Different builds.

Different abilities.

Different assignments.

Different strengths.

And there will be moments...

When your shield feels heavy.

When you're wounded.

When you're tired.

When another player sees an attack...

Before you do.

And there will be moments when...

they need you.

Because the Creator never designed His people...

To fight alone.

You're part of a body.

A family.

A team.

It's time to meet...

the other players.

Look around.

You're not alone.

There are other players on the field.

Different backgrounds.

Different personalities.

Different abilities.

Different gifts.

Different assignments.

Different stories.

Some are further ahead than you.

Some just spawned.

Some are strong where you're weak.

Some are weak where you're strong.

Some will encourage you.

Some will challenge you.

Some will teach you.

Some will need you.

And sometimes...

Some will disappoint you.

Welcome to...

MULTIPLAYER.

YOU WERE NEVER DESIGNED TO PLAY SOLO

When Jesus saves you...

He doesn't simply rescue one isolated individual.

He brings you into...

a people.

A family.

A Kingdom.

A Body.

Paul says:

“For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form one body.”

— 1 Corinthians 12:13

One Spirit.

One Body.

Many members.

This is what Scripture calls...

the Church.

And before you picture a building...

Stop.

The Church isn't primarily...

A building.

A denomination.

A stage.

A worship band.

A pastor.

A livestream.

A logo.

A religious organization.

The Church is...

people.

People who belong to Jesus.

THE CHURCH IS A BODY

Paul gives you one of the most powerful pictures in Scripture:

“Just as a body, though one, has many parts... so it is with Christ.”

— 1 Corinthians 12:12

Think about your body.

Eyes.

Hands.

Feet.

Ears.

Heart.

Lungs.

Brain.

Muscles.

Bones.

Different parts.

Different functions.

One life.

One body.

Now imagine your eye saying:

I don't need the hand.

Or your foot saying:

I'm done with the rest of the body. I'm going solo.

That's Paul's point.

He writes:

“The eye cannot say to the hand, ‘I don't need you!’”
— 1 Corinthians 12:21

You need...

other believers.

And they need...

you.

REMEMBER YOUR BUILD?

Quest 14:

UNLOCK YOUR ABILITIES.

Why didn't God give everyone exactly the same gifts?

Because you're not supposed to...

Do everything.

Remember:

“There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them.”
— 1 Corinthians 12:4

Your gifts weren't designed...

To make you independent.

They were designed...

To make you useful to the Body.

That's why Paul says:

“Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good.”

— 1 Corinthians 12:7

COMMON GOOD.

Not:

Look at me.

Not:

Build my platform.

Not:

Prove I'm more spiritual.

But:

How can what God gave me help you?

And somewhere else in the Body...

Someone has been given something...

that helps you.

That's multiplayer.

DIFFERENT BUILDS.

SAME KING.

One player teaches.

Another encourages.

Another gives.

Another leads.

Another shows mercy.

Another serves.

Another carries extraordinary faith.

Another receives wisdom.

Another discerns.

Another prophesies.

Another prays for healing.

Another quietly notices the person everyone else ignored.

Different builds.

But don't confuse...

different function

with...

different value.

Paul says:

“God has put the body together, giving greater honor to the parts that lacked it.”

— 1 Corinthians 12:24

The Kingdom's leaderboard...

Isn't based on visibility.

The person holding the microphone isn't necessarily more important...

Than the person praying quietly in the back.

The pastor isn't more valuable...

Than the person cleaning the room.

The teacher isn't more loved...

Than the person sitting with someone who is grieving.

The missionary on another continent isn't automatically more faithful...

Than the parent discipling a child at the kitchen table.

Different assignment.

Same King.

Same Body.

Same value before God.

JESUS IS THE HEAD

And here's the most important part.

The Church doesn't ultimately belong to...

A pastor.

A denomination.

A board.

A ministry.

A celebrity.

An influencer.

Or you.

Paul says of Jesus:

“He is the head of the body, the church.”

—Colossians 1:18

Jesus is the Head.

The Body takes direction...

From Him.

That means no human leader gets to replace Jesus.

Good leaders point people...

toward Him.

Not toward themselves.

They don't say:

You need me to reach God.

They help you...

Know Jesus.

Understand His Word.

Grow.

Serve.

Mature.

And eventually...

Help someone else.

WHY CAN'T I JUST FOLLOW JESUS BY MYSELF?

You can pray alone.

You can read Scripture alone.

The Holy Spirit lives within you.

So why do you need anyone else?

Because God says you do.

The writer of Hebrews says:

“Let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together...”

—Hebrews 10:24–25

Notice the purpose.

Spur one another on.

You have blind spots.

So do they.

You get discouraged.

So do they.

You misunderstand things.

So do they.

You get tired.

So do they.

You sometimes need someone to say:

Keep going.

Sometimes:

That's not true.

Sometimes:

I think you're heading the wrong direction.

Sometimes:

I forgive you.

Sometimes:

I'm sorry.

Sometimes:

Let me pray with you.

Sometimes:

I'll carry this with you.

And sometimes...

You're the one God sends to say it to someone else.

SOME LOADS ARE TOO HEAVY TO CARRY ALONE

Paul says:

“Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ.”
—Galatians 6:2

Sometimes another player gets...

Hit.

Grief.

Loss.

Temptation.

Fear.

Illness.

Failure.

Rejection.

Exhaustion.

A crisis of faith.

And they can't simply...

try harder.

Sometimes they need...

Someone beside them.

You don't always fix the burden.

Sometimes...

You help carry it.

Sit with them.

Listen.

Pray.

Bring food.

Make the phone call.

Give money.

Show up.

Speak truth.

Stay.

That's the Body...

being the Body.

SOMETIMES YOU'RE THE STRONG PLAYER

There will be seasons when your faith feels strong.

You're seeing clearly.

You're walking steadily.

You're encouraged.

You're growing.

Great.

Look around.

Someone else may be...

Struggling.

Paul says:

“We who are strong ought to bear with the failings of the weak and not to please ourselves.”

—Romans 15:1

Strength isn't given so you can look down...

On weaker players.

Strength gives you...

carrying capacity.

If God has made you strong in an area...

Ask:

Who can I help carry?

SOMETIMES YOU'RE THE WEAK PLAYER

And there will be times...

You're the one who needs help.

That's harder for some people.

You want to be strong.

Independent.

Competent.

Fine.

But sometimes...

You're not fine.

And pretending doesn't make you stronger.

James says:

“Confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed.”

—James 5:16

There's something powerful about bringing struggles...

Into the light.

Not broadcasting everything to everyone.

Wisdom matters.

Trust matters.

Boundaries matter.

But isolation can become...

Dangerous.

You were never designed to carry every battle...

Alone.

THE EARLY PLAYERS UNDERSTOOD THIS

Look at the Church immediately after Pentecost.

Acts says:

“They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer.”

— Acts 2:42

Look at their rhythm:

TEACHING

They learned truth.

FELLOWSHIP

They shared life.

BREAKING BREAD

They ate together and remembered Jesus.

PRAYER

They sought God together.

Then something happened.

Their lives became...

Interconnected.

They shared.

They gave.

They worshiped.

They ate together.

They helped one another.

They learned together.

They prayed together.

And people watching them could see...

Something different.

MULTIPLAYER CHANGES THE EXPERIENCE

Think about a difficult game.

Solo...

You only see what you see.

But multiplayer?

Someone behind you sees...

What you missed.

“Watch out!”

Someone knows the map better.

“This way.”

Someone has an item you don't have.

“Take this.”

Someone knows how to beat the level.

“I've been here before.”

Someone gets knocked down.

“I've got you.”

Someone loses hope.

“Keep going.”

That's what mature Christian community can look like.

Not controlling one another.

Not replacing the Holy Spirit.

Not blindly following people.

Helping each other...

follow Jesus.

BUT THERE'S A PROBLEM

You may already be thinking it.

What about Christians who hurt people?

What about...

Hypocrisy?

Manipulation?

Gossip?

Judgment?

Abuse?

Pride?

Greed?

Scandal?

Control?

Church politics?

People claiming Jesus...

While behaving nothing like Him?

Yes.

It happens.

And sometimes...

The wounds are deep.

Remember Quest 13?

Jesus never told you...

To use other Christians as the standard.

Your target image is...

Jesus.

People can represent Him badly.

Sometimes...

Very badly.

That doesn't make what they did acceptable.

And it doesn't make Jesus...

Like them.

DON'T CONFUSE THE BODY'S SICKNESS...

WITH THE HEAD

If part of your physical body becomes sick...

You don't conclude:

Therefore the head doesn't exist.

You recognize...

Something in the body isn't functioning properly.

The same can happen in the Church.

Jesus is perfect.

His people...

Are still being transformed.

That doesn't excuse abuse.

It doesn't excuse deception.

It doesn't excuse corruption.

It doesn't mean staying somewhere dangerous.

And it doesn't mean following leaders blindly.

Remember the Bereans?

They examined Scripture...

To test what they were being taught.

You can love the Body...

And still use discernment.

A HEALTHY CHURCH SHOULD POINT YOU TOWARD JESUS

So how do you recognize healthier Christian community?

Don't just ask:

Is the music good?

Is the building beautiful?

Is the preacher charismatic?

Is it popular?

Is everyone my age?

Does it feel exciting?

Ask deeper questions.

MULTIPLAYER SERVER CHECK

Is Jesus actually at the center?

Is Scripture taught faithfully?

Is the gospel clear?

Is the Holy Spirit welcomed rather than replaced by human control?

Are people growing in the fruit of the Spirit?

Is there humility?

Is there prayer?

Are spiritual gifts used to serve rather than elevate people?

Are leaders accountable?

Can questions be asked?

Is sin addressed with truth and grace?

Are the vulnerable protected?

Are people being equipped to follow Jesus... or becoming dependent on a personality?

No church will be perfect.

Why?

Because...

You're there.

And so are other imperfect people.

But there is a difference between...

imperfect

and...

unsafe.

Discern the difference.

MULTIPLAYER WILL TEST YOUR LEVEL

Here's something you may not expect.

Other people...

Will reveal what's still in you.

It's easy to think you're patient...

Until someone annoys you.

Easy to think you're forgiving...

Until someone hurts you.

Easy to think you're humble...

Until someone overlooks you.

Easy to think you're generous...

Until someone needs something inconvenient.

Easy to think you're loving...

Until someone is difficult to love.

Community doesn't only...

Comfort you.

Sometimes...

It exposes you.

And that can become part of...

Your sanctification.

Remember Quest 13?

LEVEL UP.

God can use imperfect people...

To reveal where you still need to grow.

THE ENEMY LOVES ISOLATION

Think back to Quest 15.

Spiritual warfare.

What happens when the enemy convinces you:

Nobody understands.

Don't tell anyone.

Stay away.

You don't need anyone.

They'll judge you.

Handle it yourself.

Isolation can make lies...

Louder.

Because nobody else is there to say:

That's not true.

This doesn't mean you need hundreds of friends.

Jesus had crowds.

Then a larger group of disciples.

Then twelve.

And within the twelve...

A few were especially close.

You don't need everyone...

To know everything.

But you do need...

real connection.

WHO IS ON YOUR TEAM?

Ask yourself:

Who can tell me the truth?

Who can pray with me?

Who knows when I'm struggling?

Who can correct me without trying to control me?

Who encourages me toward Jesus?

Who can I call when temptation is strong?

Who can I serve?

Who am I encouraging?

Whose burden am I helping carry?

Who am I praying for?

If every answer is...

Nobody...

Don't accept that as...

Your permanent configuration.

Ask God to bring healthy believers into your life.

And then...

Become the kind of teammate...

You're asking Him to send.

DON'T JUST LOOK FOR WHAT YOU CAN GET

Here's where multiplayer changes.

The question isn't only:

What church will feed me?

Who will encourage me?

Who will pray for me?

Who will teach me?

Those things matter.

But eventually...

The question changes.

Remember Quest 14?

Your abilities were unlocked...

for the common good.

So ask:

Who can I feed?

Who can I encourage?

Who can I pray for?

Who can I teach?

Who can I help?

Where can I serve?

What did the Spirit give me that someone else needs?

You don't join the Body...

Only to consume.

You join...

to participate.

DON'T COMPARE YOUR ROLE

The eye doesn't need to become...

The hand.

The foot doesn't need to become...

The ear.

And you don't need to become...

Someone else.

Paul asks:

“If the whole body were an eye, where would the sense of hearing be?”

— 1 Corinthians 12:17

Imagine a body made entirely...

Of eyeballs.

Terrifying.

And useless.

Difference isn't a design flaw.

Difference...

is the design.

So stop staring at another player's screen.

You don't need their...

Platform.

Gift.

Personality.

Calling.

Audience.

Assignment.

You need to faithfully use...

what God gave you.

WHEN ONE PLAYER HURTS...

THE BODY SHOULD FEEL IT

Paul says:

“If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it.”

— 1 Corinthians 12:26

That's radically different from...

Competition.

If another believer succeeds...

You don't lose.

If someone else receives an opportunity...

You don't become less valuable.

If their ministry grows...

Your assignment didn't shrink.

If God uses them powerfully...

Celebrate.

And when someone suffers...

Don't scroll past.

The Body notices.

The Body responds.

The Body...

cares.

NO FRIENDLY FIRE

Remember Quest 15?

Your struggle isn't against...

flesh and blood.

Yet sometimes Christians spend enormous amounts of energy...

Attacking other Christians.

Gossiping.

Competing.

Mocking.

Dividing.

Destroying reputations.

Fighting over recognition.

Arguing about secondary issues as though every disagreement is the gospel itself.

Discernment matters.

Truth matters.

False teaching matters.

Correction sometimes matters.

But don't forget...

Who the enemy is.

Before you fire...

check the target.

Paul says:

“Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace.”
—Ephesians 4:3

Unity doesn't mean...

Everyone agrees about everything.

It means everyone belongs...

To the same King.

JESUS PRAYED FOR THIS

Before the cross...

Jesus prayed for the people who would believe in Him.

That includes...

You.

And what did He pray?

“That all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you.”
—John 17:21

Then Jesus connects that unity...

To the mission.

“So that the world may believe that you have sent me.”

Think about that.

The way believers love one another...

Says something to the world...

About Jesus.

When the Church devours itself...

The world notices.

But when radically different people...

Love.

Forgive.

Serve.

Carry one another.

Share.

Pray.

Reconcile.

Remain united around Jesus...

The world notices that too.

YOUR TEAM IS BIGGER THAN YOUR LOCAL SERVER

And here's another surprise.

The Body of Christ is much bigger...

Than the group you physically meet with.

Different nations.

Languages.

Cultures.

Generations.

Backgrounds.

Personalities.

People you may never meet...

In this life.

Yet if they belong to Jesus...

They're family.

Revelation gives a glimpse of where this is heading:

“A great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language...”

—Revelation 7:9

Different nations.

Different languages.

One King.

One Kingdom.

One family.

MULTIPLAYER STATUS

HEAD: Jesus Christ

BODY: Church

MEMBERS: Many

SPIRIT: One

GIFTS: Different

MISSION: Shared

BURDENS: Carried Together
TRUTH: Spoken in Love
WEAK: Supported
STRONG: Serve
SUFFERING: Shared
VICTORIES: Celebrated
COMPETITION: Disabled
FRIENDLY FIRE: Avoid
OBJECTIVE: Build One Another Up

QUEST COMPLETE

You were never designed...

To play solo.

The same Jesus who rescued you...

Placed you in...

A Body.

The same Spirit who lives within you...

Lives within...

Other believers.

The abilities you unlocked...

Weren't only for you.

The armor you equipped...

Wasn't issued so you could become an isolated warrior.

You need people.

And...

People need you.

There will be players ahead of you.

Learn from them.

Players beside you.

Walk with them.

Players behind you.

Encourage them.

Players who fall.

Help them up.

Players carrying something heavy.

Grab the other side.

Players celebrating.

Celebrate with them.

Players grieving.

Sit beside them.

Players who correct you.

Listen.

Players who hurt you.

Use wisdom.

Forgive where you can.

Set boundaries where necessary.

Keep your eyes...

On Jesus.

Because other players...

Are not the standard.

The King is.

And don't spend your entire quest asking:

Who's going to help me?

Eventually...

Look around and ask:

Who can I help?

Because somewhere nearby...

Someone needs...

The gift God gave you.

The truth you've learned.

The encouragement you've received.

The strength He's built in you.

The testimony He's given you.

The prayer you can pray.

The love you can show.

Maybe even...

Just your presence.

You have your team.

You have your equipment.

You have your abilities.

Now it's time to start noticing...

The assignments hiding inside...

Ordinary life.

Because not every mission looks...

Epic.

Sometimes the smallest assignment...

Changes someone's entire story.

QUEST 17 — SIDE QUESTS

QUEST 17

SIDE QUESTS

Objective

Learn to recognize the assignments God has already placed in your path—and discover why the smallest acts of obedience may matter more than you realize.

ENTER

You know your build.

Your abilities are unlocked.

You're geared up.

You've found your team.

So now...

What's your mission?

Maybe you've been waiting for something...

BIG.

Your calling.

Your purpose.

Your destiny.

The thing you were born to do.

Maybe you're waiting for God to reveal...

The ministry.

The career.

The platform.

The organization.

The book.

The business.

The country.

The movement.

The giant flashing marker on the map that says:

MAIN QUEST

But while you're staring into the distance...

You may be walking past...

the assignment directly in front of you.



SIDE QUEST DETECTED

Someone needs encouragement.

Someone is hungry.

Someone is lonely.

Someone needs prayer.

Someone needs forgiveness.

Someone needs help.

Someone needs truth.

Someone needs someone...

To notice.

And suddenly...

Your plans are interrupted.

What do you do?

GOD ALREADY PREPARED ASSIGNMENTS

Remember something you learned earlier.

You're not saved...

by good works.

You're saved...

for them.

Paul says:

“For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.”

—Ephesians 2:10

Read that last part again.

Prepared in advance.

That means there are good works...

Already sitting on the map.

People you haven't met yet.

Conversations you haven't had yet.

Needs you haven't seen yet.

Opportunities you don't know are coming.

The Creator sees...

The whole map.

Remember the Air Traffic Controller?

You see your route.

God sees...

Every intersection.

He knows where your path will cross...

Someone else's.

And sometimes...

What looks like a random interruption to you...

May be an assignment He already saw coming.

THE PROBLEM WITH LOOKING FOR YOUR “CALLING”

There's nothing wrong with asking:

God, what have You called me to do?

You should.

But that question can become a trap if it keeps you from doing...

What He's already told you to do.

You can spend years asking:

What's my purpose?

While ignoring...

The person beside you.

Maybe you're waiting for your calling...

While your calling is asking you for help.

Maybe you're waiting for your ministry...

While someone needs prayer.

Maybe you're waiting for your platform...

While someone needs encouragement.

Maybe you're waiting to change the world...

While God is asking you to love...

one person.

JESUS TELLS A STORY

A man is traveling from Jerusalem to Jericho.

He's attacked.

Robbed.

Beaten.

Stripped.

Left...

Half dead.

Then someone comes down the road.

A priest.

A religious man.

Someone who knows Scripture.

Someone associated with worship.

He sees the wounded man.

And...

Passes by.

Then another religious man arrives.

A Levite.

He sees him too.

And...

Passes by.

Two people.

Both saw the need.

Neither stopped.

Then...

A Samaritan arrives.

And Jesus says:

“When he saw him, he took pity on him.”

—Luke 10:33

He saw...

And something happened inside him.

Compassion.

But compassion didn't remain...

A feeling.

He moved.

THE SAMARITAN'S DAY JUST CHANGED

Think about it.

The Samaritan was already...

Going somewhere.

He had plans.

A destination.

A schedule.

Probably things he needed to accomplish.

The wounded man wasn't...

On his calendar.

There was no notification that morning:

2:15 PM

Rescue injured stranger.

He simply encountered...

A need.

And stopped.

He bandaged the man's wounds.

Put him on his own animal.

Brought him to an inn.

Cared for him.

Paid for his lodging.

And promised to cover additional expenses.

Time.

Energy.

Resources.

Money.

Inconvenience.

The Samaritan didn't just...

feel compassion.

He spent something.

SIDE QUESTS COST SOMETHING

That's worth remembering.

Love can cost...

Time.

Money.

Comfort.

Convenience.

Sleep.

Attention.

Pride.

Your schedule.

Sometimes the reason we miss assignments isn't because we didn't...

See them.

It's because we calculated...

the cost.

The priest saw.

The Levite saw.

The Samaritan saw.

Only one...

stopped.

WHO IS MY NEIGHBOR?

The story begins because someone asks Jesus:

“And who is my neighbor?”

—Luke 10:29

In other words:

Who exactly am I responsible for loving?

Jesus turns the question around.

After telling the story, He asks which person...

became a neighbor.

Then He says:

“Go and do likewise.”

—Luke 10:37

Don't spend your entire life trying to determine...

Who deserves your love.

Become...

the person who loves.



SIDE QUEST DETECTED

PLAYER:

You

CURRENT ROUTE:

Already in progress

INTERRUPTION:

Someone needs help

AVAILABLE INVENTORY:

Time • Attention • Prayer • Money • Skill • Encouragement • Presence

PROMPT:

Will you stop?

SOMETIMES THE ASSIGNMENT IS TINY

Not every assignment requires...

Rescuing someone from the side of a road.

Jesus says:

“If anyone gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones who is my disciple... that person will certainly not lose their reward.”

—Matthew 10:42

A cup...

Of water.

That's it.

No stage.

No microphone.

No viral video.

No applause.

No ministry name.

No one may even notice.

But...

Jesus does.

The Kingdom's measurement system is very different...

From the world's.

THE WORLD MEASURES REACH

How many followers?

How many views?

How much money?

How many people attended?

How big is the organization?

How impressive was the accomplishment?

But Jesus keeps noticing...

Things that look small.

A widow giving two small coins.

A cup of water.

Someone visiting the sick.

Someone feeding the hungry.

Someone welcoming a stranger.

Someone caring for the overlooked.

Someone washing feet.

Someone stopping...

For one wounded person.

Maybe the Kingdom isn't asking:

How many people saw what you did?

Maybe it's asking:

Were you faithful with the person I put in front of you?

THEN JESUS REVEALS SOMETHING STUNNING

In Matthew 25, Jesus describes people who...

Fed the hungry.

Gave drink to the thirsty.

Welcomed the stranger.

Clothed those who needed clothing.

Cared for the sick.

Visited the imprisoned.

And then the King says:

“Whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.”

—Matthew 25:40

Wait.

What?

They thought they were...

Helping people.

Jesus says:

You were serving Me.

They didn't even realize it.

They ask:

When did we see You?

That's the reveal.

YOU THOUGHT IT WAS A SIDE QUEST.

THE KING TOOK IT PERSONALLY.

**YOU NEVER KNOW WHO IS STANDING
IN FRONT OF YOU**

That's why people matter.

The person everyone ignores.

The cashier having a terrible day.

The elderly neighbor.

The child who needs someone to listen.

The coworker everyone dislikes.

The person eating alone.

The friend who suddenly goes quiet.

The stranger who needs help.

The person who has nothing...

To offer you in return.

The world evaluates people according to...

What they can give us.

Jesus teaches you to see...

Differently.

Remember Quest 9?

Eyes Opened.

Maybe spiritual sight sometimes looks like...

Noticing the person everyone else walked past.

SOMETIMES THE SIDE QUEST IS PRAYER

Maybe someone suddenly comes...

To mind.

You don't know why.

Pray.

Maybe you feel a strong compassion for someone.

Pray.

Maybe someone tells you they're hurting.

Don't automatically say:

I'll pray for you.

And then forget.

Maybe...

Pray right there.

Paul says:

“Pray continually.”

— 1 Thessalonians 5:17

You don't need...

A stage.

A church building.

A microphone.

A special event.

You can pray...

Where you are.

SOMETIMES YOU CAN ASK

If you believe God may be prompting you toward someone...

You don't always have to make a dramatic declaration:

“GOD TOLD ME...”

Remember...

Test the signal.

Sometimes you can simply ask:

“Can I pray for you?”

“Are you okay?”

“Is there something you need?”

“Can I help?”

“You came to mind today. How are you doing?”

Simple.

Humble.

No performance.

No pressure.

Just...

Available.

SOMETIMES THE ASSIGNMENT USES YOUR UNLOCKED ABILITIES

Remember Quest 14?

The Holy Spirit gives gifts...

For the common good.

Now those abilities start encountering...

Needs.

Someone needs wisdom.

Someone needs encouragement.

Someone needs mercy.

Someone needs teaching.

Someone needs discernment.

Someone needs prayer.

Someone needs healing.

Someone needs practical help.

Someone needs generosity.

Someone needs leadership.

Someone needs...

What God has placed in you.

That's why the ability wasn't given...

Just for you.

NEED DETECTED

↓

GIFT AVAILABLE

↓

LOVE ACTIVATED

↓

PLAYER RESPONDS

↓

GOD GETS THE GLORY

**SOMETIMES GOD MAY INTERRUPT
YOUR PLAN**

Philip was in Samaria.

Something extraordinary was happening.

People were hearing the gospel.

Then God sent him toward...

A desert road.

There Philip encountered...

One man.

An Ethiopian official reading Isaiah.

One conversation.

One person.

Philip explained the good news about Jesus.

The man believed.

He was baptized.

And Philip's route changed again.

You might have thought the bigger crowd...

Was the bigger assignment.

But God saw...

one person on a road.

Don't assume bigger...

Means more important.

JESUS CONSTANTLY ALLOWED INTERRUPTIONS

Watch Him in the Gospels.

Jesus is traveling...

Someone cries out.

Jesus stops.

He's teaching...

Someone lowers a paralyzed man through the roof.

Jesus responds.

He's walking through a crowd...

A woman touches His garment.

Jesus stops.

He's heading to Jairus's dying daughter...

And still stops for the woman who had been bleeding for twelve years.

He's leaving Jericho...

Blind Bartimaeus cries out.

Jesus stops.

People bring children...

The disciples try to move them away.

Jesus welcomes them.

Again and again...

The interruption becomes...

the ministry.

BUT NOT EVERY INTERRUPTION IS AN ASSIGNMENT

This matters too.

Jesus didn't respond to...

Every demand.

He sometimes withdrew.

He prayed.

He rested.

He left crowds.

He didn't allow other people's expectations...

To control His mission.

So Side Quests doesn't mean...

Say yes to everyone.

You are not...

Everyone's savior.

Jesus already has that job.

You have limited...

Time.

Energy.

Resources.

Attention.

That's why you need...

The Holy Spirit.

Ask:

Is this mine to do?

Sometimes the answer is:

Yes. Stop.

Sometimes:

Help in the way you can.

Sometimes:

Pray.

Sometimes:

Give.

Sometimes:

Connect them with someone else.

And sometimes:

No. Keep moving.

Availability isn't...

The same thing as having no boundaries.

COMPASSION NEEDS DISCERNMENT

Love doesn't mean...

Being manipulated.

Helping doesn't always mean...

Giving someone exactly what they ask for.

Sometimes love gives.

Sometimes love says...

No.

Sometimes love rescues.

Sometimes love allows consequences.

Sometimes love speaks.

Sometimes love listens.

Sometimes love stays.

Sometimes love walks away.

That's why you don't simply follow...

Emotion.

You follow...

Jesus.

SOME SIDE QUESTS ARE ALREADY IN YOUR HOUSE

It's easy to imagine your mission...

Somewhere else.

Another city.

Another country.

Another career.

Another season.

But look around.

Your family.

Your roommates.

Your neighbors.

Your coworkers.

Your classmates.

Your church.

The people already...

In your contacts.

Sometimes the person God is asking you to love...

Isn't a stranger on a distant mission field.

They're sitting...

Across the table.

YOUR WORK CAN BE AN ASSIGNMENT

Maybe your job doesn't feel...

Spiritual.

You answer emails.

Build software.

Teach children.

Repair things.

Treat patients.

Drive trucks.

Design buildings.

Manage money.

Clean rooms.

Run a business.

Care for children.

Serve customers.

Study.

But Paul says:

“Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord.”

—Colossians 3:23

Whatever you do.

Your workplace can become...

Mission territory.

Not because you preach at everyone constantly.

But because...

You work honestly.

Treat people with dignity.

Refuse corruption.

Keep your word.

Serve well.

Forgive.

Encourage.

Help.

Carry peace.

And when the door opens...

You can tell people...

Why.

DON'T DESPISE ORDINARY OBEDIENCE

Maybe you thought following God would always...

Feel supernatural.

Sometimes it does.

But sometimes obedience looks like...

Doing the dishes.

Keeping your promise.

Showing up on time.

Paying what you owe.

Calling someone who's lonely.

Caring for your child.

Visiting your parent.

Returning something that isn't yours.

Apologizing.

Forgiving.

Giving quietly.

Working honestly.

Listening patiently.

Keeping your mouth shut when you want to gossip.

Praying when nobody knows.

Opening your home.

Making dinner for someone who's grieving.

Sending the message:

“I'm thinking about you.”

Ordinary?

Maybe.

Insignificant?

No.

YOUR SIDE QUEST MAY BECOME SOMEONE ELSE'S MAIN STORY

Here's something you'll rarely know.

The conversation you almost didn't have...

May be the conversation someone remembers...

For years.

The encouragement you almost didn't send...

May arrive on the worst day of someone's life.

The person you invite...

May eventually meet Jesus.

The prayer you pray...

May change something you never see.

The child you patiently teach...

May someday teach thousands.

The stranger you help...

May go home believing kindness still exists.

You don't know...

The whole map.

Remember?

The Creator does.

DON'T SERVE TO BE SEEN

There's another trap.

Once you start noticing assignments...

You can turn obedience into...

Content.

Photo.

Post.

Story.

Proof.

Look what I did.

Jesus warns:

“Be careful not to practice your righteousness in front of others to be seen by them.”
—Matthew 6:1

Sometimes the most beautiful quests...

Never make your profile.

Nobody knows.

Nobody applauds.

Nobody likes.

Nobody shares.

But your Father...

saw.

And that is enough.

YOU DON'T NEED TO SAVE THE WORLD

This is important.

You aren't...

Jesus.

You can't help everyone.

You can't meet every need.

You can't solve every injustice.

You can't answer every message.

You can't rescue every person.

And carrying the weight of the entire world...

Was never your assignment.

So don't ask:

How can I fix everything?

Ask:

What has God placed in front of me?

One person.

One need.

One opportunity.

One act of obedience.

One prayer.

One conversation.

One step.

Then...

Take it.

QUEST 18

THE KING'S AMBASSADOR

Objective

Discover what it means to belong to the Kingdom of Heaven while living on Earth—and learn how to represent the King wherever He sends you.

ENTER

Something changed when you were born from above.

You didn't leave Earth.

Same planet.

Same city.

Same family.

Same school.

Same workplace.

Same neighborhood.

Same world.

But...

Your citizenship changed.

Paul says:

“Our citizenship is in heaven.”
—Philippians 3:20

You're still here.

But now...

You belong to another Kingdom.

And that means you're not here...

Just to survive until you go Home.

You're here...

on assignment.

Paul gives your new role a name:

“We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us.”

—2 Corinthians 5:20

Read that again.

Christ's ambassadors.

That's your new role.

CURRENT LOCATION: Earth

CITIZENSHIP: Heaven

KING: Jesus

KINGDOM: God

ROLE: Ambassador

MESSAGE: Reconciliation

POWER SOURCE: Holy Spirit

AUTHORITY: Delegated

MISSION FIELD: Wherever You Are

OBJECTIVE: Represent the King

WHAT IS AN AMBASSADOR?

An ambassador lives...

In one country...

While representing another.

They don't arrive in a foreign land and say:

I'm here representing myself.

They carry...

Another government's message.

Another kingdom's interests.

Another ruler's authority.

Their conduct matters because...

People associate the ambassador...

With the one who sent them.

Now listen again to Paul:

“We are therefore Christ's ambassadors...”

You live on Earth.

But you represent...

the King.

YOU'RE NOT HERE TO REPRESENT YOURSELF

This changes things.

Your life isn't primarily about building...

Your kingdom.

Your reputation.

Your platform.

Your brand.

Your comfort.

Your image.

Your followers.

Your wealth.

Your name.

You belong to...

Jesus.

Paul says:

“You are not your own; you were bought at a price.”

— 1 Corinthians 6:19–20

That's surrender.

You aren't asking only:

What do I want to do with my life?

You're learning to ask:

King Jesus...

What do You want to do through it?

THE KING HAS A MESSAGE

An ambassador doesn't invent...

Their own message.

They deliver...

The King's.

So what message did God give you?

Paul explains it immediately before calling you an ambassador:

“God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting people's sins against them. And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation.”

— 2 Corinthians 5:19

There it is.

THE MESSAGE:

RECONCILIATION.

Remember the beginning of the book?

Creation.

Relationship.

Rebellion.

Separation.

The walking dead.

Then...

The Creator entered His creation.

Jesus died.

Jesus rose.

The Spirit gives new life.

The broken relationship can be...

restored.

And now God entrusts that message...

To people who have already received it.

YOU WERE RESCUED...

TO JOIN THE RESCUE MISSION

Remember where you started?

PLAYER STATUS

CREATOR: Unknown

OBJECTIVE: Unknown

FINAL DESTINATION: Undetermined

SPECIAL ABILITIES: Locked

You were the player...

Who needed rescuing.

Jesus said:

“The Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost.”

—Luke 19:10

He found you.

Called you.

Gave you life.

Opened your eyes.

Put His Spirit within you.

Taught you.

Fed you.

Changed you.

Equipped you.

Placed you in His Body.

And now...

He turns your attention toward...

someone else.

THE MISSION DIDN'T END WHEN YOU WERE SAVED

This is important.

Salvation isn't:

Jesus rescued me...

so now I wait for Heaven.

If that were the entire objective...

Why are you still here?

You have...

People to love.

Good works prepared in advance.

Gifts to use.

Truth to carry.

A gospel to share.

A Kingdom to represent.

And people around you...

Who still don't know the King.

Jesus tells His disciples:

“Go and make disciples of all nations...”

—Matthew 28:19

That's the mission.

Not:

Collect converts.

Not:

Win arguments.

Not:

Force people to agree with you.

Jesus says:

Make disciples.

People who...

Know Him.

Follow Him.

Learn from Him.

Obey Him.

Become like Him.

And eventually...

Help someone else follow Him.

THE MISSION STARTS WITH LOVE

Remember Side Quests?

The wounded man.

The hungry person.

The lonely person.

The person who needs prayer.

The person everyone else overlooked.

That wasn't separate...

From the mission.

Jesus says:

“By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another.”
—John 13:35

Love makes the invisible Kingdom...

Visible.

When you forgive...

People see something.

When you serve...

People see something.

When you give...

People see something.

When you love someone who can't repay you...

People see something.

When you refuse hatred...

People see something.

When you carry peace into conflict...

People see something.

Your life begins saying:

My King is different.

BUT LOVE DOESN'T MEAN HIDING THE MESSAGE

There's another mistake you can make.

You can serve.

Love.

Give.

Help.

Be kind.

And never tell anyone...

why.

But an ambassador carries...

A message.

Paul says God has entrusted to us:

“The message of reconciliation.”

—2 Corinthians 5:19

Eventually...

Words matter.

People need to know...

Who Jesus is.

Why He came.

What happened at the cross.

That He rose.

That sin separates us from God.

That forgiveness is available.

That new life is possible.

That they can be born from above.

That the Creator...

Is calling them Home.

YOU DON'T HAVE TO BE A PREACHER

Maybe you're thinking:

I'm not an evangelist.

Fine.

You don't need...

A microphone.

A pulpit.

A theology degree.

A stage.

A ministry.

A huge social following.

Think about what Jesus told a man He delivered from demons:

“Go home to your own people and tell them how much the Lord has done for you.”

—Mark 5:19

Start there.

Tell them what He did.

You don't need to know...

Every answer.

You can say:

This is who I was.

This is what happened.

This is who Jesus is becoming to me.

This is what He changed.

This is why I believe.

A witness doesn't need to know...

Everything.

A witness tells...

what they have seen.

YOUR TESTIMONY IS PART OF YOUR INVENTORY

Nobody else has...

Your exact story.

Your exact questions.

Your exact failures.

Your exact rescue.

Your exact journey.

Your exact encounters with God.

Someone may argue with...

Your theology.

Someone may reject...

Your interpretation.

Someone may disagree with...

Your worldview.

But they can't change...

What happened to you.

The man Jesus healed said:

“One thing I do know. I was blind but now I see!”
—John 9:25

Simple.

Powerful.

This is what Jesus did.

BUT YOU ARE NOT THE SAVIOR

This may be one of the most important things...

An ambassador learns.

You cannot...

Save anyone.

You can explain.

Love.

Serve.

Pray.

Invite.

Answer questions.

Share Scripture.

Tell your story.

Proclaim Jesus.

But you cannot...

Make someone believe.

Jesus says:

“No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws them.”

—John 6:44

So stop carrying...

God's job.

Your responsibility is...

faithfulness.

God handles...

The heart.

Remember Side Quests?

You plant.

Someone else waters.

God makes it grow.

THE HOLY SPIRIT POWERS THE MISSION

Jesus didn't tell His disciples:

Go change the world using your personalities.

Before sending them outward, He told them:

“You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses...”

— Acts 1:8

There it is again.

The Holy Spirit.

The One who gave you new life.

Opened your eyes.

Teaches you.

Guides you.

Transforms you.

Gives gifts.

Helps you pray.

Now...

Empowers you to witness.

The mission isn't powered by...

Charisma.

Marketing.

Intelligence.

Confidence.

Education.

Personality.

Those things may be useful.

But the power source is...

God.

YOU CARRY THE KING'S PRESENCE

Remember Quest 10?

CONNECTED.

The Holy Spirit isn't...

Following you from far away.

Jesus said:

“He lives with you and will be in you.”

—John 14:17

So wherever you go...

Work.

School.

Home.

Hospital.

Airport.

Restaurant.

Gym.

Grocery store.

Another country.

A friend's house.

A difficult conversation.

You don't arrive...

Alone.

God's Spirit...

Dwells within you.

That doesn't make you...

God.

It makes you...

His.

And that means ordinary places can become...

Mission territory.

REPRESENT THE KING ACCURATELY

Here's the uncomfortable part.

If you call yourself...

A follower of Jesus...

People may form conclusions about Jesus...

By watching you.

That's why character matters.

Quest 13:

LEVEL UP.

Why did character come...

Before mission?

Because power without character...

Can misrepresent the King.

If you preach Jesus...
But live dishonestly...
What message are you sending?
If you talk about grace...
But refuse to forgive...
What are you showing?
If you proclaim God's love...
But treat people with contempt...
What will they conclude?
If you talk about holiness...
While hiding deliberate sin...
What are you representing?
Your life doesn't need to be...
Perfect.
But it should increasingly...
Point toward the One you represent.

YOU ARE NOT THE KING

There's another danger.
Ambassadors can forget...
Their rank.
You carry the King's message.
You do not...
Become the King.
You don't control people.

You don't force belief.

You don't manipulate.

You don't dominate.

You don't use...

“God told me”

to control someone else's choices.

You don't demand...

That people obey you.

Jesus said:

“Whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant.”

—Matthew 20:26

Kingdom authority...

Looks like Jesus.

And Jesus...

Washed feet.

WATCH HOW THE KING REPRESENTED THE KINGDOM

Want to know how to be an ambassador?

Watch...

Jesus.

He told the truth.

And...

Loved people.

He confronted hypocrisy.

And...

Touched lepers.

He called people to repent.

And...

Ate with sinners.

He spoke about judgment.

And...

Wept.

He cast out demons.

He healed the sick.

He fed the hungry.

He welcomed children.

He forgave enemies.

He washed feet.

He laid down...

His life.

Truth without love...

Can become cruelty.

Love without truth...

Can become sentimentality.

Jesus embodied...

both.

“Grace and truth came through Jesus Christ.”

—John 1:17

That's your model.

YOU ARE LIGHT...

BUT YOU AREN'T THE SOURCE

Jesus tells His followers:

“You are the light of the world.”

—Matthew 5:14

But remember...

The light isn't originally yours.

Jesus says:

“I am the light of the world.”

—John 8:12

He is the Source.

You...

Reflect Him.

Like the moon doesn't manufacture sunlight...

You don't manufacture...

The light of Christ.

You receive.

Reflect.

Carry.

Point back...

To Him.

DON'T HIDE THE LIGHT

Jesus continues:

“Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl.”

—Matthew 5:15

You weren't given new life...

To hide it.

Fear can make you hide.

What will they think?

What if they reject me?

What if they laugh?

What if I don't know the answer?

What if they think I'm weird?

Remember:

You're an ambassador.

The message isn't...

Yours.

The Kingdom isn't...

Yours.

The outcome isn't...

Yours.

Your responsibility is...

Faithfulness.

REJECTION ISN'T GAME OVER

Not everyone will receive...

Your message.

Jesus Himself was...

Rejected.

Mocked.

Opposed.

Abandoned.

Crucified.

So don't measure faithfulness...

By applause.

Sometimes obedience produces...

Immediate fruit.

Sometimes...

Resistance.

Sometimes...

Questions.

Sometimes...

Silence.

Sometimes...

A seed that grows years later.

You may never know.

Your job isn't to make everyone...

Like the message.

Your job is to represent...

the King faithfully.

DON'T TURN PEOPLE INTO PROJECTS

This matters.

Once you understand mission...

It's possible to stop seeing...

People.

You start seeing:

Potential convert.

Evangelism opportunity.

Person I need to convince.

But Jesus saw...

People.

Not projects.

Love them...

Even if they never agree with you.

Serve them...

Even if they never come to church.

Treat them with dignity...

Even if they reject your message.

Why?

Because they bear...

The image of God.

The gospel isn't...

A sales pitch.

You're not closing...

A transaction.

You're bearing witness...

To a Person.

SOMETIMES THE DOOR OPENS

Peter says:

“Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have.”

— 1 Peter 3:15

Notice:

Be prepared.

Someone asks:

Why do you believe that?

Why aren't you afraid?

Why did you forgive them?

Why do you have hope?

Why did you help me?

Why do you follow Jesus?

Door...

open.

Now you can tell them.

But Peter immediately adds:

“But do this with gentleness and respect.”

Not arrogance.

Not humiliation.

Not:

I'm right and you're stupid.

Gentleness.

Respect.

Truth.

Love.

SOMETIMES YOU OPEN THE CONVERSATION

You don't always need to wait.

Jesus initiated conversations too.

You can ask:

Do you believe in God?

Can I pray for you?

Have you ever read what Jesus actually said?

Can I tell you what happened to me?

Do you know why Christians believe Jesus rose from the dead?

Simple.

Human.

Respectful.

And then...

Listen.

An ambassador doesn't only...

Talk.

LISTEN TO THEIR STORY

Before answering someone's question...

Find out what they're actually asking.

Maybe they don't hate Jesus.

Maybe they were hurt...

By Christians.

Maybe they were taught something about Jesus...

That He never taught.

Maybe they think Christianity is...

Something it isn't.

Maybe they're angry.

Maybe they're grieving.

Maybe they're afraid.

Maybe they've never actually...

Heard the gospel.

Listen.

James says:

“Everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak...”

—James 1:19

Sometimes listening...

Opens the door for truth.

YOU MAY BE THE FIRST BIBLE SOMEONE WATCHES

Before someone ever opens...

Matthew.

Mark.

Luke.

John.

They may watch...

You.

How do you respond...

When you're insulted?

When you lose?

When someone hurts you?

When you have power?

When nobody is watching?

When you make a mistake?

When someone disagrees with you?

When someone needs help?

When you're afraid?

They may not know...

John 13.

But they understand...

Love.

They may not know...

Philippians 2.

But they recognize...

Humility.

They may not know...

Galatians 5.

But they can see...

Fruit.

Your life doesn't replace Scripture.

But it can make someone...

Curious about the King.

YOUR MISSION FIELD IS WHEREVER YOUR FEET ARE

You don't need to travel...

Across the world.

Maybe God will send you.

Maybe He won't.

But today...

Your mission field is...

Where you are.

Your home.

Your street.

Your workplace.

Your school.

Your phone.

Your dinner table.

Your neighborhood.

Your social feed.

Your friendships.

Your family.

Your ordinary Tuesday.

Wherever the King places His ambassador...

Be His ambassador...

there.

AMBASSADOR PROTOCOL

1. REMEMBER WHO YOU REPRESENT

Jesus.

Not yourself.

2. KNOW THE MESSAGE

God reconciles people to Himself through Christ.

3. STAY CONNECTED

Walk with the Holy Spirit.

4. REPRESENT THE KING'S CHARACTER

Truth.

Love.

Holiness.

Mercy.

Humility.

Courage.

5. NOTICE PEOPLE

Don't turn them into projects.

6. SERVE

Love becomes visible through action.

7. SPEAK

When the door opens...

Tell them about Jesus.

8. LISTEN

Understand the person...

Not just the argument.

9. LEAVE THE OUTCOME TO GOD

You witness.

God draws.

10. POINT BACK TO THE KING

If something good happens through you...

Don't build your throne.

Point to...

His.

AMBASSADOR STATUS

HOME KINGDOM: Heaven

CURRENT POST: Earth

KING: Jesus

MESSAGE: Reconciliation

MISSION: Make Disciples

POWER: Holy Spirit

METHOD: Truth + Love

QUEST COMPLETE

You began this quest asking:

Who don't know they're spiritually dead.

Who don't know...

The Creator came looking for them.

You do.

So carry...

The message.

Carry...

The light.

Carry...

The love.

Carry...

The truth.

Carry...

The presence of the Holy Spirit.

And when someone asks...

Where your hope comes from...

Tell them.

When someone is wounded...

Stop.

When someone needs prayer...

Pray.

When someone needs truth...

Speak it in love.

When the Spirit gives you an ability...

Use it.

When the enemy attacks...

Stand.

When another believer falls...

Help them up.

When God opens a door...

Walk through it.

You are...

A citizen of Heaven.

Living...

On Earth.

Representing...

Jesus.

Until the day...

Your assignment here is complete.

Because every ambassador eventually...

Gets called...

Home.

But before Home...

There is one enemy every human being eventually faces.

The enemy no amount of money can bribe.

No technology has defeated.

No human achievement has escaped.

Scripture calls it...

the last enemy.

And the plot twist?

Your King...

Has already faced it.

And walked out...

Alive.

Objective

Face the enemy every human being eventually encounters, discover what lies beyond it, and understand why death does not get the final word.

ENTER

Every game eventually...

Runs out of levels.

Every journey reaches...

Its final road.

Every clock...

Counts down.

And every human being...

No matter how powerful...

Wealthy...

Brilliant...

Healthy...

Successful...

Famous...

Loved...

Or prepared...

Eventually encounters...

The same enemy.

Kings have faced it.

Presidents have faced it.

Warriors have faced it.

Scientists have faced it.

Doctors have faced it.

Billionaires have faced it.

Children have faced it.

Every generation before you...

Has faced it.

And Scripture actually calls it...

an enemy.

Paul writes:

“The last enemy to be destroyed is death.”

— 1 Corinthians 15:26

There it is.

The last enemy.

In gamer language...

THE FINAL BOSS.



FINAL BOSS DETECTED

ENEMY: Death

ENCOUNTER RATE: 100%

HUMAN ESCAPE RATE: 0%

WEALTH REQUIRED TO ESCAPE: Insufficient

INTELLIGENCE REQUIRED: Insufficient

TECHNOLOGY REQUIRED: Insufficient

PLAYER POWER: Insufficient

FINAL OUTCOME: Apparently Certain

Until...

Someone entered the battle...

And came back out.

HUMANITY HAS BEEN FIGHTING DEATH FOREVER

Look around.

So much of human civilization is really...

A battle against death.

Medicine.

Surgery.

Nutrition.

Exercise.

Sanitation.

Emergency rooms.

Cancer research.

Organ transplantation.

Artificial organs.

Genetics.

Technology.

Human beings keep learning...

How to delay death.

Treat disease.

Repair injury.

Extend life.

And these are extraordinary gifts of knowledge.

But eventually...

Every medical chart reaches the same line.

Every heartbeat...

Stops.

Every body...

Returns to dust.

Medicine can sometimes postpone death.

It cannot...

Defeat it.

WE TRY OTHER STRATEGIES TOO

Maybe if I make enough money...

I'll be safe.

Maybe if I become famous...

I'll be remembered.

Maybe if I build something important...

Part of me will remain.

Maybe if I have children...

I'll continue through them.

Maybe technology will eventually...

Solve the problem.

Maybe if I just don't think about death...

It will stay far away.

But underneath all the distractions...

Humanity knows.

Something is coming...

That we cannot control.

The Final Boss waits...

At the end of every human road.

BUT DEATH WASN'T PART OF THE ORIGINAL DESIGN

Go back...

To the beginning.

Quest 4.

What Went Wrong?

God warned Adam:

“You must not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, for when you eat from it you will certainly die.”

—Genesis 2:17

Then humanity chose...

Independence.

Sin entered.

And Paul explains:

“Sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, and in this way death came to all people...”

—Romans 5:12

Death isn't presented in Scripture as...

A beautiful natural completion of God's original design.

Death is...

an enemy.

Something went wrong.

The game broke.

And death entered...

The human story.

REMEMBER THE WALKING DEAD?

Quest 6 revealed something deeper.

Death had already begun...

Before your physical body stopped.

Humanity was physically alive...

But spiritually separated from...

The Source of Life.

Paul said:

“You were dead in your transgressions and sins.”

—Ephesians 2:1

Walking.

Talking.

Working.

Eating.

Laughing.

Building.

Thinking.

Breathing.

But separated...

From God.

The Final Boss you see at the end...

Is connected to the rupture...

That happened at the beginning.

Humanity didn't merely need...

Longer life.

We needed...

Life restored.

THEN THE CREATOR ENTERED THE GAME

Remember Quest 7?

The Creator didn't remain...

Outside the broken world.

“The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us.”

—John 1:14

Jesus entered...

Humanity.

And that meant something staggering.

The One who created life...

Made Himself vulnerable...

To death.

The eternal Creator...

Took on mortal flesh.

He became hungry.

Tired.

Thirsty.

He bled.

He suffered.

And eventually...

He walked directly toward...

The enemy no human being could defeat.

JESUS KNEW WHAT WAS COMING

The cross wasn't...

An accident.

Jesus told His disciples:

“The Son of Man must suffer many things... and he must be killed and on the third day be raised to life.”

—Luke 9:22

Killed.

Then...

Raised.

Before the battle even happened...

Jesus told them...

The outcome.

THEN HE WALKED TOWARD JERUSALEM

He knew.

Betrayal was coming.

Arrest was coming.

Mocking was coming.

Beating was coming.

Crucifixion was coming.

Death was coming.

And still...

He went.

Jesus said:

“No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord.”

—John 10:18

The Final Boss didn't...

Sneak up on Jesus.

Jesus walked...

Toward it.

THE KING ENTERED THE BATTLE

Jesus was arrested.

Beaten.

Mocked.

Nailed to a cross.

His blood was shed.

His body weakened.

He breathed...

His last.

And then...

He died.

The One who said:

“I am the life”

entered...

Death.

His body was taken down.

Wrapped.

Placed in a tomb.

A stone was rolled...

Across the entrance.

Silence.

PLAYER STATUS

JESUS OF NAZARETH

HEARTBEAT: None

BREATH: None

BODY: Tomb

STONE: Sealed

DISCIPLES: Scattered

ENEMIES: Celebrating

MISSION: Appearance of Failure

STATUS: Dead

From the outside...

It looked like...

The Final Boss had won.

But what looked like defeat...

Was actually part of...

The rescue.

THEN CAME THE THIRD DAY

Women went...

To the tomb.

But something was wrong.

The stone...

Had been moved.

The body...

Was gone.

And the message came:

“He is not here; he has risen!”

—Luke 24:6

Read that again.

HE.

HAS.

RISEN.

Death had swallowed...

The Author of Life.

And discovered...

It could not hold Him.

FINAL BOSS STATUS

ENEMY: Death

CHALLENGER: Jesus Christ

JESUS ENTERED DEATH: Yes

JESUS REMAINED DEAD: No

TOMB: Empty

KING: Alive

VICTORY: Secured

The Final Boss...

Had finally encountered...

Someone it could not keep.

THIS WASN'T JUST RESUSCITATION

Other people in Scripture had...

Returned to life.

Lazarus walked out of a tomb.

Jairus's daughter got up.

The widow's son lived again.

But eventually...

They died again.

Jesus' resurrection was...

Different.

Paul says:

“Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep.”

— 1 Corinthians 15:20

Firstfruits.

The beginning...

Of a harvest.

Jesus wasn't merely showing...

That He could come back.

His resurrection was the beginning...

Of what God intends to do...

For His people.

THE KING DIDN'T JUST DEFEAT DEATH FOR HIMSELF

This is where the story becomes...

Your story.

Jesus said to Martha:

“I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die.”

—John 11:25

Notice what Jesus didn't say.

I know the way to resurrection.

He said:

I AM THE RESURRECTION.

Life isn't merely something...

Jesus gives.

Life is found...

in Him.

Remember Quest 10?

You are united...

With the Lord.

Connected to...

The One death could not hold.

YOU DON'T DEFEAT THE FINAL BOSS

This is the gospel...

Again.

You don't train hard enough...

To conquer death.

You don't level up enough.

You don't collect enough spiritual abilities.

You don't equip enough armor.

You don't complete enough side quests.

You don't accumulate enough points.

You don't become good enough...

To force open the grave.

You win because...

you belong to the One who already won.

Paul says:

“Thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.”

— 1 Corinthians 15:57

Whose victory?

His.

Who gives it?

God.

How does it become yours?

Through Jesus Christ.

BUT PHYSICAL DEATH ISN'T THE END OF THE STORY

Here's something you need to understand.

If death were simply...

The end...

Then defeating death would only mean...

Finding a way to keep existing.

But Scripture tells us...

There is more beyond the grave.

The writer of Hebrews says:

“People are destined to die once, and after that to face judgment.”

—Hebrews 9:27

Death is not...

The final destination.

There is...

Judgment.

There is...

Eternity.

And there are...

Two very different outcomes.

That means the most important question isn't simply:

Will I die?

Unless Jesus returns first...

Yes.

The deeper question is:

WHOSE ARE YOU...

WHEN YOU DO?

THERE ARE TWO DESTINATIONS

Jesus spoke openly...

About eternal life.

He also spoke openly...

About judgment.

About exclusion.

About darkness.

About punishment.

About hell.

The Bible doesn't treat hell...

Like a joke.

It doesn't describe it as...

A party with people who didn't want religion.

It doesn't present Satan...

As its king.

Satan isn't ruling hell.

He is judged too.

Revelation describes his final destination:

“The devil, who deceived them, was thrown into the lake of burning sulfur...”

—Revelation 20:10

And later Revelation describes the final judgment and calls the lake of fire...

“The second death.”

—Revelation 20:14

Death...

Beyond physical death.

Final judgment.

Final separation.

This is serious.

And if we're going to talk about...

Home...

We also have to tell you...

There is another destination.

BUT BEFORE YOU THINK ABOUT HELL...

LOOK AT THE CROSS

Because if you misunderstand...

The heart of God...

You'll misunderstand...

The entire rescue mission.

God isn't standing at the edge of eternity...

Looking for reasons...

To keep you out.

Look at everything...

You've already learned.

Humanity walked away...

God came looking.

Humanity rebelled...

God promised rescue.

Humanity was spiritually dead...

God offered life.

Humanity couldn't reach Him...

So He came...

To us.

Jesus says:

“God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him.”

—John 3:17

God's purpose in sending Jesus...

Was rescue.

EVERY PART OF YOUR SALVATION...
THAT GOD COULD DO FOR YOU...
HE DID.

Stop there.

Think about that.

You couldn't make...

A way back to God.

He made the way.

You couldn't erase...

Your sin.

He provided forgiveness.

You couldn't pay...

The price.

Jesus paid it.

You couldn't defeat...

Death.

Jesus defeated it.

You couldn't make yourself...

Spiritually alive.

He gives His Spirit.

You couldn't rescue...

Yourself.

So the Creator...

Came Himself.

He entered...

Our suffering.

He experienced...

Rejection.

Betrayal.

Mockery.

Beating.

Nails.

Blood.

Agony.

And death.

The God who gave humanity...

Breath...

Allowed His own breath...

To stop.

There was no greater price...

Left for Him to pay.

No greater demonstration...

Of His love left to give.

Every part of your salvation...

That God could do...

for you...

He did.

BUT THERE IS ONE PART...

HE WILL NOT DO INSTEAD OF YOU

Your response.

He will not believe...

Instead of you.

He will not repent...

Instead of you.

He will not surrender...

Instead of you.

He will not receive...

Himself for you.

And He will not force you...

To love Him.

God calls.

God draws.

God convicts.

God warns.

God pursues.

God offers.

God gave His Son.

Jesus gave His life.

The Holy Spirit...

Reveals truth.

But God does not manufacture...

A relationship with someone...

By forcing that person...

To love Him.

Love that is forced...

Isn't love.

Relationship requires...

A response.

And Scripture repeatedly calls you...

To respond.

Come.

Believe.

Repent.

Receive.

Follow.

John says:

“To all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God.”

—John 1:12

Notice the word:

Receive.

The gift has been...

Offered.

The price has been...

Paid.

The way has been...

Opened.

But you can still...

Refuse the gift.

GOD DOESN'T WANT YOU TO PERISH

Peter writes that God is:

“not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance.”

—2 Peter 3:9

Jesus says:

“Whoever comes to me I will never drive away.”

—John 6:37

And:

“I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved.”

—John 10:9

Listen carefully.

The God who warns you...

About judgment...

Is the same God...

Who went to the cross...

To rescue you from it.

The warning itself...

Is an act of love.

If someone is walking toward...

A cliff...

Love doesn't remain silent...

Because the truth might...

Upset them.

Love warns:

Stop.

Turn around.

There's another way.

And Jesus says:

“I am the way and the truth and the life.”

—John 14:6

HELL ISN'T THE STORY OF A GOD...

WHO REFUSED TO RESCUE HUMANITY

It's the tragic end...

Of refusing...

The rescue He accomplished.

Remember Quest 6?

The Walking Dead.

Jesus didn't enter a world...

Filled with spiritually healthy people...

And begin looking for people...

To condemn.

He entered a world...

Already separated...

Already lost...

Already dying.

Jesus Himself explains:

“Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe stands condemned already...”

—John 3:18

Already.

Jesus came...

Into the emergency.

The cross isn't evidence...

That God wants you condemned.

The cross is evidence...

Of how far God was willing to go...

to save you.

So if you ever wonder:

Does God want me saved?

Don't guess.

Look...

At the cross.

That question has already...

Been answered.

THE QUESTION ISN'T...

DOES GOD WANT YOU HOME?

He came...

For you.

He suffered...

For you.

He died...

For you.

He rose...

For you.

He offers forgiveness...

To you.

He offers new life...

To you.

He offers His Spirit...

To you.

He offers Himself...

To you.

Every part of your salvation...

That He could do for you...

He did.

The question remaining is:

WILL YOU RECEIVE HIM?

Because Home isn't ultimately...

About streets of gold.

Or gates.

Or angels.

Or escaping pain.

Home is...

with Him.

Remember what Jesus said...

All the way back in Quest 3:

“Now this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent.”

—John 17:3

Eternal life isn't merely...

Existing forever.

It is knowing...

Him.

THE FINAL BOSS IS DEFEATED...

BUT NOT YET DESTROYED

People still...

Die.

Christians still...

Die.

Bodies still age.

Disease still exists.

Funerals still happen.

Graves still fill.

Families still grieve.

So how can Scripture say...

Jesus defeated death?

Because the victory has already been...

Secured.

But the final destruction of death...

Is still coming.

Paul says:

“The last enemy to be destroyed is death.”

—1 Corinthians 15:26

Death is...

Defeated.

But not yet...

Removed.

The resurrection of Jesus is...

The guarantee.

The empty tomb is...

The preview.

The final destruction of death...

Is coming.

FAITH DOESN'T MEAN PRETENDING DEATH DOESN'T HURT

Jesus never taught...

That grief isn't real.

When Lazarus died...

Jesus knew exactly what He was about to do.

He knew Lazarus would...

Walk out of the tomb.

And still...

“Jesus wept.”

—John 11:35

Two words.

And an enormous truth.

Faith doesn't mean...

You don't cry.

Hope doesn't mean...

You don't grieve.

Knowing resurrection is coming...

Doesn't make separation painless.

Death is an enemy.

Enemies...

Cause wounds.

But Paul says believers don't grieve...

“like the rest of mankind, who have no hope.”

— 1 Thessalonians 4:13

Notice:

He doesn't say...

Don't grieve.

He says...

Don't grieve...

without hope.

CHRISTIAN HOPE ISN'T...

“MAYBE SOMETHING HAPPENS AFTER DEATH”

Biblical hope isn't...

Wishful thinking.

It's anchored...

To an event.

A tomb.

A body.

A resurrection.

Paul makes Christianity stand or fall...

On this point:

“If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile.”

— 1 Corinthians 15:17

That's astonishing.

Paul doesn't say:

The resurrection is a nice symbol.

If Jesus didn't...

Actually rise...

The entire thing...

Collapses.

Christian hope rests...

On the risen Jesus.

RESURRECTION CHANGES THE ENDING

The Bible doesn't end with...

Souls floating forever...

On clouds.

The Christian hope is...

resurrection.

Paul says:

“The dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed.”

— 1 Corinthians 15:52

Changed.

The body that is...

Weak.

Aging.

Breakable.

Temporary.

Will not remain...

That way.

Paul says:

“The perishable must clothe itself with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality.”
— 1 Corinthians 15:53

Remember your original build?

Body • Soul • Spirit

God isn't abandoning...

His creation.

He's restoring it.

YOUR BODY MATTERS TO GOD

Christianity isn't...

Escape from physical existence.

God created...

Matter.

Bodies.

Earth.

And called His creation...

Good.

Sin corrupted creation.

Death entered.

But God's answer isn't...

Throw everything away.

It's...

resurrection.

Paul says Jesus:

“will transform our lowly bodies so that they will be like his glorious body.”

—Philippians 3:21

The body you have now...

Isn't your final form.

RESURRECTION UPGRADE

CURRENT BODY: Mortal

FINAL BODY: Imperishable

CURRENT BODY: Aging

FINAL BODY: Glorified

CURRENT BODY: Vulnerable to Death

FINAL BODY: Immortal

CURRENT STATUS: Temporary

FINAL STATUS: Resurrection Life

This isn't...

An upgrade you install.

It's something...

The King does.

WHAT ABOUT BELIEVERS WHO ARE ALIVE WHEN JESUS RETURNS?

Paul reveals another mystery:

“We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed.”

—1 Corinthians 15:51

Some believers will...

Still be alive.

Paul says:

“The dead in Christ will rise first. After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them... to meet the Lord in the air.”

— 1 Thessalonians 4:16–17

The dead...

Raised.

The living...

Changed.

And together...

With Jesus.

Paul ends that teaching by saying:

“Therefore encourage one another with these words.”

— 1 Thessalonians 4:18

This prophecy wasn't given...

To make believers terrified.

It was given...

To give them hope.

THAT'S WHY YOUR HELMET MATTERED

Remember...

Gear Up?

HELMET OF SALVATION

The enemy attacks your mind:

It's over.

You've lost everything.

There's no hope.

Death wins.

But the helmet protects...

Your thinking.

Your prize was never...

Keeping this temporary body...

Alive forever.

Paul says:

“Our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ...”

—Philippians 3:20

Your hope is...

Jesus.

Resurrection.

Restoration.

Home.

So when death says:

GAME OVER...

Jesus says:

NO.

DEATH DOESN'T GET THE LAST WORD

Paul almost...

Taunts death.

He reaches back into the prophets and says:

“Death has been swallowed up in victory.”

— 1 Corinthians 15:54

Then:

“Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?”

— 1 Corinthians 15:55

Imagine that.

Humanity spent thousands of years...

Terrified of death.

And now Paul stands...

On the other side of the empty tomb...

And asks death:

Where's your victory?

Not because Paul is powerful.

Not because Paul can't die.

Paul eventually...

Does.

But Paul knows...

Death can no longer...

Keep him.

DEATH CAN TOUCH THE BELIEVER...

BUT IT CANNOT KEEP THE BELIEVER

Jesus says:

“Because I live, you also will live.”

—John 14:19

That's the whole thing.

Not:

Because you're strong...

You'll live.

Not:

Because you performed perfectly...

You'll live.

Not:

Because you understood everything...

You'll live.

BECAUSE I LIVE...

YOU ALSO WILL LIVE.

Your future is attached...

To His life.

THAT CHANGES HOW YOU LIVE NOW

If death isn't the end...

Then fear doesn't have to...

Control your life.

If resurrection is real...

Then sacrifice isn't wasted.

If eternity is real...

Then temporary loss isn't...

Ultimate loss.

If Jesus lives...

Then obedience can cost you something...

Without costing you everything.

This is why believers throughout history have been able to...

Give.

Serve.

Risk.

Forgive.

Suffer.

Go.

Stay.

Sacrifice.

And even face death...

With hope.

They weren't pretending...

Death wasn't real.

They knew...

It wasn't final.

**BUT DON'T BECOME CARELESS WITH
LIFE**

Eternal life doesn't mean...

This life doesn't matter.

Your physical life is...

A gift.

Protect it.

Steward it.

Care for your body.

Use wisdom.

Seek help when you're in danger.

Don't manufacture suffering.

Don't take reckless risks...

And call it faith.

Jesus refused to throw Himself from the temple...

Just to prove God would protect Him.

Life matters...

Because God gave it.

You're simply no longer required...

To worship survival.

THERE'S A DIFFERENCE BETWEEN...

PRESERVING LIFE...

AND FEARING DEATH

You can care for your health...

Without making health your god.

You can avoid danger...

Without being ruled by fear.

You can grieve death...

Without believing death won.

You can fight disease...

While knowing your ultimate hope isn't medicine.

You can treasure this life...

While knowing...

It's not the final level.

THE KING HOLDS THE KEYS

After His resurrection Jesus declares:

“I am the Living One; I was dead, and now look, I am alive for ever and ever! And I hold the keys of death and Hades.”

—Revelation 1:18

Keys represent...

Authority.

Who holds them?

Not death.

Not Satan.

Not the grave.

JESUS.

The One who entered death...

Came out carrying...

The keys.

Was coming.

Every human does.

Maybe that's why death frightens us...

So deeply.

We know...

We can't beat it.

And we're right.

You can't.

But that was never...

The plan.

The Creator didn't come...

To give you better strategies...

For losing more slowly.

He came...

To give you life.

Jesus walked directly toward...

The Final Boss.

He allowed Himself...

To be killed.

His body was placed...

In a tomb.

The stone closed.

For three days...

It looked like death...

Had won again.

But what appeared...

To be failure...

Was the rescue mission...

Being accomplished.

Then...

The stone moved.

The tomb opened.

And Jesus...

Walked out.

Alive.

The Final Boss...

Had finally met...

The King.

And lost.

But now you know something else.

Physical death isn't...

The final destination.

Beyond death...

There is eternity.

There is judgment.

There is life with God.

And there is the tragedy...

Of final separation from Him.

That's why this entire story...

Matters.

That's why Jesus came.

That's why the cross matters.

That's why the empty tomb matters.

And that's why...

your response matters.

Every part of your salvation...

That God could do for you...

He did.

He made the way.

He paid the price.

He bore the suffering.

He defeated death.

He offers forgiveness.

He offers new birth.

He offers His Spirit.

He offers...

Himself.

But He will not make...

Your response...

For you.

So one day...

Unless Jesus returns first...

Your heart may stop.

Your lungs may stop.

Your body may become still.

People may say...

You're gone.

A grave may close.

But if you belong to Jesus...

That is not...

GAME OVER.

Because the One who said:

“I am the resurrection and the life”

also said:

“Because I live, you also will live.”

And one day...

The final enemy won't merely be...

Defeated.

It will be...

destroyed.

John sees what is coming:

“There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain...”

—Revelation 21:4

No more...

Death.

No more...

Graves.

No more...

Funerals.

No more...

Final goodbyes.

No more...

Separation.

The Final Boss...

Will be gone.

And then...

After all the quests...

After the battles...

After the failures...

After the victories...

After the waiting...

After the mission...

After death itself...

There is only one place left...

To go.

The place you've been moving toward...

Since the moment the Creator...

Called you back to Himself.

Not clouds.

Not an endless waiting room.

Not an escape from creation.

Something...

Far better.

The King is there.

The One who came...

To bring you back.

The One who did every part...

Of your rescue...

That He could do for you.

And finally...

You're going...

HOME.

QUEST 20

WELCOME HOME

Objective

Discover where the entire story is going—and why the greatest reward of eternal life isn't a place, but the One who has been calling you Home.

ENTER

The Final Boss...

Has been defeated.

Jesus entered...

Death.

And walked...

Back out.

The tomb...

Is empty.

The King...

Is alive.

And because...

He lives...

You can live...

Forever.

But the story...

Isn't over.

Because Jesus didn't rise...

Only to rescue you...

From a broken world.

The Creator doesn't abandon...

What He created.

He restores it.

And one day...

The King...

IS COMING BACK.

THE KING RETURNS

Before Jesus went...

To the cross...

He made His disciples...

A promise:

“I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am.”

—John 14:3

I will come back.

You're not waiting...

For an idea.

A philosophy.

A spiritual awakening.

A better civilization.

A political solution.

You're waiting...

For...

a Person.

Jesus.

The One who came...

Is coming...

Again.

THIS TIME...

WILL BE DIFFERENT

The first time Jesus came...

He came...

As a baby.

The world...

Barely noticed.

He was laid...

In a manger.

The second time...

No one will miss Him.

The first time...

He came in humility.

The second time...

He comes in glory.

The first time...

He allowed Himself...

To be judged...

By human rulers.

The second time...

He comes...

As Judge...

And King.

The first time...

They placed...

A crown of thorns...

On His head.

The second time...

He comes...

Wearing...

many crowns.

Revelation describes Him:

“On his robe and on his thigh he has this name written: KING OF KINGS AND LORD OF LORDS.”

—Revelation 19:16

The King...

Returns.

KING STATUS

NAME: Jesus Christ

TITLE: King of Kings and Lord of Lords

AUTHORITY: Absolute
ENEMY: Defeated
KINGDOM: Coming in Fullness
MISSION: Restoration
STATUS: Returning

THE KING WILL REIGN

Remember the prayer...

Jesus taught?

**“Your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as it is in heaven.”**

One day...

The King will reign...

On Earth.

Revelation describes...

A period in which Satan is bound...

And Christ reigns...

For one thousand years.

“They came to life and reigned with Christ a thousand years.”
—Revelation 20:4

This is often called...

THE MILLENNIAL KINGDOM.

Millennium means...

One thousand years.

This is not yet...

The final New Heaven...

And New Earth.

That comes later.

First...

The King humanity rejected...

Will reign.

The One who was mocked...

As...

“King of the Jews”

will be revealed...

As...

KING OF KINGS.

Isaiah had foretold:

“Of the greatness of his government and peace there will be no end.”

— Isaiah 9:7

Humanity has tried...

Kings.

Emperors.

Dictators.

Democracies.

Republics.

Monarchies.

Revolutions.

Political parties.

Ideologies.

Empires.

Again and again...

Power ends up...

In imperfect...

Human hands.

But this King...

Is different.

Because this King...

Is righteous.

This King...

Is holy.

This King...

Is Jesus.

AND THE ENEMY?

Remember...

Quest 5?

Meet the Enemy.

The serpent.

The deceiver.

The accuser.

The one who has been lying...

Since Eden.

Revelation says an angel seizes:

“that ancient serpent, who is the devil, or Satan”

—Revelation 20:2

And binds him...
For a thousand years.
Think about that.
The serpent...
Who appeared...
Near the beginning...
Of Genesis...
Appears again...
Near the end...
Of Revelation.
Same enemy.
Same rebellion.
But now...
His time...
Is almost over.

ONE FINAL REBELLION

At the end...
Of the thousand years...
Satan is released.
And astonishingly...
He deceives...
Again.
There is...
One final rebellion.

And there is something...

Sobering...

About this.

Even after humanity has seen...

The righteous reign...

Of Christ...

There are still those...

Who choose...

Rebellion.

Scripture doesn't explicitly tell us every reason God permits this final release.

But it reveals something...

We have already learned...

Throughout this Quest.

Humanity's deepest problem...

Was never merely...

Bad government.

Bad education.

Bad economics.

Bad circumstances.

Bad environment.

The problem...

Went deeper.

Remember...

Quest 4?

What Went Wrong?

The rebellion began...

In the heart.

Humanity chose...

Independence...

From God.

And now...

One final time...

That rebellion...

Surfaces.

But this time...

It ends...

Forever.

THE ENEMY...

IS FINISHED

Revelation says:

“The devil, who deceived them, was thrown into the lake of burning sulfur...”

—Revelation 20:10

Remember what you learned...

In Quest 5.

Satan was never...

God's equal.

Never.

This was never...

A cosmic struggle...

Between two...

Equal powers.

Creator...

Versus created being.

Infinite...

Versus finite.

King...

Versus rebel.

Satan's ending...

Was never...

In doubt.

And now...

The deceiver...

Is gone.

No more...

Serpent.

No more...

Tempter.

No more...

Accuser.

No more...

Enemy whispering:

“Did God really say?”

The voice...

That entered the Garden...

Is silenced...

Forever.

THEN COMES...

FINAL JUDGMENT

John sees:

“A great white throne and him who was seated on it.”

—Revelation 20:11

The dead stand...

Before God.

Books...

Are opened.

And everyone...

Is judged.

Then another book...

Appears.

The Book of Life.

Revelation says:

“Anyone whose name was not found written in the book of life was thrown into the lake of fire.”

—Revelation 20:15

This is the judgment...

WHY I NEEDED TO TELL YOU

Until now, this book has been about you.

PLAYER: YOU.

I wanted it that way.

I wanted you to walk through the questions yourself.

Who am I?

Why am I here?

Is there a Creator?

What went wrong?

Why does something inside me feel like it is searching for something I cannot quite name?

Who is Jesus?

What does it mean to be born again?

What happens when God actually comes to live within you?

But before you go, I want to tell you why I wrote this book.

Because I spent a large part of my life searching too.

And eventually I discovered something that changed everything:

I WAS NEVER SUPPOSED TO DO LIFE ALONE.

For years, I tried to understand life.

I read.

I studied.

I questioned.

I searched.

I tried to be a good person.

I tried to figure out what was right and what was wrong.

I tried to make good choices.

I believed, in one form or another, that if I did enough good, tried hard enough, learned enough, and became a better version of myself, somehow life would make sense.

I struggled with the same existential questions so many people do.

Why am I here?

What is the point?

What happens when I die?

Is this really all there is?

Maybe your questions have looked different.

Maybe what you've been searching for is peace.

Maybe healing.

Love.

Identity.

Belonging.

Purpose.

Success.

A relationship.

A family.

Recognition.

Security.

Money.

Achievement.

Knowledge.

Pleasure.

Approval.

A body you feel comfortable in.

A career that finally makes you feel important.

A person who finally makes you feel complete.

Maybe you're trying to quiet anxiety.

Depression.

Loneliness.

Anger.

Shame.

Trauma.

Maybe you're trying to figure out who you are.

Maybe you're trying to fill something you can't even name.

Or maybe, from the outside, your life looks pretty good.

And yet somewhere inside you...

There is still that question:

IS THIS IT?

Human needs are real.

Relationships matter.

Community matters.

Physicians can help.

Counselors can help.

Medicine can help.

Friends matter.

Family matters.

Work matters.

Rest matters.

God can use all of those things.

But no created thing can replace the Creator at the center of a human life.

That was what I didn't understand.

WE WERE CREATED FOR GOD.

Not merely by Him.

For Him.

To know Him.

To love Him.

To walk with Him.

To receive life from Him.

And for a long time, even after I began seeking God, I was still trying to figure everything out in my own strength.

God would begin showing me things in my life that needed to change.

Sin.

Temptations.

Wrong thinking.

Desires that were leading me away from Him.

Ways I was trying to find life apart from Him.

Sometimes my response was basically:

Is that really sin?

Looking back, I recognize the same question from the Garden:

“Did God really say?”

And God was patient with me.

He showed me through Scripture.

Through conviction.

Through testimony.

Through experience.

Through consequences.

Through His Spirit.

There were things I knew I needed to change.

And I tried.

I really tried.

I would decide:

I'm not going to do that anymore.

I'm not going to think that way anymore.

I'm not going to want that anymore.

I'm going to fix this.

And sometimes I could change for a little while.

Then I would fail again.

And eventually I began to understand why.

I WAS STILL TRYING TO DO IT IN MY OWN STRENGTH.

I thought God was showing me what was wrong so that I could go away and repair myself.

But that wasn't the point.

The point was to bring me back to Him.

There were moments when my prayers became very simple.

God, please help me.

I cannot overcome this.

Please take this from me.

And He began doing things in me that I could not do for myself.

That was the point.

Jesus said:

“Apart from me you can do nothing.”

—John 15:5

For years, I think I unconsciously imagined that spiritual maturity meant becoming strong enough that I wouldn't need God so much.

I had it backward.

The goal wasn't to become strong enough to stop needing Him.

The goal was to discover that I had been created to live in continual relationship with Him.

I didn't need God to give me enough wisdom so that eventually I could navigate life without Him.

I needed...

Him.

I didn't need enough strength that I would eventually become self-sufficient.

I needed...

Him.

I didn't need to understand every spiritual reality perfectly on my own.

I needed the One who understands everything.

His wisdom.

His understanding.

His counsel.

His strength.

His knowledge.

His truth.

His power.

His love.

The answer wasn't:

Become everything you need.

The answer was:

YOU NEED ME.

And that is what happens when you are born again.

You are not merely adopting a religion.

You are not merely changing philosophies.

You are not beginning a better-person project.

Scripture says:

“If anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come.”

—2 Corinthians 5:17

God gives you new life.

His Spirit comes to dwell within you.

The Creator gives you...

Himself.

And I can only tell you what happened in my own life.

The existential anxiety that had followed me for years gave way to peace.

Depression lifted.

My sleep changed.

My energy changed.

Old trauma began healing.

There were physical things in my body that changed.

There were sins and temptations that had felt stronger than me that began losing their grip.

Things I had tried to overcome through willpower began changing when I finally surrendered them to God and asked Him for help.

I am not telling you that every believer will experience physical healing in the same way I did.

Jesus did not promise that following Him would mean a life without suffering.

We still live in a broken world.

Bodies still get sick.

People still grieve.

Christians still experience pain.

I am telling you what God did in me.

And the deepest healing was not any individual symptom disappearing.

**HE RESTORED MY RELATIONSHIP
WITH HIM.**

Then He began teaching me.

And He is still teaching me.

Like a Father raising a child.

Teaching.

Correcting.

Guiding.

Counseling.

Disciplining.

Comforting.

Strengthening.

Opening my eyes.

Teaching me about His Kingdom.

Teaching me what is true.

Teaching me how to love.

How to forgive.

How to surrender.

How to obey.

How to trust.

Line upon line.

Lesson after lesson.

Sometimes I understand quickly.

Sometimes I don't.

Sometimes I obey quickly.

Sometimes I wrestle.

But He is patient.

And one of the most important things I can tell you is this:

READ HIS WORD.

Jesus is the eternal Word who became flesh.

Scripture is God's written Word and testimony to us.

And when you read it prayerfully, asking the Holy Spirit to teach you, you begin learning your Father's character.

His ways.

His heart.

His Kingdom.

His truth.

You begin recognizing His voice because you begin recognizing what sounds like Him.

At first, you may not understand much.

That's okay.

A newborn child hears a parent's voice long before that child understands every word.

The baby doesn't say:

I don't understand language yet, so there's no point listening.

The child keeps hearing.

And eventually...

Recognition comes.

Understanding comes.

Language comes.

Relationship grows.

So don't become discouraged because you read the Bible and don't understand everything.

Keep reading.

Ask questions.

Ask God:

Father, teach me.

Help me understand.

Show me what is true.

Show me who You are.

Show me what needs to change in me.

Even fifteen minutes a day.

Spend time with Him.

Thank Him.

Talk to Him.

Ask Him for wisdom.

When you sin, don't run away and hide.

Repent.

Come back.

Ask for forgiveness.

Ask for help.

His mercies are new every morning.

You are learning.

And He knows your heart.

He knows whether you genuinely want Him.

He knows whether you're struggling.

He knows the difference between rebellion and someone who is falling while learning to walk.

Keep going.

Because this isn't ultimately about accumulating Bible information.

IT IS ABOUT KNOWING HIM.

And I can tell you this from the other side of the search:

Life with God is better than the life I was trying to construct without Him.

His wisdom is better than mine.

His ways are higher than mine.

His peace is different from anything I knew before.

I spent years looking for life while separated from the Source of life.

And as God began changing me, something else happened.

I began caring about people differently.

I began thinking about how many people are walking around asking the same questions I once asked.

How many people are hurting.

Searching.

Trying to fill the emptiness.

Trying to save themselves.

Trying to become good enough.

Trying to numb the pain.

Trying to find identity.

Trying to find truth.

Trying to find God.

And something inside me began saying:

THEY HAVE TO KNOW.

They have to know how good He is.

How patient He is.

How merciful He is.

How loving He is.

How glorious He is.

And they also need to understand how serious separation from Him is.

Because God is love.

But God is also just.

Imagine standing before a perfectly righteous judge after committing a serious crime and saying:

But Judge...

I've also done a lot of good things.

I gave money to charity.

I helped people.

I was kind to my neighbors.

I worked hard.

I loved my family.

Those things may genuinely be good.

But they do not erase the crime.

A righteous judge cannot simply pretend guilt does not exist because you performed unrelated good deeds.

Justice requires that the debt be dealt with.

And that is the part of the gospel that is so extraordinary.

You could not erase your own guilt.

So God provided the payment.

You could not save yourself.

So...

GOD CAME FOR US.

This is why it matters so much to understand who Jesus really is.

Not merely a teacher.

Not merely a prophet.

Not an angel.

Not simply a good man.

The Creator entered His creation.

Jesus came for us.

And:

EVERY PART OF YOUR SALVATION THAT GOD COULD DO FOR YOU, HE DID.

You couldn't make a way back to Him.

He made one.

You couldn't erase your sin.

He offered forgiveness.

You couldn't pay the debt.

Jesus paid it.

You couldn't make yourself spiritually alive.

He gives new life.

You couldn't defeat death.

Jesus defeated it.

You couldn't climb your way to God.

God came to you.

He came.

He suffered.

He was rejected.

He was betrayed.

He bled.

He died.

He rose.

There was no greater price left for Him to pay.

No greater demonstration of love left to give.

But there is one thing He will not do instead of you.

YOUR RESPONSE.

He will not believe instead of you.

He will not repent instead of you.

He will not surrender instead of you.

He will not receive instead of you.

He will not force you to love Him.

Because relationship cannot be manufactured by coercion.

He calls.

He draws.

He convicts.

He warns.

He pursues.

He offers.

He gave His Son.

He opened the way.

But you must respond.

And that is one of the reasons I wrote this book.

Because...

YOU HAVE TO MAKE IT HOME.

I don't care what you've done.

I don't care how far you've wandered.

I don't care how many times you've failed.

I don't care how confused you've been.

I don't care how long you've lived without Him.

Jesus said:

“Whoever comes to me I will never drive away.”

—John 6:37

Come Home.

You cannot defeat the Final Boss yourself.

Neither could I.

No human can.

But Jesus already has.

Paul writes:

“Thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.”

—1 Corinthians 15:57

The victory is...

His.

And He gives it.

And if you already belong to Jesus...

Keep going.

Walk with Him.

Talk to Him.

Read His Word.

Ask questions.

Thank Him.

Listen.

Learn.

Repent when you need to repent.

Ask for wisdom.

Ask for strength.

Ask for counsel.

Ask Him to show you what you cannot see.

Don't imagine that needing Him means you're failing spiritually.

Needing Him...

Was always the design.

He has said:

“Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you.”

—Hebrews 13:5

So learn to live...

With Him.

By Him.

Through Him.

For Him.

And maybe you're reading this book because you're looking for peace.

Maybe healing.

Identity.

Love.

Meaning.

Belonging.

Truth.

Forgiveness.

Purpose.

Maybe you don't even know what you're looking for.

You just know something is missing.

I understand that.

I spent years looking too.

And this is what I want to leave you with:

**DON'T JUST LOOK FOR WHAT GOD
CAN GIVE YOU.**

LOOK FOR GOD.

Because the greatest gift...

Isn't peace.

Although He gives peace.

It isn't wisdom.

Although He gives wisdom.

It isn't healing.

Although He heals.

It isn't strength.

Although He strengthens.

It isn't even eternal life considered only as endless existence.

The greatest gift...

Is...

HIMSELF.

You were made for Him.

To know Him.

To live in communion with Him.

And ultimately...

To be Home...

With Him.

The Creator you have been looking for...

Has already come...

Looking for you.

His name is...

Jesus.

And whatever you do...

PLEASE...

MAKE IT HOME.
